I didn't mind too much being beat out of first place in the Foreign DX Contest but the day after the contest ended I received a fine letter and card verie from 2GL, Glen Innes, Australia! That's the game, however. I see where Kermit Geary received a verie from HILN and C.M. Stanbury got one from PJC2. Someone must like these two fellows, hi! I twirled the dials on the morning of July 20th and heard some of the finest reception of Japanese stations since resuming DXing back in 1954-55. Many of them were S 8 to 9 and the one on 1370 kc/s., JOKD, Kitami, was DB 20 over S 9 for 35 minutes. He IDed twice in English on the half hour. This was a very unusual event. Perhaps the Trans-Pacifics will be better this coming season. A DXer in Baltimore, Md. verified JONR this past season. Bill Bauer, who inquired about the NRC Foreign DX Contest in the July issue of DX NEWS lives about two blocks or so from Matt Kahner who verified JONR. You two should get together. Also, Bill, get Matt into the NRC. Baltimore is a good DX location. I started DXing back there in 1931 with the NRC and IDA groups. There are many good DXers still in Baltimore but it seems that the city of Baltimore is strictly an NNRC town. By the way, I hope that Carroll Weyrich, also of Baltimore, puts out his annual log. It's the best. I visited KGH, 1250 kc/s., San Fernando last Sunday and went through the files of reception reports. Long time, no see. My first report in months. Spend my time writing f/ups and more f/ups. I don't know what's the matter with these stations - can't seem to squeeze veries out of them. Have had about 25 reports out for five months and f/ups don't seem to help. My scarce veries are as follows: Letters from WLIB-1190 after three reports, WEUP-1600 after two, WPTX-920 after three, and WWOD-1390 back in only two days, my second to come back that fast. Cards from WIDU-1600, ZBM-1 on 1235 after three reports, and WSGM-610 out five months. Latest reports are to WEOL-930 and WIRK-1290. Have stopped to figure out my daytime DX, which I think is very good. On the best of days, I can receive 108 stations on 92 frequencies with the best being WGN WJR WABC CEM WCFL WIBC WBT WHAM WOSU-820 and NYC-930. Iforgot to mention WSM WMAQ WEAS WJJD WLS and WHNC-890. Normally I can get 98 stations on 84 frequencies. Although I have been informed that a power supply for my RAX-8 will cost \$30, the Surplus Editor of "CQ" informs that he has seen them for \$10, so I wrote him to see what's up. Have finally begun operations to convert my RAX-1 to household current, although I doubt that I will DX this year, due to the fact that I will be holding up five majors in high school. I won't have time to do anything but study. I'll be taking English 4, Physics, a half-year each of Solid Geometry and Trigonometry, Algebra 2, a half-year each of Psychology and Sociology, and Engineering Drawing. It's a tough course, or so they say, but I figure it won't be very difficult if I study. The only thing I can see that will be difficult is Solid Geometry. 31 July - A few veries have come in since last report, mostly Australians: 2YA VUNC-760 JOAB 5CK China-1020 EYZ rZR 3KZ 2UW 2YC 2NX 1ZB 4BC JOIB KFJZ 2GB KGB 2ZB 2FC 2NR 2KP 2BL 2CO 5MV 5WA 4QR 4QS 4QA 4QB 4RK 2KY. Most of these are a result of mid-ocean DXing on our last patrol. Since returning to Honolulu May 16th we have gone out twice on various incidents, and the following were all logged on RS: KFJZ KGB KFAC KCBQ KVIENIPAY KXNL KITO KNPT KEELA KMED. This is slowly but surely building up the West Coast collection. Of the veries, China verified with a form letter; 2GB returned my IRC; and 2GB and KGB were verified on the same day. Also happy to report equipment improvements at this den; German all-wave K1F1 set (Grundig 1077) appears to be an excellent investment; incorporates a highly sensitive rotatable ferrite antenna, and shows quite good selectivity throughout. Direct take-off for tape-recorder (unaffected by volume and tone controls) makes DXing by tape either timer contrdded, or manually, quite simple. Also have the DAK3 back with the 250.36 kc/s. band operating; only four stations logged on HF so far, all voice ID, and local or semi-local. Key use of this low band is to be for SWL using crystal converter; have 19 meter SW band set-up (15000-15450 kc/s. on low band; about 15 kc/s. per inch on dial, or about 4 kc/s. per inch on band spread if I needed it!) using 7,425 crystal (second harmonic on 14,850 kc/s., which plus 250 kc/s. gives me my low frequency in the 19 meter band of 15,100 kc/s. Trust this not utterly confusing; will work out other bands as I can obtain needed crystals. On to Findlay! This can be the most important Convention we've ever had, so please try to be there, everybody! Well, I've just returned from vacation, and this time for a change I went North, to New London, N.H. The nearest station to that burg is WTSV-1230. I visited some of the rarer stations in that part of New England, and learned the following facts. From WTSV-1400 in Hanover I learned that they have a local competitor now in WDCR, Dartmouth College Radio on 1340, which is commercial, but is silent during the summer vacation period and all Dartmouth vacation periods. That WTSV handles all Red Sox games and a good bet to log them is when they carry a Red-Sox at Kansas City night game, with the two-hour difference in time between EDT and CST, and that often they then f/c with Riverhead after the game. I met the lad who conducted the WSBS-860 test last season who is now at WTSV and we may get one there, but it's a tough frequency. I also visited one of their sister stations, WTSV-1230, Claremont, and learned there that they have one of New England's most powerful and high-up FM antennas in the section. He was surprised I had ever heard WTSV AM down in Brooklyn. He said they pick up the Red Sox games from Manchester via FM and relay them via their own FM to other area stations, thus saving line costs. They too might DX for us. Then I went over to Springfield, Vt. to drop in on WCFR1480, formerly WNIX, and learned they changed calls because of an ownership change, and the new folks thought the "nix" in the letters was a sort of self-condemnation. They also owned WIKK-1490, up in Newport, Vt. The "NIX" stood for Nixon and the IKE for Eisenhower, and both got their call assignments during the 1956 campaign. They have an every-three months f/c-TT midnight-12:15 a.m. the night following the last Monday and even in the DST period is's 12-12:15 their time!
