Musings of the MembersHal Williams - 50 Third Avenue - Seymour, Connecticut

In/ my last note to "Musings" I did not think I would do any DXing Monday 3/19 as I worked Sunday 12 hours from 6 AM to 6 PM, and had to get up at 5 AM to work the same hours Monday. So I set the alarm for 4 AM and went to bed. Thought I'd at least take WATZ on DX. I woke up at 2 AM, came down, and took WKOX (1190) on with a fine signal for their DX. Sent third report - maybe they will verify this time. They did not verify 2 daytime reports on regular sked. WEIM (1280) another DX program in with a fine signal 3-3:30. WHAV (1490) 3:30-3:45, already verified, ss a card of thanks sent. WATZ (1450) excellent DX 3:45-4:00. Only took them to 4:00 then back to bed for 1 hour. I didn't wait for WCRO as I have them verified and did not feel like "bucking" the 1230 mess. 3/21 - TGN (1180) - WHAM s/off in the clear at approximately 12:32 $\frac{1}{2}$ . After that, very weak music signal heard but then Old Man Static on very HNL made it almost impossible to read. I feel sure it was TGN as at 12:45 I heard "P.O. Box 601" given as address. I think perhaps they were on until about 1:10, but owing to severe static, WWVA on one side and WOWO on the other overlapping, could not be sure. HNL continued so bad with only those 50 kw. all-nighters coming in fairly well that I faded up and went for some sleep. WKAP (1590) easy here 5:45-6:15 PM when CBJ took over. CFOR (1580) also heard here nightly after 6:30. 3/22 - WISN (1150) CBS News and s/off 12:55-1:05. 2nd & 3rd reports respectively sent to WSAR (1480) and WNEW (1130). Most of the time WNEW is a "pain in the neck" here but I'll take their verie if I can get one. 3/23 - CFAR (590) evidently not on 3:00-3:30 as frequency seemed to be clear here and CKDM (1230) nò go because of WITH-WNOR. I did not expect to get them but thought sure I'd be able to log CFAR but "no soap." 9 veries received this week, all letters, to make my verie total 692. WAMS (1380) very friendly letter from CE, Herbert H. Eckstein for 2/11/51 report. This was the third report to them. Their CE enclosed a memo, "I have looked into the matter concerning our verification of your report of 3/6/49. Although there are several other reports in my file about that time I could not find any from you. Evidently your report never reached my office, thus we did not send you a verie for that date. Your report of 1/25/51 was received and it can be verified as correct in every detail. I apologize for not answering sooner but I have been unusually busy since the last week of January moving our offices and studios which are not located at 321 Delaware Avenue." WMOD (1470) 2 separate letters with 2 reports and a follow-up in which I told them I had a snapshot of their transmitter taken and sent me by Sid Rosenbaum of Wheeling (Thanks, Sid, letter later). I can't see the reason for 2 letters except that v/s Jerry Boles wanted me to see how they used my 2 stamps! WHRV (1600) nice letter v/s James Allen, CE. Also in today, "DX News." Most of you probably know I also belong to NNRC but I get many of their tips through our "DX News." That is one of the reasons I joined the NRC and believe me I am not sorry! I did. Too many nice things can't be told about our hard-working editors, CPC men and officers. 3/20 - WLAW, Laurel, Miss. (1490) letter in longhand, v/s James M. Hilburn, CE. 3/21 - WHWL (730) letter reads in part, "This will serve as verification of your reports dated 1/14/50, 5/5/50 and 3/10/51. Your info. checks with transmitter log. I am sorry I was unable to verify sooner." He must be very busy, hi! They returned my last postage, v/s Joseph Berish, CE (W3KOK). This verie ties Pa. and N.Y. with the most veries here, 53 each. 3/22 CKOX (1340) swell letter for DX show 3/17 - report mailed Saturday 3/17 at 7:30 AM, verie back Thursday, 3/22 at 11 AM, only 5 days. I wish some of the US stations were as prompt as most Canadians. CHGB still the exception. Of my last 100 reports including WISN sent today, 73 are already verified. My percentage is picking up, hi! Overall figures now 76.88% verified. 3/23- WAML (1340) letter for f/c 3/12 after 2nd report, v/s Stanley Walters, P.D. 3/24- KVOA (1290) letter for regular sked 10/16/50 without a follow-up. Regular f/c is 2nd Thursday, 4:30-4:45 as listed in f/c list, v/s R.H. Holsclaw, CE. WGST (920) letter for regular sked 3/17, v/s Ben Akerman, CE. (Thanks for nice words, Hal - Ed.)

No new stations - no new series - just a little info of ~~##~~ no importance. I made arrangements with the first Sgt. of our squadron to use the Hallicrafters receiver in our day room for DX, so I'll get back in the swing before too much longer on a good receiver, with a poor antenna. The folks came down from Springfield Mo. on their vacation trip (a tour of the south) and stopped here for a few days. I managed to get a 3-day pass, so we drove to Nuevo Laredo, Mexico one day. I found XEDF but couldn't get into their studios. They have a modern building, but a very poor antenna system - 4 short (75' at most) guyed towers, with a system of wires between them. The next day we decided to go over to Houston, so I got to stop and visit at KWED KPRC-KXYZ, KTHT. A little on each: KWED has 1 kw, now and a new Western Electric Transmitter. The CE (a fellow named Shoppee) was quite friendly. At Houston, I enjoyed the modern layout of KTHT's Gates-equipped transmitter site. They have a 4-tower layout and very attractive building. The building even has a modern kitchen for the engineer on duty! Then, the surprise - stopped at 3 towers and a building - no sign, though. Asked the engineer what station it was and he said "KPRC & KXYZ." They are both in the same transmitter building and they both use the same towers for day and night transmission. They do have a different tower to cut their directional pattern and both have a 5 kw/ RCA Transmitter. The set-up is unique - especially the business of two 5 kw. stations transmitting 18 hours daily, different programs, off the same tower at the same time! It fascinates me. Engineering is wonderful, eh fellows? About all the news - took some photos on the trip. Didn't get to visit any of the studios. Hope to have some stations to list as "heard" in the next letter. Ordering a supply of NRC report forms to simplify reporting from an Air Base. Sure anxious to start twisting the dials again. Oh yes! Almost forgot - got to talk to Mel Oliver while in Houston, but a cramped schedule prior to catching the San Antonio bus kept me from meeting him personally, so Mel, I will take a "rain check" on that cup of coffee - OK? Hi. All for now - 73s. (Glad to hear from you, Jack, and lots of luck all the time -Ed.)

Zane Grey Bennett - Galax, Virginia

Well here I am again, writing to the "DX News," the best publication of its kind in the world. On 3/16 I tried some evening DXing. Between 7:00 and 7:45 I added five Cubans, all of them from Havana for a total in that city of 27. CMK CMCW CMCA CMCN CMOA. On 3/18 I added CMHM, Santa Clara, 1130 kc/s, at 7:00 PM. 3/19 - WKOX with a very powerful signal, WREL on f/c with fair signal, WGBZ very poor, KTRR good. WEIM, good, WHAI poor, WCRO was heard at 4:26 on DX for only a few minutes, but I believe I copied enough to merit a verie. Heard but not needed were KLWN (1320), WHAV (1490) WROB (1450) and WDHL (1490). The whole dial was simply a mass of static today, and at 6:40 PM is rapidly building up again. I received a very nice card from Jim Critchett in San Francisco, telling me that he heard KCNA on 2/5 at 5 AM. He mentioned hearing an unknown one also 1340, at 5:04. That was KTXL, San Angelo, Texas. I sure do enjoy hearing from any of you NRC DXers. Here's a little more of my log. (560) CFRA WOOF KLZ WQAM WIND WSPM (now WMIK) WFIL KWTO WIS WHBQ WJLS KFDM KSFO KMON CMKM KPQ. 570- WGWD KLAG WQMS WEVB WVMI WMCA WSYR WWNC WPCS WKBN WBAP WFAA. I sure do enjoy "What the Call Letters Mean." Here's a few that I know - WMEV - Wonderful Mountain Empire of Virginia. WSLS - Shenendoah Life Station, WBOB BOB Morris; WBTM - World's Best Tobacco Market; WTOB - TOBacco; KCSJ - Chieftain, Star Journal; WHLF - We Have Lotsa Fun. Here's how the states rank at the present time: North Carolina is still in first place with Texas creeping up to the top rapidly. Georgia and Florida are currently tied for third place. California is 4th, followed by Pennsylvania, Ohio and Alabama, respectively. Does anyone know when WJL is off? I would like to try for KGU. KAVI has been heard well practically every morning from 3:30-4:00, over KAFY and KEMI. The Pacific Northwest is very difficult here. I was sure surprised to find CKNW with a very good signal 3:05-4:00 on 3/14. Recent series have been KRSN (1490), signed by Frank Evans, engineer; KCKY, v/s Roll and R. Wiseman, CE, Gila Broadcasting Company which has two other stations, KWJB, Globe, and KGLU Safford. KRNO's series was signed by C. W. Brock, C.E. WIRA by James W. Sawiushi, CE. Say Lefty, where is ZEQQ and XEN? (Mexico City in both instances, Zane - Ed.) WBOB's f/c is 4th Monday, 4:30-4:45 AM. I hope I hear TGN and WVDI DXes. 73s.

I had a wonderful time last week while representing my firm at the IRE show at Grand Central Palace. Had opportunity to meet nearly 50 representatives of various domestic BCB stations, mostly Chief Engineers, and found the experience both enlightening & entertaining, not to mention profitable from the standpoint of my collection of letterheads, for not only have I received a considerable number of these, but also an assorted collection of souvenir blotters, balloons, match covers, and the piece-de-resistance, a miniature microphone, from WAZL. I did have opportunity to meet one of the engineers from WIDE, who lived in St. Johnsbury at the same time as Ken Murphy (George somebody.) Some others at the exhibition were from WDAY WJNC CFCF KMBC WAPO & WFAA. Tuesday evening was really a fine one for me, as I had dinner with Larry Mennitt, CE of WVCG (who just made CE, and got his 1A classification at the same time), and later in the evening took in a movie with one of the most personable young fellows I have ever met, the CE of WILM, Ed Kennedy. (I have been attempting to write this report while listening to and watching Mr. Halley and Sen. Tobey tear Abner Zwillman's statements apart during an evening session of the Kefauver Committee hearings - and it's difficult to do.) This past Saturday brought in a group of interesting verifications, beginning with the most northerly station in the United States - KFAR, and following coincidentally with the most southernly station on the U.S. mainland - KVAL, whose letterhead of metallic grey is very attractive; then a very attractive card from YVKS, a letter from WULA, and a welcome verie letter from PRH-9 (840) in Sao Paulo. Noticed that VOXM verified for everybody but me, so I wrote them quick like a bunny, and they told me they thought they had sent mine out with the others. It's good to read all the reports in the bulletin and keep up with the Joneses.

Same company also owns Radio Tamoi - PRB-7 on 900 kc/s. with 5 kw. The letter is in English. For Ralphie, phone is 23-1647. 3/20 - Too noisy to dx - WCAU 1210 on test 3:27. WDOX, 1260, left air at 4:00 to be back at 5:30. 3/21 - Very noisy again. 830, 900, 990 and 1600 had unknown TT. KEAW, 1280 on test in English at 3:26 to long after 4:00. PRE-4, 1300, was good at 3:20. Too noisy and to bed early. Am chairman of the scale committee for new contract, too many afternoon meetings to leave me any spare time. 3/21 - WABI, test on 910 at 4:15. 1220 had unknown foreign one on at 4:30 but WCAU on 1210 slopped over and drowned them out at 4:41, perhaps PRA-9 in Rio. Brazilian on 880 at 4:46 but not able to copy good because of bad noise. 3/22 - Home late and 880 Brazilian was fairly good but too noisy to copy 2/23- Bad rain today. LYC, 880, copied 3:50 to fade-out about 5:10. 4YC, 900, 4:16 to 4:58 fade-out, Kept dial going back and forth from one to the other. 3/24- Bad wind and rain storm and 46°.
