TWO - 2 - DOMESTIC DX CONTESTS THIS YEAR!

Because of such a great interest again this year, we will try something new! Two Domestic DX Contests! You may enter either #1 or #2 or both! Each is 25¢. Please state which one you want or send in 50¢ for BOTH contests. Dates and verie info are the same for both. Contest #1 is the 50-state contest; Contest #2 is the new Alphabetical Contest. The rules for both follow. -Ernie Wesolowski.

CONTEST #1

9/15/62 through 7/15/63 are the beginning and finishing dates for eligible loggings. All members in the NRE are eligible. Entry fee is 25¢ and must be sent to ERNEST J. WESOLOWSKI, 1416 Pasadena Avenue - Omaha 7, Nebraska before 12/1/62. Two stations from each of the 50 states, D.C., and each province of Canada will be eligible. First station from each state will count one point; second station will count three (3) points; total of FOUR points from each state. Any Domestic DX Program appearing in the DX Calendar will count an additional FIVE points. Final standings will be announced at the 1963 Denver Convention. Veries entered must include: Call letters, Location, Frequency, and Dates heard and verified. Prizes will be awarded to the first THREE winners. Prizes will depend on the number of entrants. There is also a Mystery Station, worth 100 report forms to the first DXer who verifies the Mystery Station. Standings will be listed about every six weeks with the top ten listed monthly. These are about the same rules as last year except for the two new states, Alaska & Hawaii.

CONTEST #2

This Contest is new and quite novel. It is designed to give every DXer regardless of location, an dqual chance to obtain points. State bounderies have no bearing on any phase of this contest; therefore, the location factor has been eliminated and skill alone will determine the winner.

The contest is called LETTERRAMA and the important thing to keep in mind is that the SECOND LETTER of the U.S. call letters and the THIRD LETTER of Canadian call letters are the determining letters. For instance, in WAZY the A is the determining letter; in CKWS W is the determining letter.

The object of the Contest is to build tiers(not tears) and obtain as many points as possible. A tier is completed by obtaining a verification from 26 stations representing each letter of the alphabet (remember to use that second letter in U.S. calls). One must work to complete his first tier by obtaining a U.S. or Canadian verification for each letter of the alphabet. When one completes the first tier, one automatically earns the ten-point bonus, and any verifications that might have been already obtained for the second tier will count, in addition. Remember, K W or C calls can be mixed for each and any tier, such as: for A one might use WAIT; for B, WBECK, for C, KCOL, fo D CKDA, etc. But remember, if a DXer has received verifications from WAKY and WAIT, for example, that person must wait until the first tier has been completed before the other A verification can be counted for the second tier. So, it is easily seen that one stacks up points fast when tiers are completed.

Here are a few simple rules to remember:

- 1- Stations eligible for LETTERRAMA are all stations in any of the 50 states of the U.S. and the Dominion of Canada that are located farther than a distance of 50 miles from the DXer's city or town.
- 2- Each verification used toward building a tier will be worth one point. When one completes a tier (26 points representing each letter of the alphabet) a bonus of ten points is earned. One continues in this manner, earning additional points for each tier worked on or completed. One must, however, complete one tier at a time before points in the next tier will be counted. Bonus points are awarded for any number of tiers completed. There is nolimit on the number of possible points.
- 3- As many or as few stations in any one area may be used. Just be sure each is farther than 50 miles from the center of the contestant's city or town.
- 4- Entry fee is 25¢.
- 5- Loggings must be made between 9/15/62 and 7/15/63. Deadline for reporting points will be 8/15/63. All points to be used in the contest should be in the contest manager's hands by that date.
- 6- Send all entry fees and points to the NRC Contest Manager, Ernest J. Wesolowski, 1416 Pasadena Ave., Omaha 7, Neb. The contest manager reserves the right to make decisions in case of any point of order.
