(Yes -ed.) 5:47, KKOK-630 on top with one of those 'name the singer' contests now touring some rr stations. 11/20- Short DX session from 1 a.m. till 5:05 or so. 1:05, WJRA-1390 Troy, N.C. testing - is this new? (yes -ed.) 1:30 WMEFJ-1450 ID through mess; 2:34 WGBS-710 ID with WOR off; 2:41 WTAZ? (North Augusta, S.C.) new call? (WTHB, Joe -ed.) testing on 1550; 2:45 KENO-1460 strong but with severe fading; 2:59 WFMH-1460 on testing; 3:45 tentatively KIMN-950 (tentative report sent); 4:05 WILS-1320; 4:07 WPTF-680 DX; 4:31 WDLR-1550 DX strong. 5:00, s/on WIRC-630; 5:01 WDLR-1550 onto RS (a little outside of the limits of a daytimer?), said they felt like staying on rather than to s/on at 6, and finally, WHIO-1290 call at 5:03 heard. 73s.
