DO YOUR FREQUENCIES ADD UP?

In the last issue of DX NEWS, a NYC DXer noted that he was hearing WRCA (660) and WOR (710) on 1370 kc. If you add 660 and 710 you of course get 1370. Also had the DXer been able to tune to 110 kc, he would have heard them there also. 110 is of course the difference between the frequencies. This sum and difference effect is nearly always the fault of the antenna. In the case of an outdoor antenna, one usually finds it to be grouunded, that is the bare wire is touching a metal or other conducting object. Best plan is to check your lead in first. A faulty lightening switch will also do it. The porcelain kind when exposed to the weather are especially bad for this. Sometimes, however it is impossible to eliminate this annoyance entirely.
