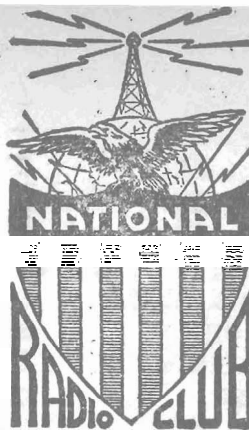

Wow, was I surprised when I received that first prize package from HQ - superb f/c list, articles on how to compile reports, how to get the most from your communications receiver, et al. Magnificent, gentlemen, and many thanks! Am new to the art of BCB DXing and there's lots about it that I don't know. How's LA reception here in northern California? Anyone know of a good loop antenna that's fairly easy to make and effective? How about stacking loops like they stack elements in TV antennas for better directivity or nulls? My DB-22-A is no good on BCB except with very shortest antenna (12'); otherwise cross-modulation from all the locals. Maybe someone knows how to get around that problem. Quite a few Japs heard here during November but much poorer lately. I stick pretty much to foreign DX other than CPC DX Specials - a little late in the game to work on domestics now and am quite a SWBC fan besides. The CPC lads are sure doing an outstanding job! KLEF fair 11/26 (an hour late); KDAY of course excellent here. WHBN, 11/27, occasionally audible. The antenna is a three element directional with 320' towers, the end towers on a line 35' from the center tower. The center tower is spaced 49 1/2' west of the 352 degree line. During daytime hours, KOPR operates non-directional with the end towers open circuited. Practically all of our equipment, both at the studios and transmitter is Gates Radio Co. with some RCA gear. During daytime hours, when KOPR is non-directional, the transmitter is remote controlled from the studios with the Gates RCM-20 system." KOPR also enclosed a coverage map. KVOB Denver 2, Col. for 11/16/56, 11/25/56, address, KVOB, Midland Saving Bldg., "The Voice of Denver." Here is a list of the affiliated stations: KUBC Montrose-Delta, Col., 1 kw., KRAI Craig, Col. 1 kw., KSIV Monte Vista, Col. 250 watts. KVOB Phone Tabor 5-2291 or TWX; DN 483. They enclosed two coverage maps, one of KVOB and other lists the following stations: KJLZ KMYR KIMN KTLN all in Denver and KOSI Aurora, Col. WENY, Elmira, N.Y. 250 watts non-directional unlimited, 12/2/56 on f/c as listed and scheduled. Address, WENY, Mark Twain Hotel. "Our main transmitter is a Collins 300-12, and our auxiliary transmitter is an RCA 25-D. Both operate with 250 watts output. The antenna is a 430' self-supporting vertical antenna, located in the valley where ground conductivity is excellent. The transmitters are both operated via remote control from our control room. The studios are located on the seventh floor of the Mark Twain Hotel. WENY began operations on Nov. 26, 1939, and covers approximately a 30 mile radius daytime, and approximately a ten mile radius at night. We do not figure our sky-wave coverage which as you know is excellent. North Star Broadcasting Co. applied for a station at Windom, Minn.
