We're experimenting with tandem limiter set-ups now in an effort to more consistently fill our carrier. Hours of operation are slightly different now, so you could probably advise the NEC and FCC for us. List time at EST for convenience, 8:30-2:00 Monday through Saturday and 9:50-2:00 Sundays, all EST. Sundays are one for a possible cut-back to 1:00 EST s/off on March 13, 1965, depending on whether we continue our series of hour-long Classical music from 1:00 to 2:00." FOUR BIG SPECIAL DX TESTS FOR N.R.C.W L N H 1350 Laconia, New Hampshire 2/14 3:00-4:00 a.m.

THIS LETTER WAS RECEIVED BY HOWARD KEMP FROM MR. AVERY OF WLNH:

"First off, excuse the real short program from WLNH, but after being on the air for only seven or eight minutes. A defective oil-filled condenser in one of the intermediate stages of the transmitter caused WLNH to go off the air. In fact it was so elusive a trouble that it was not found until too late. WLNH was 15 minutes late in signing on regular schedule that morning."
