Reports to WDAF 1:00 a.m. and KFDM 1:00 a.m. sign off. KVON, 1440, 2:00 a.m. s/off, WPRR, 910, on listed f/c but continued on as if on regular schedule. KWLK KLEB KECC 990 2:00 a.m. s/off. WLOU f/c. KMOD, 1360, s/off 3:05 a.m. KVLK WLCS kvfd, Luxembourg 1439, Voice of America, 1196 in Morocco (?), Rome 1430, Zagreb, and Monte Carlo, Monaco, 1466. Several other "red" stations in Europe were heard but not reported. The frequency change in Europe has made the field for DX there larger but with so many stations in the one country being on the same frequency it is impossible to know who it is you are hearing. Monte Carlo on 1466 was the most consistent here - announced as "Ici Monte Carlo, Monaco." I disagree with the letter published from C.E. of KDB in January. He is a curse here on 1490 with his King Don Baker. I agree that noise has increased as in clipping, Feb. 18th bulletin. On the 14th of April heard a Mexican on 1520 3:00 to 4:00 a.m. - which one was it - none has full call yet?? The latest Aussie on is 4-- on ----. May I suggest we keep a list of stations using Morse identification while on f/c. May I start off with the two I know of - KROS and WJGA. Locally the news is 4ZB and 4YC have new 10,000 watt transmitters installed but will not be in use for a while yet until new antennae are completed. KROS in verifying stated, "Our test programs are not conducted at any regular time or date. They are usually once a month and may fall on almost any day or any time during the early-morning hours. KROG f/c is 4th Thursday, 1450, 3/15 - 3:30 a.m. Now have 89 outstanding reports since November. Verified 716, Reported, 1,089.

Albert L. Stanton - 128 Rattray Street - Dunedin, New Zealand

In the 3 months since last report, 39 verifications have been received, bringing the total up to 1309. Of these, 931 are from North America, with 405 being 250 watts or less. The latest replies are KPMO 1600, WKXY 1540, KYCA KCNI KCSU KWFB each 1450, KBMW KBKW KSIG KWRO KWCR WPAM KSEM each 1450, KNEW 1430, KSTN 1420, KCSB CJDC 1350, WLOU 1410, KCOV KCOY CFYT each 1400, KFLY 1390, WDEF 1370, KWKC 1340, KERG WYVE each 1280, WDR 1260, KRNO 1240, KDAC KIYI, each 1230, KIBE 1220, KXOC 1150, WIBC 1070, CKRM 930, KRAM 920, CFQC 600, KFRM 550, 4QL 540, KCBS 740. CFYT (100 watts, Yukon) is over 9,000 miles from here, and was logged from 4:00 to 4:30 a.m. N.Z. time. Probably it is my best achievement to date. The 1309 veries are the result of 20 years of DXing (all but 3 months). Still have 41 reports this season unverified. We in New Zealand would appreciate more of the DX programs arranged early in the season - in December, January and early February, rather than March and April, if this could be planned for next season. April, which usually isn't too bad for DXing, was pretty poor this year so that I hung up the head set earlier than usual. Last reports sent out were to WTTN and WNAT on April 10th; WONW on the 3rd, KIND KAYS & KGNB on March 28th, and KICK on the 27th. Veries have almost stopped arriving here, and when one does make an appearance I have to blow the dust off the books to paste it in. Most recent additions have been KBKI KGLU WNAT KNED WCSS (from 3/14/49), KRAL WBCO KIND KICK WSLP WONW WABG WWCA and Hilversum, Holland, 722. Those underlined were cards and the rest verified by letter. Veries now total 1623, which means the addition of 149 new ones since last October with 28 others still to be heard from. Started sending out follow-ups a week ago and will continue sending them out off and on during the summer. Among the crop of veries this season were several better than average catches including 10 new ones in California, 2 in Nevada, 3 in Utah, 1 in Idaho, 5 in Arizona, 2 in New Mexico, 2 in Colorado, and 1 each in Montana and Wyoming. Also picked up my second Alaskan and firsts in Holland, Norway and Africa. Have enjoyed my first year in the NRC and think everyone on the "working detail" has done a fine job. Sherman, C.E. - XENT from Laredo, Tex. and she underlined MISS 2 (I sent mine to Señor A. Martinez.) WRJN (1400) (in 1927 was WFRS) CE F. Lee Dechant says: tests are random, timed, and used Magencord repeating tape loop. KBIX CE E.O. Edwards says, f/c 4th Monday, sked 7:00 a.m. (Sunday 8:00)-1:00 a.m. WULA CE H.G. Chastain (v/card and v/letter) f/c first Thursday 4:00 a.m. Sked: 6:00 a.m. - 10:30 p.m. and Sunday, 8:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. (65ff); KA-4029, the remote pick-up station is a composite transmitter for use with short antenna (used 25' single wire) on 2830 kc/s. and 30 watts, f/c/m, same time with WULA on 1240 kc/s. CKCH (970) heard by a lucky tune 5/19 at 3:05-3:15 s/off with French program in re Norman School fire. It just happened that WWSW had a 3-hour transmitter test during regular program and so only silent carrier QRM. Nice v/letter by C.E. M. Gebhardt, sked: 6:55-12:30 a.m., Sunday 8:55-12:05 a.m. ? Time. KVNJ (900) letter came back "Out of Business." WTTN (1580) CE Len Benson postcards "Several NRC letters to answer and hopes the boys are patient as he's been very busy. To K. Raymond: J.H. Sole, Associate Manager & CE signed my 2/9/48 KNKS. (620). Same writing as he does on KVMV (1450) Now. In Syracuse, N.Y. the CAA has OKed a 3000' antenna to a balloon controlled by ground winch; purpose to explore for Air Force the feasibility of using low frequency for long-distance daytime broadcasts. Location at Constantia on Oneida Lake with a 10-man crew. S'long till next month.

DXing is down to a "snail's pace" at this den. Several new stations have been added to my DX log during the past month. On 5/14 station KCOM (620) Sioux City, Iowa, was finally logged on its regular schedule, and with difficulty, beneath the more powerful WTMJ. Station WDOK (1260) Cleveland, O. was heard on its all-night program on 5/15, for a new station; this making three 5 KWs on the 1260 spot around the clock. On 5/16 WGL (1250) Fort Wayne, Ind. logged on its regular schedule of programs at 6:40 a.m., topping that spot. That same date I heard the new calls of KBOK (1090) Waterloo, Iowa, formerly KAYX, in use, and sent a report on same.
