WEEKEND CONTEST

Here is the information on our weekend contest which will be held next weekend; December 19-20-21. Following are the rules. There is no entry fee, and there will be no prizes this year, but you may find it an excellent incentive to go after a few foreigners you haven't logged as yet.

1. Contest will extend from 1800, December 19, 1952 (Your local time) to 1800, December 21, 1952. (Also your local time.)
2. Verifications not necessary, but you must submit 10 minutes of verifiable material on each station logged.
3. All stations outside continental United States and Canada are eligible.
4. Results must be in the hands of the editor no later than January 1, 1953.
5. Point score will be similar to that used for the regular foreign contest. A point for each station reported, multiplied by the number of countries received.
6. Since there are no prizes this year, your editor will act as sole judge. Although he may submit an entry, he shall not be judged the winner in any event.

ITEMS OF DX

NORTH AMERICA

MEXICO-*--JL reports reception of XEBZ (660) Mexico City, from 0311-0324. He also logged XEQK (1350) from 0344-0352. To round out his Mexican news he reports a verie from XEW. FV received one from XEQ, but it isn't too clear whether BCB or short wave is verified.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC-*--JL reports what he thinks is HI3H (818 Kc) mixed in with an unknown Colombian on 820 Kcs. He listened from 1836-2112, and feels that the above call is reasonably correct. Usually WFAA/WBAP makes listening on 820 or nearby very hard, but on 12/2 they were not in evidence.

EL SALVADOR-*--Don't know how he did it, but JL casually mentioned in his report that he had a verie from YSEB for the contest. Please, Joe, who signed it. No one had previously received a verie, although almost all of us had reported.

NORTH AMERICA (Cont'd)

ALASKA--HSN reports strong signal on 4th Monday test from KTKN (930) Ketchikan. Time reported is 0450-0500.

SOUTH AMERICA

COLOMBIA--JL reports HJCN (1096 Plus) Bogota on 12/6 from 1825-1831 and later from 1914-1917. Didn't have time to listen for a full report. JL also reports what sounded like "Radio Barranquilla" spoken on 820 Kcs. Says it might also be "Radio Nacional". Fools sure it was a Colombian. (Joe, late lists do not show a Colombian on 820 Kcs. Nearest thing is YSDR "Radio Tropical", Santa Ana, El Salvador.-FV)

CURACAO--JL reports PJC-2 on 12/2 logged with QSA-5 S-9 signals at 1722 when WGN was only QSA-5, S-8.

BRAZIL--PRE-9 (1200) Fortaleza logged at 0410-0425 on 12/2. Identified as "Radio Clube Ceara". (JL) To all of you, Brazilians are now on summer time, and you should be able to log many of them. There is an up-to-date list in the new International Log. Copies will be mailed this week.

EUROPE

GERMANY--HH advises that AFN Frankfurt has verified with form letter for reception of November 21st. Address is American Forces Network - Public Information Office, APO 757, New York, New York.

ITALY--HH adds this concerning Rome I (845). Program continues past 1800, there is no sign-off. According to verie "Special programme "Notturmo Dall'Italia" from 2305 to 0530 GMT. News in English, French, German, and Italian. So there is more than just a carrier on after 1800.

HH adds that Europeans are occasionally noted at high end of band in early morning, but at the moment, definitely not good.

OCEANIA

BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS--A note from JF advises much the same information about VQO that we printed last week. He says that he is now checking with official sources as to full details about the station. He will advise us just as soon as the information comes. He notes that 4ZB on 1040 will make it impossible for him to hear VQO.

ASIA

JAPAN--Japanese stations continue to be heard on the West Coast with HSN our reporter this week. He notes that the best time for Japanese stations is 0330-0530. He has logged JOBB (830) Osaka, JOAK (590) Tokyo, JOQK (850) Niigata, JOLB (870) Fukuoka; JOXK (1300) Tokushima, FEN Sendai (1430), FEN Tokyo (770), and FEN Osaka (1390). He also reports an unknown on 1210 Kcs. (Hal, this one is JOOR, Osaka, 10 Kw., owned by New Japan Broadcasting Co.-FV)

CHINA--Guess we should have headed this FORMOSA, as it is a report by HSN of his reception of BED-9 (1020) which he has heard for several evenings.

MYSTERY

HH reports that he and RA have been hearing a station on 1145 Kcs. nightly in both Spanish and English. Has an English session every night at 2230, and lasts for about a half hour. Rest of the broadcast is in Spanish. Station has been checked several nights and the best reception is from about 2100 on. Was heard until 0214 one night. Haven't tried that late again. RA says it announces as Central America and at 10:30 PM he gave the time as 9:30 PM. Man who conducts the English broadcast talks with a "British" accent. Plays Spanish and US recordings. Not all old tunes, as "I Went To Your Wedding" was heard. Announces as "Radio ---" and seems to mention "Republica" a number of times. Thinks 1150 was announced as frequency. Has a strong carrier, but announcements and music seldom heard, and when heard are often distorted. (CPL9, La Paz, has been reported on 1145 Kc. LU3 "Radio Splendid" is on 1150. Best bet in Central America is TILX, "Radio Colombia", San Jose, Costa Rica.-FV)

HH reports another one heard on 1142 Kcs., suffering bad splashing from WRVA. At 2130 the call "Radio Cadena Nacional" was given and sign-off was at 2131. Signals weak to fair. (Hank, now about CBI4 on 1140 Kcs, "Caja Nacional de Ahorros".-FV)

HSN reports unknown Spanish speakers on 1360, 1450, and 1460 Kcs. (1360 possibly XESA-FV; 1450-Dunno; 1460-Probably XEYC or XES-FV) Hal also notes a very weird one-note chant over and over on 1180 Kcs. for a few minutes at 0350, an Asiatic, but not Japanese. (BED-33 is on 1183 at Taipei, Formosa.-FV)

Finally a list from JJ which includes one on 1245 Kcs. which signs off at 2130, with call letters starting with "Y". (The only one reported on 1245 is HJAF-Cartagena, Colombia-FV) Also one on 1249 Kc. very close to WCAE. (Dunno-FV) John also reports the following as unknown frequencies: 583 or 584 (Best bet-Vienna I); 725 (I still think this is PJC-2 on 722, John-FV); 733 (TIRA or Madrid, depending on when you hear it-FV); 745 (Hilversum-FV); 793 (?); 865 (Paris I); 1095 (YVKE) 1165 (YVMD); 1195 (VOA-Munich). In parentheses are the best bets from reports already in-FV.
