On 1/7, WEGA, 1410 was heard on ET through WING. 1/8 added WTAY, 1570, on one of their final opening tests. 1/9 added KBOL, 1490, on DX, much to my surprise, very poor, but readable for a time. 1/11 added KSOP 1370, almost overslept on this one, getting only final few minutes, good reception, too. I especially enjoyed listening to Miss Nancy Cox, who MCed the DX from WLCO (1240) Eustis, Fla. from 3:30-4:10 a.m. Station WWRL (1290) New York City, TT on their Conelrad frequency for the first ten minutes followed 3:45-4 a.m. with a f/c from KWJB, Globe, Ariz. and at 4 a.m. KAKE in Wichita announced a test. But despite this interference, the WLCO DX came through fairly well for a new logging. With WEDC, Chicago, standing by for the half-hour DX, I do hope everyone has sent a thank-you card to Mr. Bill Mack, Radio Station WEDC, 3860 Ogden Avenue, Chicago 23. If you haven't would you please do this at once? This is most important! Station CFRG (1230) Gravelbourg, Sask. was heard on their DX and most of the time about equal with AN WNOR's signal on 1230. Very happy to log CFRG to my DX Log. The third logging on Jan. 23rd was Station WPGC (1580) Morningside, Md. testing equipment from 3:07-3:25 a.m. in the clear. Then on 1/24, Station WMRI (860) Marion, Ind. was heard well on their scheduled DX which was two hours in length, and also heard for the first time. But time is too short to inform anyone of this WIKE DX but if you heard it I do hope you have written Mr. Thurston. Possibly next season we can attempt another DX from them. . . .

Dear Mr. Masters,

Thank you very much for your special DX program for our National Radio Club this morning! Conditions here were fairly good, and the weather was clear and cold, with the temperature at 28° and the barometer at 29.95 and rising. I hope you will be able to verify my reception of your station, and here is what I heard:

Date: January 23, 1956

Frequency - 1490 kc/s.

2:00 a.m., E.S.T. - "National Emblem March."

3:02:30 - Announcer gave call letters and location, and saluted the members of the National Radio Club, and asked for correct reports, and promised verifications to all who enclosed return postage.

3:04:15 - "Sixteen Tons," sung by Tennessee Ernie Ford.

3:06:40 - Gave phonetic station identification, as, "W-William, M-Mike, R-Robert, E-Easy." Said WMRE operated daily from 6:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. Again asked for DX reports and promised to verify by letter.

3:07:05 - March.

3:10 - Announcement, not audible here as a louder tone came on the air on top of your signal. It was not identified

3:11:30 - Vocal by girl.

3:14 - Announcer read from the National Radio Club pamphlet about the club, and then read our "DX Calendar" off.

3:17 - "Love and Marriage" dedicated to the bachelors in the National Radio Club

3:19:40 - Announcer described Monroe, and told of its population and industry, and some of its history.

3:21 - He mentioned some of WMRE's leading shows and personalities.

3:22 - Presented the Chief Engineer who gave a rather technical description of WMRE's studio and transmitter equipment. Most of this was missed because CMOX, Havana, covered you for about two minutes at this point.

3:23:15 - Song by Johnny Ray.

3:25 - WHAV, Haverhill, Mass. came on for a test and completely blotted out your signal. Nothing further was heard from WMRE, alas.

My receiver is a 23 tube Scott, and the antenna is a 120' long, 65' high NE/SW inverted L, with single lead-in taken from the NE end. I have been a DX fan for 24 years, and have a grand total of 2,634 verifications from that many different standard broadcast band stations like WMRE, including 68 from Georgia, of which 11 are no longer on the air. I hope you will be so kind as to verify my reception of WMRE and please use the word "VERIFIED" in reference to my reception, for that is the all-important word to us DX fans, as it establishes our proof of reception, which is what we seek. Thank you.

I remember you, Mr. Masters, from having signed my verification about two years ago from WPID, in Piedmont, Alabama. Is WMRE associated with WPID, or with any other station? Is there any special significance to your call letters? When did WMRE first go on the air, and what are your regular hours of operation? About how wide is your daytime coverage, as compared with your nighttime coverage? After whom was your city named, and what is its population?

Return postage is enclosed, Mr. Masters, and thank you once again for having honored our National Radio Club with this very fine special DX broadcast for us. I hope you received many reports from all over. WMRE was S-6 here most of the way, with WAHR and CMOX in the background continually, except for two minutes when CMOX covered you. The best of luck to you and to all the folks at WMRE! -Yours DXingly.

First of all I would like to acknowledge receipt of a number of publications which were not listed in "Reporters" above. We have received the October and November issues of the NEW ZEALAND DX TIMES. We have the November, December, and January Bulletins of the Newack News Radio Club. We also have the December bulletin of Malmo DX-aron of Malmo, Sweden. I quote from this latter publication Page 3 where they are discussing Radio Clubs around the world: "There are a number of major U. S., British, and European Clubs on my list as it stands. Most of them are shortwave clubs with broadcast band DXing as a dwindling sideline." He doesn't know the National Radio Club very well, does he, maybe we should tell him about that "dwindling sideline". Hal Wagner sent this to us, as well as some pages of information about "Radio Abidjan" in the Ivory Coast of Africa. This information is complete with nine large glossy pictures of the station and a verification card. Too bad it is for 4925 kc. (Hal, how much of this material do you want back?) We have also received the Medium Wave News of the ISWL of London, from both the editor Ken Brownless and Roy Patrick. Roy also sent the balance of the IS/L bulletin, devoted entirely to short wave.

Now for some other material at hand. To John Cooper, Len Kruse and Hal Wagner sell the report forms. I sent your check and order on to Hal. I think the best shortwave log is the World Radio Handbook (\$2.00) or the Frequency Log of the FAIS (\$1.25), both of which also contain 3GB material.

I want to thank Staffen Danell of Sweden for sending a copy of the report form used by members of the Teknikens Varlds Radio Club of Stockholm. Intended for short wave, it would work nicely on 3GB. Address of this club in case any are interested is Sveavagon 53, Stockholm.

Some weeks ago Clarence Freeman of Cincinnati asked if FJOC was verifying. Not as far as we know, although we are sending a report to him this week with hope. Clarence, the log and report form went out a week ago and you should have them. You will find the address for 4VS in the LOG. You asked several questions about Cuban stations. Most of them have been answered in recent DX NEWS. If you have any further questions, John Eskott of your cit seems to have a great fund of Cuban information. Why not phone him your questions, and finally Clarence suggests that foreign DXers might well be interested in an article in the December 1955 QST "GALZIFF" which tells how to go the most out of a receiver when tuning stations which are close together. Anyone with a good fm receiver with a crystal might find the article helpful. The trick of tuning only one of the sidebands is explained.

I hate to admit this, but I've mislaid the name of the member who lives at 7805 Woolworth Ave., Omaha 6, Nebraska, but for him we have no late information re verifies from WJDD, but we have a verio signer listed: Augustin Gammes, address Box 187. If your 1040 kc. station was in San Jose, it was TLU "Radio Sonora". "Radio Sonora" might sound like "Radio Sonora" if said quickly. With Cubans, I have a policy of reporting and hoping. Sometimes they verify, sometimes not. Keith Robinson aims at a schedule of the West Indies Team's cricket matches in New Zealand. He notes that in the past Jamaica, Trinidad, etc., have carried the FBST ITC-LS at odd hours. LC says the first test is February 5-7 at Dunedin; second February 18-22 at Christchurch; third March 3-7 at Wellington; and fourth March 9-13 at Auckland. The touring team is playing other regular matches from January 20 until March 16, but the above dates are the important ones to watch for. Play normally ends each day at 0100 EST. Might be a good idea to watch for these tests, and that about covers the material on hand, so let's have lots of reports for next week and so on. 73
