Be sure to send in your new v/s but please check back a few issues to see if that one has recently appeared. Duplication is a waste of time and space and nothing can be gained by continual repeats. Also, be sure to mark them like we do here - using the initials to indicate the type of verie it is. (c) is a hand-written or typed card, (q) is a printed "QSL" card, and (p) is a prepared card, prepared by the sender of the report and returned to him by the station. (f) is a form letter. (u) is a follow-up letter, or a verie from a f/up letter sent by the DXer, that is. (r) is a verie written by the station on the sender's own report and returned to him. (n) is a verie in the native language of the station when it is not English. Remember, we make this page up during the slack part of the week here, so you'll often find your v/s held over for an issue or even for two issues. It helps if you list your v/s on a separate sheet of paper and be sure to put your name on it. They need not be in order of frequency, but the frequency must be given. Everybody send yours in now!

**4 V E C - 1200 - Cap Haitien, Haiti**  
October 22, 3:00-4:00 a.m. EST.

You have been notified by special NRC card of this very special DX program. This will be a clear channel, and 4VEC's program will consist of familiar hymns and sacred songs. Now the really unusual feature of this program is the power of the station - 50 watts! Normally they operate non-directionally, but for this program they are going to attempt to beam their power in the direction of the United States, which should give us all a pretty good chance of making a most unusual and welcome addition to our logs. It has been quite some time since I have sent in a report! In any case, I am out of Duke University now, just waiting to go into the Service one way or another. Starting off with the good news, effective October 1, WQAM-560 and WKAT-1360 are running AN. Some of you may know through the trade magazines that Todd Storz (owns WGGY WTIK WHB KOWH) recently acquired WQAM. So it will feature the top 50 records, 24 hours a day, seven days a week (no silent period). And it just so happens that I now have a job with WQAM, and will begin announcing these some time next week. I will be doing some Sunday AM shifts, and eventually one AN show per week. So anyone who wants WQAM verified, send your reports to me, c/o WQAM. Checking on my log, I haven't DXed since last January. I did log KVOD-630 Denver between 1:15-1:30 a.m. Friday AM the 28th. It is a funny thing: KOA KSL KFI KNX and other West Coasters come in here decidedly earlier than they did in Durham, where I had a good antenna (none here). Miami is the worst possible place for DXing, as Cubans are on almost every frequency. On August 28rd, a group from Duke flew to Bermuda to entertain the Air Force with a musical show. At last, I found out where WINS' signal goes! On Sunday morning the 25th, at 8:45 a.m. EST (10:45 a.m. Bermuda Daylight Time) I could read WMCA WVNJ WRCA WOR WEAN WCBS WINS WNEW and WTOP. Kindley Air Force Base there has its own 200 watt directional TV station, ZBK-TV on Channel 10. It carries old U.S. shows; also, the U.S. and British governments have an agreement whereby ZBK-TV cannot send a decent signal over the entire island. On AM, ZBM-1 and ZBM-2 are owned by the same company. ZBM-1 is on from 6 a.m. to midnight daily on 1235 kc/s. and the CE says they are having a bit of trouble with a split-frequency squeal. ZBM-2 is on daily from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. except Sundays, when they are on later. During the next couple of weeks, I will send out a load of f/ups! 73s.

Address: Acropuerto Internacional, "Jose Marti", Rancho Boyeros, Habana, Cuba. (WRH) JL reports hearing a Cuban on 700 Kcs with apparently same program as on 690 Kcs. (Joe, it is in Ciego de Avila and is a member of CMBC network-FV) CMLZ (830) had a program in English at 2230 announcing "How we present a program of music for our listeners in the United States". Said program entirely in music followed with no announcements. (JL) Station on 780 Kcs. announced as "Radio Cadena Nacional" at 1955. Is it Cuban? (JL) (Could be CMHB-FV) Veric letter received from CMHW. Their DX was in Spanish and I did not hear the NRC mentioned, but that doesn't matter, as they were quite a bit under WGY. The harmonic of CMEX (1480) Cienfuegos is being heard every evening on 2960 Kcs. (Both CMS) HH reports that he missed the CMHW DX, but that Mary Eilen (Mrs. H) logged it for him with a good program log. HH also logged CMCA on 10/14 with some KSTN QRM from 0158-0225.

ALASKA-\*KINY (800) Juneau, seems to often be on top of frequency for hour or so before 3:05 AM sign-off despite CKOK also being on. (RHM) AEL reports hearing KINY weakly at 0322 on 9/24 during a FC. KTKR (930) Ketchikan, was on until 0510 on 10/10 with election returns, undoubtedly many other Alaskans were also on. (RHM)

EL SALVADOR-\*Station WSMA "La Voz Suprema de Occidente" is on the air at 0700-2300 on 1230 Kcs. with 1 Kw. Has English by Radio at 1945-2000 with Spanish news at 0830, 1300, 1845, and 2230. QRA is Apartado Postal No. 98, Santa Ana. (WRH) YSDR (820) heard frequently behind WBAP-WFAA near 2245. (DR)

COSTA RICA\*-TISA (835) "La Voz del Tropico" heard S-7 at 0725 Sunday morning 10/7. (DR) TIBH (1040) "Radio Emisora Sonora" heard well behind WHO at 2230. (DR) TILS (885) "Radio Para Ti", heard S-6 at 2300 on 10/7. (DR) Verie letter received from TIW. Signer is Antonio Murolo and the address is Apartado 835. (CMS) WIG responds to our request in the last DIGEST by furnishing us with the name of his TIRS signer. It is unreadable, but typed below the signature is Orlando Sotela. Follow-up was in Spanish and verie is in Spanish, exact wording "esta tione el objeto de verificar tal recepcion". (WIG)

PANAMA\*-WJR is unable to stand-by for HOXO On October 28th from 3-4 AM, so program is now tentative. Suggested if they did decide to go ahead with DX to drift if possible to 762 or 3 and use sound effects, tone, and what haveyou, to pierce WJR. Address is "Voice of the Ithmus, P. O. Box 3269, Panama City. Suggest that thank-you cards be sent to Mr. Beukema, even if program not on. (HH)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC\*-The harmonic of HILA (1490) Moca, is being heard every evening on 2982 Kcs., which means that they are operating slightly above 1490. They announce as "La Voz de ??????" and sign-off at 2100. (CMS)

HAITI\*-If you heard 4VEC (1200) on October 22, between 0300 and 0400, Write Mrs. M. E. Fieazo, Secr. LA MISSION BIBLIQUE DES ANTILLES, Box 1, Cap Haitien. Have sent out cards to many members regarding this DX. They will use 50 watts and say might be possible to hook up to DA antenna and beam to USA. (HH)

PUERTO RICO\*-Verie is now at hand from WWWW (1520) Kcs. in Rio Piedras. The signer this time is Emilio M. de Gandia. (FV)

(WRH) Station HJDE "La Voz de Antioquia" operates from 0600-2400 on 770 Kcs. with 50 Kw. (WRH) HJBB (1270) "La Voz de Cucuta" is on the air from 0600-2400 also. (WRH) "Emisoras Fuentes" operates HJAE (930) with 10 Kw. (WRH) Station on 685 Kcs. announced at 2146 "La Emisora Nacional de Colombia" then 3 chimes. (JL) (HJKA) HJCO (1160) Bogota, is calling itself "Emisora Sur America" and s/off at 2400. (DW)

BRAZIL\*-A new Sao Paulo station "Radio Novo de Julho" is operating on 540 Kcs. apparently from 0400-2200. (WRH) ZYDS (840) Salvador has been sent a "Tentative" report on reception of Portuguese language station for 3 minutes just before WHAS signed on at 0500 on 10/3. PORTUGAL-\*--Portuguese station on 782 Kcs. logged on 10/11 with strong signals from 1758-1930 s/off. (HH) Veric in via regular Emissora Nacional QSL card for reception of 665 Kcs. (FV)

## AFRICA

FRENCH EQUATORIAL AFRICA-\*--"Radio AEF" is now operating from 0900-1200 Sundays on 1485 Kcs., and from 1200-1530 daily. (WRH)

ANGOLA-\*--"Radio Angola" at Luanda is now operating on 1350 Kcs. from 0600-0830, 1330-1730 daily, 0300-0430, 0600-1200, and 1330-1730 Sundays. Power is 1 or 3 Kw. (WRH)

MOZAMBIQUE-\*--The English program from Lourenco Marques can be heard from 1030-1600 on 917 Kcs., power 100 Kw. (WRH)

FRENCH CAMEROUN-\*--Current schedules and listings show Douala with 1 Kw. on 1468 Kcs. as the only DCB station operating in this country. (DW)

## ASIA

JAPAN-\*--JOJB (1370) Kanazawa, logged with weak to fair signals from 0358-0439 on 10/11. News in English by announcer with British accent from 0400-0405. (AEL) DR reports Japs being heard on 670, 690, 750, 770, 790, 830, 850, 870, 890, 910, 930, 940, 950, 1010, 1030, 1090, 1100, 1130, 1170, 1210, 1310, 1370, and 1390, at various times and strengths between 0400 and 0900.

SOUTH KOREA-\*--HLKB (800) Pusan with 5 Kw. heard 10/7 and 10/8 at S-6 level. Verified promptly last season. HLKY (840) "The Christian Broadcasting Station" in Seoul with 10 Kw., heard well 0820-0845 on 10/7, not observing English announcements as shown in WRH. (DR)

TAIWAN-\*--BED22 (660) with 20 Kw. appears to be the Oriental frequently heard here in Southern California. Heard between 0430-0830, but ID not yet certain. Definitely Chinese language, but could be Mahayan station which uses Chinese. (DR)

## OCEANIA

HAWAII-\*--KHBC (970) Hilo, rolled in atop KBIS at 0404 S/off on 9/24, so a tape sent in hopes of verifying this needed one. (RHM)

Latin American stations are available many evenings and most mornings there are a few on which may be the ones you need. Why not give them a try?
