This is not at all surprising since sunspots do not really exert as much of an effect on DX CX as some "authorities" seem to think. While it's true I haven't personally BCB DXed through an entire sunspot cycle, I have a large mass of data from Tyndall that will convince even the most rabid "sunspot watcher" that he might as well mot bother. Please no one misinterpret me - I'm not saying recept ion patterns of foreign DX are invariant of sunsport number; it has been well demonstrated that noise levels, critical frequencies, & other parameters are intimately connected w/sunspots. What is clear from the HTT data is any statement that foreign DX won't be quite as good this year as last simply because the average sunspot number has increased by a half dozen is just not valid. All of this wall be set forth at great length at a later date. As I said, DX has been good lately, so good in fact I logged four new countries last week. Country 108 was Jordan-677V; #109 was North Ireland-1340; #110 was F.B.S., Benghazi, Libya-833 (1kw) & #111 was Radio Angola-872. At this rate I'll have 200 by next May, hi. Another catch I'm happy about is KZOO, lkw. in Honoluly on 1210 heard MM; almost positive that station u/KZOO was 250w. Thule, Greenland, but no positive ID. - 540 COLOMBIA. HJKA, R. Horizonte, Bogota. Had a strong signal 10/15 at 1730. Spanish announcer mentioned the city of Bogota several times. There was slight CRM from WDAK. (Ziel, N.Y.)
- 550 CUBA. CMAN, Pinar del Rio. Was well over the jammer that is normally heard here on 10/11. (Ziel, N.Y.)

 Anti U.S. announcements between musical numbers, noted 10/25 0320. (Hathaway, III.) Note correct call and location, Jack. (Ed.)
- 584 AUSTRIA. Vienna. Almost -- but not quite -- overtaking R.N.E., Madrid, at 2343 11/1. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 615 NICARAGUA. YNM, Rdfa. Nacional, Managua. Finally made it here thru semi-local KFRC sideband on 10/22. S/off at ca. 2300. (Freeman, Calif.)
- 630 COMA. CMHG, Santa Clara. Apparently the one very strong with good Latin American music 10/25 at 0322. (Hathaway, Ill.)
- 637.991 CYPRUS/CZECHOSLOVAKIA. B.B.C. Cyprus Relay measured here at 2154 s/cn on 10/23 but still not enough audio for formal log. But we shall oversome. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 640 (MC). Habana. Apparently the one very strong S-9+20, wonderful Latin American music with good audio 10/25 0324. (Hathaway, Ill.) Has a local-like signal practically every night with slight WHLO CRM until the Ohio station s/off. No sign of KFI under CMC. (Ziel, N.Y.)
- 650 LIBERIA. ELBC, Monrovia. Noted again on MM 11/1 around 0130 with good clear ID; WSM TT on 0130;30 killed them. Since EC off DST, can expect holes in WSM's ET sked before 0130; suggest that you work hard on this one before HJKH decides to go AN again. No trace of previously reported unid. EE around 0400 on last two MM's tends to confirm my assumption that that unid. was not a spurious response. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 652 DOM. REP. La Voz de San Isidro, (HIFA, I guess), at this spot again, with clear signal. Heard on 11/3 1740-2200 with IDs. Quite excited at first, thinking I had Spanish Sahara, but not so. (Nangerfield, Pa.)

K.C.B.C., Pyongyang outlet, surely, surged to readability 0359 11/8 with music, annot at 0359: 55 by woman, pips at precisely 0400, then children's chorus to begin musical program with woman annor, but faded out by 0403, and could get no more. No verie from last season. (Callarman, Texas)
- 656 ITALY. R.A.I. Common Wave quite good as early as 1647 on 10/29 with rather lively programming, featuring quite a bit of good Italian Rock and Roll. DF at this time indicated that most of power was coming from the Napoli transmitter. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 663V UNID. T.A. Weak T.A. heard from 1705 to 1730 f/out ors/off is probably Spanish Sahara, but for technical reasons, cannot get high precision DF on this channel. Freq. drifts badly; on 10/31 was on 662.98 at 1705 and up to 663.30 by 1728. There is audio there, but hard to read. May well be the same unid. as reported by DD on 668. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 665 WEST GERMANY. Sudwestfunk stations fairly strong and clear on 11/1 from 2345 to past 0100 on 11/2, but littl loggable material, due to "blah" music and long periods of talking. Must be using 300 kw. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 670 CUBA. CMKP, Holguin. Noted 10/25 at 0325 with Latin American music. (Hathaway, Ill.)
- 676.59 JOHAN. Jerusalem finally formally logged here on 10/28 signing on with musical IS at 2228 (mostly woodwind instrument) and then into Arabic. Faded quickly, but positive ID on language this night. Freq. has been down from 676.95 since night of 10/19; seems to have settled down a bit; much less short-term drift than before. Might send tape of s/on were it not for the fact that I'm humiliated by amount of local WNAC slop that creeps in despite my extreme efforts...! Asian country #8 logged here, andCountry #108. (Nelson)
- 690 MEXICO. XETRA, "Extra News", Tijunna. Now operating from new transmitter location, and claims 5 times more power over Los Angeles, equivalent to 200 kw., so must be directional toward Los Angeles now. Do seem some stronger days; nights seem same here. (Freeman, Calif.)
- 695 <u>DCMINICA.</u> W.I.B.S., Roseau. Best of all the cutlets on 11/4 at 1930, with no sign of the Guatemalan. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 705 ST. VINCENT. W.I.B.S., Kingstown. Weakest outlet at 1930 on 11/4, and always has been. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 707 EGY: T. Cairo II. I presume the station heard here 10/19 from 1827 to 1833 with apparent Arabic programming was this station. Signed off at 1833. Moderate to heavy CRM from WCR, 710 kc. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 720 CURA. In Voz de Cuba, Colon. Noted 10/25 0331 with Latin American music. (Hathaway, Ill.)
- 730 JAPAN. JCK, Nagoya, had classical music parallel to JCK-840, but weaker, at 0345 10/25. (Scrimgeour, Cal.)
- 746 SYRIA. Aleppo. Heard with typical Arabic orchestra and chanting from 1654 to 1707 on 11/1. Under HOLLAND, which was exceptionally good that date. (Robie, Mass.)

- 795 UNID. Griental. Erobably China. This "mystery" U.F.O. faded in withoudio about 0459 11/3. Some time pips at 0500 (not clear). Chinese music, and man talking in Mandarin from 0545-0630. Perhaps ex-790 Peking? I'll keep trying. (Scrimgeour, Calif.) F.B.I.S. shows Shanghai local on this channel, Gray. (Ed.)
- 800 SPAIN. EAJ-7, R. Madrid, now here, ex-809, in wholesale change of frequencies by Spaniards. Rung late into the night. CRM'd by Bonaire. (Blödorn, W. Germany)
- 818 EGYPT. Patra. A regular most evenings around sunset. Usually can be held until 1850 s/off with anthem. (Robié, Mass.)
- 820 UNID. S.S. Noted 10/25 at 0338; probably HJED heard here before. (Hathaway, Ill.) Almost certainly. (Ed.)
- 827 BULGARIA. R. Sofia, heard 10/29 1712-1730. I think they signed off 1730. Program seemed to be in Italian with both man and woman talking, and some music. (RM from another European, probably Spain. (Merriman, Va.)
- 833.3 LIBYA. Forces Broadcasting Station, Denghazi, logged 2347-0013 on 11/4; pretty fair signals at times, but B.B.C. relay audio at 0000 was rather muddy. This is probably not? Poses 10/9 reported unid. on 835. Believe FES s/on 2330, and will check further. This one is everywhere listed at 1 km. Country #110. Very slight LRM from TVI sweep on 834.75, and from unid. L.A. on 834.91. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 835 HIM. This Peking outlet started fading in about 0500 11/3. Clear enough to get translation from Mandarin of snatchesof the program schedule at 0503. Woman announced local news at 2220, rebroadcast of national news at 2300 -- no time zone given; (Peking time = GMT +8, I assume). "Chiang-shi Yung-ming Guang-bo Diang-tai (Kiongis People's Broadcasting Station)" heard, but didn't get context. Don't think it was an ID. Chinese opera broadcast next, singing and talking alternate. Crying is depicted by a wailing-singing combination. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 836 LELANON. Beirut. Heard 11/3 1801-1830 s/off. Good signal over S-8. When the French station signed off, this one completely in the clear. Aragic music for about first 20 minutes, followed by announcement and Western style music. Off very abruptly at 1830, no annot. or anthem. (Merriman, Va.) Heard often after 1800, but lost before 1830. Good signals; much better than at any time last year. (Robie, Mass.)
- 840 ARGENTINA(?)/ERAZIL. LV-4, R. San Rafael, San Rafael. Believed to be the Spanish-speaking station fighting PRH-9, R. Pandeirantes, Sao Paulo, 11/8 0117-0225. Played instrumental music, much of which was similar to that I used to hear on LRA-shortwave, with infrequent but lengthy announcements, one of which contained the phrase "diariamente de la Navidad." Did not seem to be commercial, so may be indication that may hold to late schedule until Christmas. Argentina was mentioned several times, and on one occasion, my tape gives what sounds like "Esta es Radio San Rafael" to start one of the lengthy speeches. I will have to recheck tape before sending the report to determine if broadcast had anything to do with the Chilean-Argentinian border clashes. PRH-9 was dominant, both were weak, and thunderstorm (which later passed directly overhead) made reception difficult. There was no sign of the Spanish-speaker after 0230, with PRH-9 clear. (Callarman)

- 854 FFAIN. EAJ-2, R. Espana, Madrid. In with especially good signal on 10/29 around 1900, to about 1920. And on 10/30 from 1800 to 1900. Sent report, but not optimistic about reply. (Bangerfield, Pa.)

With new equipment, can separate Angola from EAJ-101. Typical Lisbon home service programs until s/off w/choral version of "A Portuguesa." at 2000. Dest heard on 11/5 when Luanda frequently overrode EAJ-101; very unlikely that this is only 10 kw. Must be new 100 kw transmitter. note that has not yet changed freqs! Angola logged as Country #111, and fourth new one this week. (Nelson, Mass.)

(Callarman, Texas)
- 953 CZECHOSLOVAKIA. Drno, through WPEN at 2203 on 11/3. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 955 UNID. Some audio was very faintly noted around 0433 11/8, but could never bring it up to readability. (Callarman, Texas)

- 1295 ST. MAARTEN. PJD-2, Phillipsburg. Almost local quality with well-known canned religious program 1935 on 10/29; still about 75 cps below BPC, which produces a masty audible het at times. (Nelson, Mass.) Heard often but for short periods of time only. Not consistently good, but seems best around mid-evening. (Ben Danger-field isn't the only onehaving trouble getting a verie from this one, hi!)(Robie, Mass.)
- 1313 MINELY. Stavanger heard on 10/18 at 0040, believe sign on at this time. Signal good with news and easily recognizable music. First time heard here. (Merriman, Va.) Snyder: Your according player on 10/18 definitely was Stavanger. I slsc was continuously monitoring this outlet for DF experiment that night. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1340 NO. IRELAND. B.B.C., Lisnagarvey. Me, too! Finally logged 0243 with interview with representative of the noise abatement society; they should do something about 1340, hi! In and out 0200-0247, but only rarely dominated the jumble. Best way to log this one is to sit on 1340 and wait for a very shallow and muddy-sounding audio to fade up; then pop up to 1457 and check for parallel. This one is very rough here due to U.S. clutter. Logged as country number 109; have now heard all EEC outlets on ECB. (Nelson, Mass.) There are, of course, times when the network splits for Northern Ireland Home service, in which case they would not be parallel to 1457. (Ed.)
- 1349 LATVIA/FRANCE. Mostly Riga here at Olli on 10/31 with woman announcer in Slavic tongue, probably Russian; slight audio and much SAH from RTF. Virtually no trace of Nouakchott's Ol30 s/on since Europeans in that late. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1352.7 INTL. WATERS (England). Radic Essex opened on 10/27 with test transmissions. Heard all evening until 1900 EST. Announcing as "Radio Essex, Britain's First Local Commercial Proadcasting Station" on "222 meters medium-wave." Modulation is not perfect, and microphone announcements can hardly be understood. No address given so far, but presumed to operate from Shivering Sands, the fort once used by R. City. (Ryden, Eweden.) Heard testing here on 11/2 1215-1500 EST. "We will commence regular broadcasting shortly, they said. (B18-dorn, W. Germany)
- ALBANIA/WEST GERMANY. Tirana is consistently good around 2330 almost every night; by 0115, tends to be over ridden by Bremen. However, latter tends to give good and clear ID at this time nightly. Remarkably, quite a bit of German Band music heard from Bremen. Will award a medal to anyone who can get Ibadan here now! Power and/or antenna of Tirana must be truly remakable to consistently put in a better signal than that of VOA-Munich! Tirana's music tends to sound "Arabic-isk" at times, which is a good tipoff, usually. Ibadan's music is always heavy an drums and English R&R-not similar to Arabic. (Nelson, Mass.) Tirana's carrier on at 2216 10/11, drowning out East German station. S/on at 2230 and logged until 2300 with strong signals. Program was mostly talking by a man and woman with occasional music. (Holbrook, Md.) Still heard at 2230 s/on. However, not hearly so well as during mid-October. Uses clarinet IS and in Russian language. (Robie, Mass.)
- EAST GERMANY. Berlin. Carrier on at 2155 10/11, with s/on at 2201 and logged until 2216, when the carrier of ALBANIA drowned them out. The German station had a fair to good signal at times. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 1367 PCRTUGAL. CSA-215, Porto. 10/12 from 1806 to 1830, fair to good signals, but heavy WSAY LRM on 1370. CSA-215 had program of light classical selections. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 1370 JAPAN. NHK Synchro. Amazing S-8 level 0317 11/8, classical music, female anner. 0321. (Callarman, Texas)

- 1440 COLOMBIA. HJGM, R. Scgamoso, Sogamoso. I heard it on this freq. 9/8, but only once. Moved?? (Silvera, Jamaica)Shown here WRTH Summer Supplement. (Ed.)
- 1450 COLOMBIA. HJFZ, R. Sintonia, Manizales. Call and location tentative. Manizales is mentioned in most ads. Heard 2327-0012 10/29. Felongs to Todelar network. (Silvera, Jamaica) HJNL, R. Sintonia, Villamaria Cds. listed here in WRTH Summer Supplement. (ed)
- 1457 ENGLAND/RUMANIA(tent.). According to DF, Eartley is first L.E.C. station to throw on OC around 0105 nightly. Unid. audic under Eartley and Clevedon's OC at 0106 on 10/31 is probably Craiova, Rumania, but no positive ID and out before DF. Most consistently readable E.B.C. channel. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1475 AUSTRIA: Wein is consistently good around 0100 nightly. Much classical music. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1480 ILINA JORF, Yokohama, quite good on 11/1 after KWIZ 0303 s/off. (Scrimgenur, Calif.)
- 1500 COLOMBIA. HJLU, noted testing for past four days with music. Only ID given is above call and cites frequency as 1520. Asks for reports to Apt. Aereo 219, Barranquilla, I assume this is one licensed as R. Calima, Darien. (Silvera, Jamatca) HJLC, R. Minuto, Barranquilla, is listed on 1520 kc. R. Calima's call listed as HJLJ. (Ed.)
- 1511 UNID. AFRICAN. Weak West African signing on MM 11/1 at 0028 is probably Niamy, NIGER, but too much 1510 for positive ID. Bears watching. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1516 CHINA(?). Foreign Service in Russian of R. Peking can be heard here with a very strong signal, parallel to shortwaves. I heard it on Nov. 1 1600-1655 EST with (SAH-5, 11/2 1100-1155 EST USE 3-5. I wonder if it is Tirana, Albania? However, it does not have the "relay"-sound, e.g. VOA Relay stations. I couldn't note a single fading with the program, only the transmitter strength. Sounds as if it's coming directly out of the studio in Peking. (Blödorn, W. Germany)
- 1520 AUSTRALIA. 2CN, Deniliquin, N.S.W. heard fairly well 10/25 0410-0445. Older U.S. records, frequent IDs, and a local contest details. I'm happy to get this one. Aussies have been good to me at this end of the dial. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 1529 VATICAN. Vatican City. High in II at 1640 on 10/31; always one of the earliest Europeans to be heard. I assume that Dangerfield's Musing ref. to Vatican on 1520 is typo. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1546 ENGLAND. D.B.C. Noted 10/15 0054-0125. Carrier on 0054 with s/on at 0100. Fairly good to good signals. Heavy CRM from CBE on 1550, but got fairly good log. News followed by classical music. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 1562 UNID. This is probably R. Veronica, but not sure. Heard 11/3 between 1830-1900. Pop music, announcement by woman. Much W.XR splatter. I couldn't tell for sure, but one announcement seemed to be in English. Is Veronica on this late? (Merriman, Va.)
- 1565 ST. LUCIA. W.I.E.S., Castries, heard on 11/3 1843-1905. Weak and fading badly, but definitely identified. Severe CRM from US station and Unid. on 1562. Pleased with this one, as I have been after them for some time. (Merriman, Va.)
- 1570 MEXICO. XERF, Villa Acuna, Coah. with some wild U.S. masic. 10/25. 0305. (Hathaway, Ill.)
- 1580 MEXICO. XEDM, Hermosillo, Son. heard 10/25 at 0302 announcing as "Le Voz del Pacifico." (Hathaway, Ill.)
