Be sure to list the frequency and the type of verie, "c" - typed or hand-written card; "f" form or printed letter, or carbon copy; "n" in native language of the station when not English; "p" verie by prepared card - prepared by you, that is, and sent to them for signature, all else having failed to achieve the verie; "r" verie typed, stamped or written on your own reception report which is returned to you; "q" verie by printed "QSL" card a la amateur radio stations; "u" verie: received after a follow-up. No letter with the call means it is a written or typed letter. Don't more of you list your v/s as you send in your "Musings?" Remember, the separate sheet of paper with your name on it, please!

Joe Becker - Hamilton, Ohio. Here is another small report. Heard on November 1 - (Vol. 16, # 11, 11/13/48) WJGM WMID KDWT WHTC WSSO. November 2, no luck on any new ones. Nov. 3, did not DX; but I did sleep 11 hours. Nov. 4, KXRX, KFSB, WSCR. I do not think that reception this year is as good as it was last year at this time. I like my Hallicrafters set very much, one thing I like very much is this \* I can go from one end of the dial to the other in a very short time. The noise limiter is also good. WSCR put on a very good show. WJMV, Athens, Ala. was giving out names of DXers reporting their reception, and quite a few NRC members were mentioned. In Texas, I have verified most stations - 124; New York, 118; Pennsylvania 94; California, 81; North Carolina 74; Ohio 72; Illinois 75, Georgia 68. During the last DX season, there were two states from which I did not tune in a new station, namely South Dakota, and Vermont. My worst pest is WCPO, followed by WKGN and WHHM on 1340 kc/s. Not much, don't have much time for DX, but did manage to turn over in bed and turn on my S-38-D and pick up WPCF DX program. Came in good here, and sent for my first verie since 1938. We do not try for veries any more; just like to listen to the stations, and occasionally tape an ID, for some unknown reason. WKWF 1600 Key. West comes in up here almost every evening. WISH 1310 has been AN for a week or so now. I know how the gang hates the AN boys, but it sure makes DX more difficult, and keeps some people from logging every station on the air, hi! By the way, we have a special offer to make to NRC members (which we may extend to other clubs). Full ID for HJAQ: "Esta es Radio Miramar desde Cartagena, HJAQ, 1020 kilociclos, y ..... frecuencia modu----, una emisora de Radio Cadena (I have Nacional in my notes, but must have been Del Norte), con diez (10) kilovattios de potencia." TGUX carries many U.S.A. records, and hazz a jazz hour 10:00 to 10:30 p.m., ID at 10:33 in English as "Panamerican Broadcasting Station, 1020 on your dial." Spent weekend IDing a few of Godwin's wplit tapes, and Dick Cooper's 675 split is YNDS, Union Radio, moved from last year's 665. Full ID: "Union Radio, La Onda Musical de (sounded like Fortudas), frecuencia (sounded like said '655'), Managua." A little info for musings. Have no typewriter so will try to write legibly. This is my first fall/winter DX season, and am concentrating on mostly international DX. Have a Hammarlund HQ-190-X receiver and 142 foot long wire antenna running east and west. To date have logged about 15 split channel LAs, with TIDCR-625, TGJ-880, YNW-935, TIFC 995 and YSEB-1075 by far the most consistent, not counting strong Mexico City stations. I have at least seven LAs not identified. Wish to report that new station KDOM in Windom, Minn., 1580 kc/s., 250 watts D-3 (two-towers) is at present tuning antenna after midnight with possible ID every half hour. Should be on RS towards end of this month. Am still with KRBI, St. Peter, 1310 kc/s. (1,000 watts, D-3, two towers) with null to southeast. We should be a tough one for most of you to South and East. Early copy requested so here goes. DX by dateline: 11/3- WCLO-1230, Janesville, Wisc. with a good readable signal on f/c-TT 2:05-2:20 over and through QRM except five minutes later than listed. Stations on 1230 can be heard through QRM, this one was easy and after WCLO s/off WCOL, Columbus, O. heard very clearly on AN show announcing "The New WCOL." This seems to be a new practice for many, many stations. WCOL was first reported on f/c 1/11/50 but they never QSLed and they were never heard since until now. ## INTERNATIONAL DX DIGEST

From time to time standards are mentioned with respect to reporting to the MUSINGS and to the DIGEST. The NRC Board has assigned to your editors the task of setting those standards in order to make the least amount of work to get the most information across. The standards for the DIGEST at the moment are as follows:

1. Write on one side of the page only.
2. Double space if you type, allow plenty of space if you handwrite. (Postal cards are acceptable, but please don't jam them too much.)
3. Arrange your reports by country and by continent exactly as they appear here. Keep general comments at the beginning or end of your report, thus leaving all DX information in one place.
4. All overseas members should send all of their information including so-called "Musings" to the DIGEST. This is done chiefly to save postage for overseas members who would otherwise have to report to two or three places.
5. Deadline in Lemoyne is always Wednesday morning before date of publication. However, at times it may be necessary for me to edit the DIGEST before Wednesday evening. At these times some material may have to be held over, but there is no way that these times can be announced in advance. Assume Wednesday morning as deadline.

Cost is \$1.25 per log, and there are three, one listing stations by call letters and slogans, one by frequencies, and one by countries. World Radio Handbook is now out of print on the 1958 issue, and the 1959 issue will be announced in this column. It is available from Gilfer Associates in New York, exact address will be shown when the new log is out. I am not sure if the Asian Log of the New Zealand Radio DX League is out of print or not. Hank Wilkinson, address under reporters, had some for sale at 75¢ each. If he is out, try writing Ken Mackey, Divisional Engineers Office, Dunedin, New Zealand. With those logs you will be able to listen to the world with all the information at your finger-tips. The Jones Log you already have is excellent, but the Weyrich Log also covers South America and the Central~~xx~~ American countries not in the MARBA. I would recommend having both (as I do).

While on the log book subject, let me add that I have just received the Winter 1958 Issue of the Jones Log, and find that it is completely readable and usable.
