Well, DX around here sure has been great! DX by dateline: 10/26- Three new ones were added - WHEQ 530 on their AN sked, and WIAM and WORD 900 and 910 respectively on their r/c. 10/31- Long wanted ZNS 1540 came through powerful WPTR for a new country. 11/1- WDEB 580 and WHHY 1440 logged for new calls. Both were logged on RS but WHHY's was AN RS. 11/2- WENJ 1300 logged on RS at 7:30 a.m., and WFRP 1230 was logged on AN RS. 11/5- Six new stations were logged today, four on r/c- WBUZ 1570, WCLB 1220, WKRT 920, and lastly WDEB 1330. Also logged on this day new were WLOF 950 under WPEN at 7:50 p. m., and WCKR 610 at 9 p.m. 11/6- Four new stations were added- they are WUSJ-1340 on r/c and CJOY /450, WHOO 990 on AN shows, also WYTH 1250 on their DX for the NARC. 11/7- Cubans on practically every frequency tonight and the following were definitely logged and proven: CMHW 810 way over WGY, CMHB 780, no trace at all of WBPM, CMCD 760 completely blocking out WJR, CMJT 700 about equal with WLW, and lastly CMJL 920, top-ping the frequency. There were Cubans also on 950 670 and 980 which I couldn't ID. 11/8- Four more new ones were added today and all of them on the same frequency - WFLA WESO WCHN and WCSH, 970, were all heard at 6:00-6:45 a.m. (WNTA s/on at 7:00). 11/9- This day was the best day I've ever had since I've been DXing - only three ~~new~~ catches added and only one was a real good catch but this one made up for the other two - CJNB 1460 was heard on RS at 3:30 in the clear. Their s/off is 4:00. The signal was surprisingly wery clear. Also received were KLO 1430 clearer than local WICC! They were received on their 3:01 s/off, and lastly WHK 1420 was received over CMCG on an AN show. Signals from the W st were sure wonderful that day as my friend Charles Territo received CFCN 1060, KNX 1070 and KRLD 1080. Today 11/10 one new station was received - WQXT 1340 on an f/c-TT, time listed in DX Down the Dial. Veries have been coming in still slowly, consisting of WCOY WBPB WHGR WHEQ WFLN and KFAB in cards, and WBRB WOOW CJMS WDWV WSEA WORD CKCW WERE and WIAM. Well, I guess I better end it so 73s to all and good DX.

Just recently the Kruse family had a pleasant visit in Cedar Rapids at the Gorsuch home our first since the Findlay Convention. The last week but three new loggings added to my DX Log. On Nov. 1st, six-month-old KZOL 1570 Muleshoe, Texas was heard surprisingly well with its final 15 minutes of RS 6:30-6:45 p.m. when they signed off the air. The powerful XERF had not resumed broadcasting till 7 p.m. on that date, so a fine new catch for me. Then on 11/4 the four-month-old Indiana station WMFT 1300 Terre Haute, was heard on a f/c-TT from 4:25-4:40 a.m., with QRM from AN WRBC. This was the only station in the Hoosier State lacking from my DX Log. The DX Test on 11/6 from Station WYTH 1250, Madison, Ga. was logged with difficulty, but plenty for a DX reception report. The 5 kw. WEMP in Milwaukee really controls the 1250 spot at this den in the early morning hours. The past week three verifications were received, bringing my total to 3,247. Included were two from Iowa, a nice QSL card from KMAQ in Maquoketa, and a letter from KWVY in Waverly, to complete the entire state. The third came from KZOL in Muleshoe, Texas. Congratulations to Bill Prater of Tennessee on his fine promotion at Station WCLC in Jamestown, Tenn.!

Only four new additions to my log since last time, but one of them is highly prized. WDAY-970, Fargo, N.D. was heard on Oct. 31 at 11:35 p.m. under WWSW for my first North Dakota station. States logged are now at 40. Also on the 31st I heard CHEX-980 for new frequency. Logged and verified on 1430. At midnight WZOK-1320 was heard, for call change. The only other station logged was WJSO-1590 new one in Jonesboro, Tenn. on Nov. 5 at 5:06. DX seems to be picking up, and I hope to get more time to listen after the 21st. No new veries, but reports are out to ZNS-1540, WDAY-970, WZOK-1320, WJSO-1590 and WFIS-1600. XERF likewise, WW good a long way out in the Pacific, right through KAIM. Did DX some on the way back, as follows, all times EST: 10/22, KIDD-630, 9:39-10 until KPOA took over. AIR heard well on 670. Rest of stations heard while proceeding to Honolulu. 10/27, WIOE-1030 good at 12:45; South American on 1180, WFAA-820 and WOAI-1200 good. Mexicans good on 1500 760 900 1570 1030 730 800 1220 940 and 1000. KGHM always on top of KRAK. Guess the latter's not 50 kw. yet. KFRC-510 logged 10/30 2:19-2:25 a.m. CKLG-730 good at times, covered mostly by KFQD. KKIS-990 logged 3:17, 10/31. KUDE-1320 from 5:36-4:05 with test. KFAR-660 in the clear 10/31 1:34-1:47 a.m. KWIZ-1480 good 2:45-3 s/off. A lot of statesiders heard, including WBZ WCAU KDKA KYW, about 5,000 miles in WBZ's case. As of 12/1/58 I will have a shore job on Sand Island, Honolulu, at the Coast Guard base, which is where the Winnebago and several other ships tie up. Anyone coming out here, let me know. Mort Meehan - Santa Cruz, California

An Open Letter to Mr. Henry J. Wilkinson. Dear Hank: For many years I've been reading your reports on the wonderful foreign reception you have been receiving and I'm sure you have been creating an impression with our Eastern cousins that California is some sort of a DXer's paradise. This because of the many Japanese, Chinese and South Americans you report. Now I've lived and DXed in over a half dozen California locations using a 1943 National NC-175 which is every bit as powerful as that little Hallicrafters peanut whistle you use. But somehow I just can't pull in the TPs and SAs the way you do. While on the high (2,400 feet) Mojave Desert a year ago I pulled in Colombians (two) on your tips but couldn't get a single TP other than Hawaii weakly. A few years previous on the south shore of Monterey Bay at Carmel I heard many Japs and KFAR Fairbanks was almost a nightly visitor after 10 p.m. PST, but no Southern or East Coast stations. Now on the north coast of the Monterey Bay at Santa Cruz I've been getting terrific Hawaiian reception this season, but no Alaska or Japan. This morning, November 10, we had our first rain of the season and I've found this is good for TP reception so I tried for the Japanese you listed on Page 6 of the November 1 bulletin. Results were: 750 kc/s. yes, a weaksignal, Japanese, S 1-4. 830 kc/s. nix. 890 kc/s. and 1210 something there but too weak to ID. 950 and 1170 held loud U.S. stations. 1370 had a weak TT with an even weaker background station. On 760 kc/s. WJR was overriding KGU which is my nightly clue to how the Hawaiians are coming through. KULA on 690 was S 6-7 with a strong background station. Chicago 50 kws. were about same with no luck on New York 50 kw. This is normal here. With the semi-local KMJ off I heard a weak station on 580 say it was K-Y, Color Radio. Wonder if what I heard was K-Bye for KABI up in Alaska? Reason I wonder is because a few minutes later at 5 a.m. EST I clearly heard Anchorage ID as K-nie. Now Hank, who do I have to struggle for years to barely hear these stations when you receive them so easily? Do you have some sort of secret directional antenna system?

As I am now a member of NRC (and I'm glad of it!) I thought a report might be in order. Although a DXer since 1936, I have become seriously interested in BCB only in the past six years, and feel that is where I belong. Just as I was planning to devote more time this winter to snagging some TAs, I learned that a promotion came my way, requiring some schooling for law. That does not mean I am moving out of the picture, however, as I see a very fertile season. Several BBC outlets and Frenchmen were added to the TA log, and although many reports are out, none has yet been received. Will be back next week with more details. (Welcome to NRC, Matt, and we'll welcome your reports! -Ed.)

Jim Ernst - 563 Park Avenue - Scotch Plains, New Jersey

This week has been pretty busy for me, as I have been getting out the monthly DKRC bulletin. I received a letter from Ken Mackey in New Zealand, and I was really amazed at his antenna system. He has about 4,400' of antennae. I also received a plan for Hal Williams's loop, for which I owe him a dime. Will get that off this week too, and thanks for the plan. The first real DX that I have done this year I did on 11/9. Then I logged WOAI-1200, and three stations on in Quebec with an AN marathon for Springhill. CBM-940 really boomed in here, but it was not needed. However, when the other stations with the Marathon were mentioned, I logged CKVL-350 and CJMS-1280 for the first time. CFRA came in at 3:00, but with bad slopover from WMCA-570. Then the biggest surprise came at 3:10 when I caught CHAB-800 in Moose Jaw, Sask. on with a TB marathon. It is one of my best yet. I installed a new antenna, 80' long, on 11/9, so maybe that had something to do with my logging it.
