Howdy, gang. Some thought has pointed up the fact that probably there are some who don't know anything about the Jones Log mentioned so often in DX NEWS. This handy log is put out by Vane A. Jones (also a DXer) of 3749 North Keystone Ave., Indianapolis 18 Ind. It sells for a bargain price of only \$1. I think it's worth at least \$7 or \$8! The log measures 8 1/2" long by 5 1/2" wide and contains upwards to 100 pages. The first few are devoted to the hobby of DXing and how to pursue it, plus instructions on how to use the listings. Next pages are devoted to last minute changes available just at publication time. The next four or five are devoted to TV listings, then ten to FM. The next 20-21 pages go to AM listings by state, province, and country as is TV and FM. The following 30 pages are for frequency AM listings. These contain calls, frequency, networks, power both day and night, sked (AN, S, SH or D) type of programming presented by station, which stations share time, and whether they use the same or separate XRs. The next 20 pages contain all AM FM TV calls together in one big list. The last page has all abbreviations. This log lists all stations in NA, all stations in the Caribbean area, Mexico, Bermuda, all American possessions, all Canadian Territories, Greenland, STP Pierre and Miquelon. It is published on commercial presses and is well made up. The cover of the '58 edition was blue and gray; '59 edition was blue, '60 was red. The current ('61) edition is a pretty green. Asked Jones, but he doesn't know what color he will cover the '62 edition with but you can bet that it will be pretty. Vane Jones the Editor gets no profit from this log as not enough people buy it but it is worth every cent that you spend on it. Mr. Jones can kind of be classed with our hard-working editors Ernie, Fred, Ev and Secretary Pop Edge. If you are tired of your present log send an order to Vane Jones. The '62 edition should go to press at the end of January. However something usually arises that slows down the publishing the Jones Listings. Even so, it's well worth the wait. FIRST CLASS POSTAGE

During the past few weeks I have received information from several members that their DX News has been taking quite a bit of time to reach them, that is via Third Class Mail. Because I have a few check points, I know that the DX News mailed 3rd class are leaving Buffalo regularly every saturday, thus any delays are not caused by them not leaving here I have inquired and were told that with this class of mail, delays are often caused at the different transfer points enroute and because it is 3rd class, no remedy can be had. As we should know, 3rd class mail can be held for delivery until all other mail has been cleaned up.

Several members have sent in either extra money or extra stamps to have their DX News mailed first class. Naturally this is extra cost for them because with our annual dues at \$4.00 the NRC couldnt afford to send all DX News first class, thus we have to use the 3rd class method.

After some debating on my part I have come up with this suggestion and here it is. If enough of you members would like to have your DX-News mailed first class every issue, then upon remitting your dues, send a total of \$6.00. Broke down it would be this. \$4.00 for your yearly dues and the other \$2.00 for first class postage. Being there are 34 issues each year, means that the club would pay for the first 2 ounces at regular 3rd class rate which amounts to .03¢. Sending the same issue 1st class the postage per issue would be .08¢, thus the member pays the difference which is .05¢ per issue. At 34 issues per year and .05¢ per issue the total extra for first class postage would amount to actually \$1.70. But in the past years we have had at least a couple or maybe 3 issues that have been more than 10 sheets of paper (20 pages) which when this occurs the postage goes up, meaning for these issues the club pays .04-1/2¢ postage at the 3rd class rate and to mail it 1st class, the postage is .12¢ thus the member pays the difference which is in these cases .07-1/2¢. What I am trying to get over is that the extra \$2.00 would be used to mail everything to the member coming from the club, First Class Mail. Now here is one advantage that could be obtained by those who would take advantage of the above.

If enough members elected to do this, but the total would have to be at least 100, I could on many occasion get the ones going first class in the mail Friday evening at the latest. At times I would have to make a special trip to our main post office in downtown Buffalo if I could not get them ready in time to be picked up at the corner mail box by the last pick up on Fridays. But as I stated, I do not believe making a special downtown trip or even bother to walk to the corner would be worth while unless at least 100 members were involved. Saying it wouldnt be worth while is that to do that I would have to stop compiling DX News in order to mail the first class at either place.

This offer will have to be restricted to only include those members living in the United States or its Possessions and Canada, because for 1st class mail to other countries run much higher. Please remember this is not compulsory but an offer to those who might desire first class DX mail service. However for a Friday mailing whenever possible at least 100 members will have to accept, if less than 100, then all 1st class will continue to be mailed as usual on Saturday mornings when I take DX News to the P.O. A reminder to those who receive their DX-News 3rd class. Now that the Christmas Holidays are upon us, delays in receiving your issues must be expected because of the large volume of mail. You can be assured that DX News for Dec 9th - 16th - 23rd and for Dec 30th will be mailed as usual on those dates.

The reaction and results on the above first class mail offer will be published in a near future issue of DX News. Yet anyone wanting this offer and sends in either money or stamps, it will begin as soon as received, other than a Friday mailing until the number reaches 100 or more. To those few now using 1st class, please do nothing until notified-Ray.

From Your Executive Secretary

Again we dwell upon a subject which I presume is getting bolder and bolder and is creeping into the pages of DX News.

It seems to me that the continued remarks appearing in some musings towards others is getting to be a habit that is growing. It must be remembered that the pages of DX News are published to give DX information to its members, not to run down this one or that one. Your musings and DX Digest Editors are striving to give you every bit of up to date and correct information pertaining to your hobby. Both Editors are responsible for what appears in their respective sections. Neither of them are in a position to take time out to sit down and straighten out arguments that do or might arise between 2 or more members because of some remark/s that were inserted in a musing or otherwise. For either Editor to have to completely edit each members report is out of the question because of the lack of time. Further each Editor gladly gives his time and effort by cutting your reports into stencils, a job that cannot be done in a matter of minutes, but takes hours and several of them along without being re-embursed for their time.

An example of this can be plainly noted at the bottom of the Front Page of this issue, a note cut into that stencil by your Musings Editor. At first I was going to delete it and cut it into this stencil, but I am leaving it there as a reminder but have blocked it out on copies not being sent to members.

Being connected with the publishing of a DX Bulletin since 1940 and being active in DXing since 1931 I most certainly believe that the actions and reports of the present day DXers are not becoming better as they should but actually going down grade. I will agree that the Old Time DXer had to learn the hard way but yet he was instructed by others who knew and the result was the DX hobby came up with top notch DXers who have compiled both loggings and veries that are impressive. True we are sadly in need of booklets etc instructing the new DXer as to how he can get the most out of this grand hobby. The best that has been done in this respect was the publishing by the N R C of the booklett entitled "How To Enjoy Better DXing" which was compiled by our good member Norn Maguire. Each NRC member has received a copy of this booklett.

To those new and younger members I suggest that you begin now and completely read this booklet and then as much as possible adhere to its contents when DXing and sending out reports asking for verification. If this is done I am sure that you will get better results and it will also result in better relations between our hobby and the station. Why not give it a try?

A bit of history about DX News. Since 1940 DX News has been issued 34 times a year without a break, even during the war years. It is the only BCB DX Publication that still maintains a weekly issue during the DX season. Its dues have never been excessive and have only been raised when the cost of bulletin supplies have increased. The NRC operates on a Non-Profit basis, meaning no one gets paid for the compiling and publishing of DX News. Despite supply prices having raised in the past 2 years we have continued without raising dues by first, invoking the 20 page limit (10 sheets of paper) to each issue along with allotting no more than 30 lines to a musing and only 1 musing per issue. I have found no hard having been caused by the above restrictions, yet we have continued to give our members the full up to date bcb information. We can continue this pattern and intend to do so until such time when it would become impossible only because of an other increase in the price of our bulletin supplies such as mineo paper-envelopes-ink and stencils, or a increase in the rate of 3rd class mail. On the good side the financial condition of the NRC allows us not to have to worry about anything like this for at least another full year. So in ending, lets see no more of this knocking another member, nor the downgrading of this radio station or that one because of their doings. I realize that all of us have our likes and dislikes but let us keep them to ourselves and if we do have to complain, do it to the proper authorities as a citizen, not an NRCer
