### R E M I N I S C I N G W I T H R O S E N B A U M

Recently found an old Crosley Station Log that I had stored away. The log is for the year 1923 and lists the following New Yorkers:

WGR 319 meters, 940 kc/s., Buffalo, N.Y. Federal Tel. and Tel. Co.  
 WJY 405 meters, 740 kc/s., New York, N.Y., R.C.A.  
 WJZ 455 meters, 660 kc/s., New York, N.Y. R.C.A.  
 WBAY 492 eters, 610 kc/s., New York, N.Y. American Tel. & Tel. Co.  
 WEAJ 492 meters, 610 kc/s., New York, N.Y., American Tel. & Tel. Co.  
 WGY 380 meters, 790 kc/s., Schenectady, N.Y., General Electric.

One strange thing he noted in that log was that 360 meters, 833 kc/s., was the graveyard channel of that era. On 360 meters were KLZ Denver, WDAP, Chicago, WFAK Denver, WGI, Medford Hills, Mass., WHAM Rochester, N.Y., WKAQ, San Juan, P.R., WMAF, Round Hills-Dartmouth, Mass., WSY, Birmingham, Ala. Only three Canadians were listed, CFCA, CFCN and CKAC. Radio dramas then were called "Radarios."

6-XJ, Tuimucu, SW Experimental, probably the ham station of Frank Jones who in later years came to be known as the "Father of Hams." He died several years ago.

We wonder if any NRCers have any of these old-timers verified other than WJZ-WGY-WEAJ!

With the new season under way I started out under the impression the Domestic Contest would not start until Oct. 15 so I worked at foreign reports first. After new tries at a few Mexicans I dug for new ones. 9/26 found TGXA-1040 on top of WHO from 10:54 to 11:30 p.m. for a good report and a positive verie is back already. 9/28 brought such a terrific signal from KPOA-650 that I could not stick to my intention of waiting till the Domestic Contest started to report this one. They were using Japanese but verie back says that as of Oct. 1 they have switched to English programming. Of course the Domestic Contest got started earlier than I thought so I'll get to count it there. 10/1 started out with YSC-1015 readable for the first time here and reported. Monday 10/5 found HJAT-1080 and WKVM-810 good, the latter at 4:25 a.m. s/on. Reports out on both. I got to work on domestic stations when the DX NEWS arrived from Amarillo. Thanks, fellows. KBMI-1400 is back on the air and running AK but seems to be off Monday AMs. KBET-1340 signs off at 3 a.m. for those who need Nevada. 10/13 and 10/14 had KUTY-1470 running tests. For those in the West who need CKOV-630, they are easy on Tuesday AMs with KOH off. They run to 4:05 a.m. s/off. 10/15 I caught KWIV-1050 on for r/c but CE used his ham call first and had to correct. In verie he says he had just been working 40 meters and slipped up. The best bet for Alaska in the West is KBYR-1270, heard announcing AN. Frequency is clear after CHAT s/off at 2:15. ## NORTH AMERICA

JAMAICA--On 10/17 from 2200-2210 the one on 750 was heard. Don't know QRA but announced as "This is the Jamaican Broadcasting Corp." at 2200. Music followed. The signal was fair with 3 Spanish speakers hashing things up a bit. Report sent. 10/18 from 0508-0513 the Government one was heard under and over WLW to get an ID and one or two songs. Scanty report sent. (JE) Jamaica Broadcasting System station on 700 logged at 2030 on 10/27. (CMS)

HONDURAS--HRN (685) logged at 2330 on 10/13 with good signal. Is now on this frequency. In Tegucigalpa. (SJ) Has tremendous signal everynight signing off at 2400 in Spanish with three lengthy gongs before and after actual announcement. Report by tape sent. (LBC) Positive ID at 1900 on 10/26. (CMS) Slogan and slow clear ID heard 10/27 at 2305, using NBC type chimes. Excellent signal. (MF)

PANAMA--Verie via picture post card received promptly from HOU. Yolanda C. Sanchez is the VS and the address is Apartado 160. DR's mystery station "Radio Radioj" on de la Hora should be HCU44. (CMS)

NICARAGUA--YNDS (675) Managua, "Union Radio", still on this freq. (SJ) YNW Managua not heard on 935, probably back on 930 Kcs. (SJ)

CUBA--CMAR (1190) Pinar del Rio, logged at 2000 on 10/15 announcing as Cadena Continental which I assume means they are relaying CMBQ. There are other stations in the net. CMK (1200) Habana appears to also have a network. It is possible they have taken over CNC from CMW, but that is far from definite. (CMS) CMCG (1550) Habana, "Radio Cadezos", now on this frequency. (SJ) CMK (1190) Habana, not on this frequency again. (SJ)

GUATEMALA--TGJ (880) Guatemala City, "Radio Nueva Mundo", logged on 10/5 at 0030. (SJ) TGXA (1040) Guatemala City, "Radio Centro Musical" heard almost nightly. (SJ) TG--(1210) Guatemala City, "Radio 1210", logged at 0100 on 10/5. Is this TGED? (SJ)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC--There is a new station on 1162 Kcs. announcing as "La Voz de La Atlantica" and mentioning La Vega, Santiago, and Puerto Plata. These are in a triangle on the Atlantic Coast of this republic so I assume that is the approximate location. (CMS) One on 978 Kcs. announcing as in Santiago de los Caballeros. Believe it is FILE, logged 9/8 at 2230. (SJ)

HAITI--4VAB (1145) Port-au-Prince, "Radio Caribc", logged at 2000 on 10/20. (SJ) 4VW (1325) Port-au-Prince, logged at 1930 on 10/20. (SJ)

COSTA RICA--THCS (855) San Jose, "Radio America", logged at 0015 on 10/14. (SJ)

## SOUTH AMERICA

COLOMBIA--New one on 738 Kcs. announcing as "Radio Tricolor" no call heard on 10/22 at 1935. (SJ) HJCS (925) Bogota, "Radio Continental" logged at 2100 on 10/10. (SJ) LJFW (970) Pereira, "Radio Cafe", logged at 0003 on 9/20. (SJ) Another unknown on 930 Kcs. in Bogota, signing as "Nueva Granada" RCN at 0010 on 9/20. (SJ) On 10/11 HJAF (930) and not HJAE as in Weyrich was heard thru and over WPAT from 0010-0040. There was some kind of an all-nite show. Airmail report was sent with a tape, and two weeks later, a registered airmail verie was received. They verified by letter and also on my tape. Their address is "Emisoras Fuentes", Apartado Aereo No. 91, Nacional No. 31, Cartagena. Other stations in the network are "Emisoras Unidas" HJAN, (730) Barranquilla; 10 Kw.; "Emisora Sinu", HJAZ (1060) Monteria, 1 Kw.; "Radio Vigia", HJAD (1330) Cartagena 1 Kw.; "Radio Vigia", HJAO (1250) Barranquilla, 1 Kw. They mentioned something about Nov. 12, and the hours after midnight, so

those of you who need this station might give it a try Nov. 12 and the hours after midnight. Signer is Carlota Mendoza M., Relaciones Publicas. (JE)

ARGENTINA-\*-"Radio Spondid" Buenos Aires is on the air from 0440-2330 over LR4 (830) with 50 Kw. (WRH)

PARAGUAY-\*-"Radio Paraguay", Asuncion is operating over ZP10 (1300) 1.5 Kw., from 0500-2200. (WRH)

VENEZUELA-\*-"YV04 (995) was heard on 10/11 from 0045-0050 s/off. Report and tape sent. (JE) YVQF (720) in well on 10/14 from 2200 on. YVQ0 (650) at 2140-2220. Report sent to this one which was S-9 or better. ID of YVQF is "Radio Bolivar", and YVQ0 is "Ondas Portenas". (JE) YVND (970) Maracaibo, "Radio Catatumbo", logged 2000 on 10/10, also on 955 Kcs. at 2300 on 10/13. Now back on 970. (SJ) YVNM (1000) Moron, "Radio Moron", 10 Kw., announced new station on 9/8 at 2225. (SJ)

BRAZIL-\*-"Radio Tamoi", Rio de Janeiro, is now using medium waves only over PRB7 (900) 10 Kw., from 0400-2300. "Radio Tupi", Rio de Janeiro, is on from 0500-2235 over PRG3 (1280) 50 Kw. "Radio Brasil", Campinas, is on the air from 0400-2300 over ZYR39 (1270) with 250 watts. "Radio Excelsior" Sao Paulo, operates from 0400-0200 over ZYR56 (670) with 10 Kw. This station also operates PRG9 (1100) 50 Kw., under the name of "Radio Nacional de Sao Paulo". "Radio Bandeirantes", Sao Paulo, broadcasts from 0530-2200 on ZYR73 short waves and 24 hours over PR19 (840) 10 Kw., daytime and 5 Kw. nighttime. (WRH) "Radio Marajuaba" is operating experimentally now over ZYE20 (1130) with 10 Kw. (WRH)

#### ASIA (PACIFIC)

MALAYA-\*-"Radio Malaya" Kuala Lumpur, operates five networks: Blue, Red, Green, Purple, and Orange. The Blue network radiates English programs on 880 (Kuala Lumpur) 10 Kw. The Red Network carries Malay over Kuala Lumpur (1070) 10 Kw., Kota Bharu (840), Kuantan (860), and K. Trengganu (960) all 300 watts. The Green Network broadcasts Chinese and Tamil programs over Kuala Lumpur (590) 10 Kw. The Purple network has Penang 2 (820), Ipoh 2 (910), and Malacca (1010) all 200 watts. This is in English and Chinese. Last the Orange Network is in Malay and Tamil and uses Penang (660), Ipoh (740), and Malacca (1280), all 200 watts each. (WRH)

JAPAN-\*-"JOEK (670) in the clear with ID at 0500 on 10/24 in Japanese only. On the hour, 4 pips were heard, each 1 second apart, the last one being of higherpitch than the preceding three. Readability as 4, the signal strength was 3. Watch for this one on the East Coast. (LBG)

From MF, two heard from 0600-0630 on 10/25, one on 820 and one on 870 Kcs. These were carrying identical programs, very weak, with pop and light classical music such as "Swedish Rhapsody" and "Liebestraum". Any help welcomed.
