I would have tried harder for something new had I known the Foreign Contest was scheduled to begin on 9/5 instead of 9/15, but I thought I would hold my best efforts for a week or so & throw them into the Contest. Apparently only the Convention Goers were in the know. Serves me right, I guess - I should DX 100% the year round. Actually, I don't expect to do too well in this year's Foreign Contest because I will have to scratch a great deal for new ones, & I don't particularly want to re-verify old ones.
