- 6) Include your v/s with your report, but on a separate sheet of paper, with frequencies included, and with your name atop. List the abbreviations we use, especially as to type of verie, i.e.e., "q", "r", etc. This will help us wonderfully here.

I received my third bulletin yesterday, and I was very pleased with it. I get a great kick out of reading these bulletins of the NRC, and they help me greatly with my DXing. The only DXing since I got back to the States has been on a borrowed SX-99. I had it for three days and nights, and I came up with the following: 10/4- WFAA-830; WCKY-1530; WHLM-550. 10/5- WMID-1340, BHTG-1410, WDVM-540, WEEU-850, WHLI-1100. 10/6- WEAT-850, CHSJ-1150, CHNQ-640. Reports are out to all with the exception of WEEU, and the following varies have drifted in, all letters: WHLM WHLI WEAT. WEAT signed my report; WFAA came through with a QSL card, and CHSJ sent a folding QSL with pictures. I asked the latter to do a DX for us, but the station said they had been unsuccessful in the past. This summer while in Canada I sought special programs for the DXRC and the NRC, and came up with the following results: CKEW-1000, in Bridgewater, N.S. said "yes," preferably in March, on a Monday morning; CHNS-960 in Halifax, N.S. said "yes" also and will do a two or three hour show.
