Reception hasn't been outstanding here lately, and I get time to do it about once every two weeks, so it seems. On Sunday morning Nov. 8 WADR-1260 Syracuse heard on special test 12:40-12:55. CEM-940 and CEO-910 heard signing off at 1:00, along with some other Canadian on 900. WKLO-1080 Louisville, logged with late disc show featuring ex-Miami disc jockey from 1:08-1:30. KXLF-1370 Butte logged with "Romeo and Juliet" and sign off at 1:30 (second logged Montana station). No Idaho veries yet, and hoping the music on 1440 at 1:45 was KWIK, but no! It was CHNO in Sudbury, Ont. almost as good, as I surely won't get them when they move to 900 kc/s. CJOC-1220 Lethbridge logged with rec rds 2:05-2:23; WKOY-1240 Bluefield, W. Va. logged with records 2:28-2:45. WENR heard on carrier modulation around 2:45 (890). There was some Spanish speaker underneath them. WLOW-1400 (what a toughie!) (well, almost) logged from 3:15-3:30. The French station on 674 has been putting in a good signal, but not quite good enough to be heard here. Bernie Duffy, 77 Livermore Ave., Staten Island 2, N. Y., sends along the following item from BROADCASTING:

"Trans-Atlantic tv, albeit inside out, is here. This has been reported by P. A. Sugg, general manager of WKY-TV Oklahoma City. The delighted Mr. Sugg said he is in receipt of a letter from one Charles W. Batley of London, who said that on Sept. 2 he picked up WKY-TV's ch. 4 signal on his tv set. To disconcert the doubters, Mr. Batley enclosed a photo of the WKY-TV identification slide as it appeared on his tv set. The only hitch was that Mr. Batley received a negative image, which was determined after a further exchange of letters to be caused by the Briton's use of an experimental set which produces a negative reception of a positive image. WKY-TV has had a video power of 16.8 kw with a 5-bay superturnstile antenna on its 968-foot WKY radio tower, but was expecting to increase to 100 kw using its new 26 kw transmitter with a 6-bay superturnstile. WKY-TV reports its signal also was picked up

(BROADCASTING cont'd.) during the summer in Mexico City, Cuba, Ontario, Georgia, Florida, Louisiana, New York, Idaho, Montana and Pennsylvania. One Pennsylvanian received the station so frequently he wrote in for a program schedule." (Hope you NRCers mentioned the NRC in reporting to WKY-TV, we've members in over half the areas mentioned by WKY-TV. Incidentally, last month they went on 100 kv as suggested and have been identifying: "Now operating on 'Super-power'." Ed.)

Bill Moser, 217 Connellsville, St., Uniontown, Penna.: No TV DX here now. WSAZ-TV and WLWC are occasionally seen, that's all. Receiver: Magnovox MW72 17" picture tube 24 tubes. Regency RC-600 UHF converter 6 tubes. Antennae: Taco 5 element Yagi ch. 2; Taco 5 element Yagi ch. 6 and Channel Master 5 element Yagi ch. 7 connected. Stored are a Taco 5 element Yagi ch. 3; Telle-Ray 25 element Yagi's ch. 13; J.T.D. 2 element ch. 7-13; Ward 8 element ch. 2-13; and J.T.D. 7 element ch. 2-5. I'll leave the theories up to the experts in January's issue of "Radio and Electronics" magazine. Hi! WTRF-TV has a good picture here from Wheeling, W. Va. on channel 7. Pictures were taken of their test pattern, and I'll report on the results next month. 73's.

Sid Rosenbaum, 806 Market St., Wheeling, W. Va.: My first crack as a TV DXer brought in the following stations: WLWC ch. 4; WLWT ch. 5; WKEL ch. 8; WNBK ch. 3; WSAZ ch. 3 and WLWD ch. 2. Strange as it seems, WJAC Johnstown and WDTV Pittsburgh are usually poor quality at my location. I live at the base of a steep hill and this shuts out anything from east or northeast. Type of antenna is a "Lazy X" All-wave about 50' high. My method of verification for TV-DX will be flash photos of identification patterns. WTRF-TV ch. 7 Wheeling is slated to go on with scheduled programs on Oct. 24th. Schedule will be WJOC-0000 EST. Program time will be increased after kinks are ironed out. (Welcome to the TV DXer, Sid, and hope you'll be reporting regularly to this section. Sid also sent along some clippings regarding WTRF-TV with the following information noted. Ed.)

WTRF-TV's transmitting site in Kirkwood Heights is 1644 feet above sea level and 590 feet above the surrounding terrain. The tower for WTRF-TV was built by the Blaw-Knox Co. The combined cost of the tower and the antenna, which has electrical heaters to melt snow and ice, is in the vicinity of \$78,000. The transmitting equipment in the nearby transmitter building required an outlay of \$212,000. Robert W. Ferguson is the manager of WTRF-TV.

That Television stations cost a king's ransom to start is a foregone conclusion substantiated by the above figures, but what about revenue after the station is built and on the air? Well, the following clipping from Bernie Duffy of Staten Island, N. Y. from "Variety" is an illustration of the possibilities:

"Philadelphia, Oct. 27. WPTZ clocked a new fall record with the largest total dollar volume sales in its 21 years of telecasting, Alexander W. Dannenbaum, sales manager for the Philadelphia Westinghouse TV outlet, announced sales had reached \$770,178 during September." JJ

"RADIO HAMS EXPLAIN INTERFERENCE ON UHF STRIP CONVERSION TV SETS. The American Radio Relay League, Inc. of West Hartford, in a letter today to television manufacturers and the Federal Communications Commission, claims that television sets converted to receive ultra high frequency television stations by means of channel 'strips' are susceptible to interference from other services. The league said that the 'strip' conversion, whereby an ordinary television set is adjusted to receive one or more of the newer type telecasts, fails to meet the engineering principles of the FCC regarding "interference free service in the UHF bands." A. L. Budlong, general manager of the league, says converted receivers become susceptible to interference from innumerable sources in the general region of 108-174 megacycles and that in more than half of the UHF-TV channels there is "considerable possibility of interference from amateurs properly operating in their 144-megacycle band." Telecasts from WJOC-TV, channel 43, would be among those on which owners with 'strip' converted television sets would encounter interference, according to the league information. Receivers with "built in" UHF channel selectors would not be affected by the interference." --Bernie Duffy.

We have here an announcement that WATV, channel 13 in Newark, N. J. with transmitter and antenna atop the Empire State Building began operations Saturday, November 14th. Good luck to WATV and we assume you NRCers in that area will have some further comments in the future on WATV's operations.

Milton C. Bay, Route #1, Brooksville, Ky.: Finally got around to another report for the TV DXer. Last report I had you had never received KFEL-TV Denver. Hope you have received it by now. (Nope, Ed.) Glad you had a fine vacation in Alaska and hope that you have your horizontal hold circuit by now. (Thanks, Milty, we DID have a terrific time in the "Land of the Midnight Sun" and horizontal hold not yet in. Ed.) Now to my report which is as follows: I am 27 yrs. old, been a member of the NRC since last January. Started my TV-DXing this year. I earn my living by farming. Have a radio in my stable, but no TV yet. Often do some DXing in stable while I milk. As to my equipment I have a 17 inch Philco 5I-T1875 which I purchased late in Sept. 1950. This is a combination 17 inch TV, AM, FM radio and 3 speed phonograph. Lacking a better radio I use this radio for all my BCB DXing. I have logged 40 states on it with the built-in aerial during the past year, thanks to the help of the NRC. This set has given me very little trouble. Only time I have had a service man to call was last fall (year ago) to install a new picture tube. I have taken care of all the other small jobs myself. I have a JFD no. EA164 Super D-Xer (4 D-Xer bays) antenna for TV and FM. This is mounted on a 1 inch water pipe to a height of 45 feet. About 4 feet from the ground I have a Radiart Tele-rotor which turns the entire mast and aerial at the touch of a button. I knocked out the Philco nameplate on front of the set and built my rotator right into the TV set. I also have a Tec booster which I don't think does much good except sometimes on a fringe station when the weather is right. It was out of order all summer until I fixed it about a month ago. (Bad condenser and selenium rectifier) For lead-in wire I use the Federal shielded lead K-III which is run right down inside the mast, past the rotator to a pipe underground, then into the basement and then up through the floor to the TV set. This has given good results, except for the time the lead-in got full of water. To anyone using this lead-in be sure to seal the top. I learned the hard way. I am not equipped for UHF yet. Will probably be another year before I am. I have logged 24 stations this year which are: WSAZ 3; WAVE 3; WJLD 2; KFEL-TV 2; WHAS-TV 11; WJAC-TV 6; TV El Mundo, Cuba 2; WFBN 6; WHIO-TV 7; WTVN 6; WSS-TV 4; WNBK 4; WTV-TV 4; WBNB-TV 10; WSPD-TV 13; WMAJ-TV 4; WDTV 2; WKRC-TV 12; WJMT 5; WCPO-TV 9; WPRC-TV 2; WTTV 10; WLVG 4 and WXYZ-TV 7. All have verified except WNBK 4 and WXYZ-TV 7. Oct. 29 received verie from KPRC-TV 2 for a July 15 report. Haven't done any TV DXing since Sept., as work on the farm has been very heavy and will be until I get my tobacco stripped. Should get this done in Dec., depending on the weather. Best of DX to all, TV or AM. (Very comprehensive report; Milton, and it certainly would appear your location is very much alive for TV DX. Hope it is just as active for your BCB DXing. Hope you'll be clear of work by the mid-December up-surge of TV DX which has been prevalent past few years and will give us another report next month or so. Ed.)

Hal Wagner, R. D. #1, North Girard, Penna.: Hey, whats the idea of bringing this kind of weather back with you, altho from the reports you have it bad out your way. (Western Kansas caught it Hal, we got a bit of rain, sleet and twenty-eight snowflakes, not noted by me, hi, but nothing notable. Ed.) Thot I'd better drop you a card that KFDX, ch. 3; Wichita Falls, Texas was seen here last Saturday nite, Oct. 1st from 7:15 to about 7:45 pm. Why we should be getting skip this time of year I dunno but taere he was. WTRF-TV ch. 7, in Wheeling, W. Va. seen the 2nd day of their operation, Nov. 1st, think it was and adds another state as well as another station. Won't have to fight my conscience to stay in and see the football game this afternoon anyway, hi. (Okay, Hal, and hoped ya picked the winner. Hi. Hank)

In Washington, the Federal Communications Commission recently extended the license period for television stations from one to three years. The new order will make the TV license period conform with those for AM and FM licenses. It will take effect 30 days after publication in the Federal Registry which usually takes about 10 days. The FCC had proposed the change in July but only recently gave its final approval. In another action, the FCC banned the filing of applications that conflict with its

(FCC contd.) rules even though the applications are accompanied by petitions to change the rules. The FCC said the revision would "promote more orderly procedure" and avoid applications that could not be acted on without long delays because of their connection with proposed rules changes." (Anything that will release some of the bogged down action brought on by contesting applicants is a step forward to yo Editor's thinking. Eh!!)
