Additional clarification to contest rules:

- 1 - For the purpose of this conrest Toronto will be considered the capitol city of Ontario, and (2) Ottawa will be a separate entity, similar to Washington, D.C. However, no bonus points for capitol cities will be awarded to either Ottawa or Washington, D.C.
- 3 - Daytime onky stations heard on EPs will count the station's full poijt value.
- 4 - On the case of different night & day powers, the points will count as follows; 5am to local sunset is considered daytime power; local sunset to 5am night power.
- 5 - DX Specials will count as bonus points only UNLESS the station's actual point value is higher than a previous zntry. This applies only if all three possible entries in the state or province have previously been used. For example, if KWVL-1330 Waterloo, Iowa were to conduct an NRC Special & you had previously entered WHO (three points), KSO (four) and KRNT (four), then KWVL (a two-point station) would count as only five points as their basic value was less than any of the previous entries. This would make your Iowa total 16. If on the other hand you had KSO KRNT & KXEL, then KWVL could replace KXEL & count as seven points (2 plus 5 bonus) making your Iowa total 15 points.

It is with considerable sorrow that the B.E.P.C. must announce that the proposed merger between the NRC and the IRCA has been postponed for an indefinite period. After extensive communication between the members of the merger committee, the NRC representatives agreed unanimously that it would not be in the best interests of the NRC for the proposed merger to take place at this time. This decision was based on several factors. The IRCA is unable at the present time to reach agreement regarding the validity of the recent BOD action to call for a vote on the proposed merger. This is a matter of interpretation of the IRCA Constitution and the matter is far from clear at this time.

In contrast to the favorable reaction of the NRC membership toward the proposed merger, a considerable number of IRCA members are strongly opposed to merger in spite of the unanimous endorsement of the plan by virtually all of the IRCA's elected officers. The opposition group, which calls itself the "Committee to Oppose sub-Merger", has begun investigating possible legal irregularities in the IRCA's part of the merger arrangement. Since the IRCA is incorporated in the state of Colorado, highly complex questions of corporate law are involved. In the event that the IRCA were to attempt to effect merger under the present arrangement, the IRCA group opposing the merger would be able to raise legal questions regarding the IRCA's actions which could tie up both clubs in corporate legal actions for years. The NRC representatives to the merger committee believe that the danger of becoming ensnared in the IRCA's legal problems is too real to risk at this time.

A third unexpected problem is the condition of the IRCA finances. According to the IRCA's published financial report (which appeared in the 10/5 issue of DXM), the IRCA's indebtedness (not including the value of their mimeograph which cannot be sold if IRCA publication is to continue) totals \$836.48, or about \$3.50 per member. We understand that this figure is now somewhat lower but the members of that club would still have to take a very large devaluation in their prorated dues for the merged club in order to eliminate the accumulated debt. This would result in very early expiration dates for IRCA members in the merged club and would work a considerable hardship on their many young members. It should be noted that the NRC is currently in the black and that NRC members would have received more than 100% of their outstanding dues in credit to the new club according to the previously discussed methods for proration.

We wish the IRCA the best of luck in resolving their legal, constitutional, and financial problems, and hope to resume serious discussion regarding possible merger as soon as practical. In keeping with the NRC's spirit of friendly concern for our sister club, we shall continue to make the NRC Domestic Log available to IRCA members at the previously announced rate.

The NRC representatives to the merger committee would like to express their thanks to the NRC membership for its many practical and constructive suggestions about ways that the merged club could best serve the entire MW DX hobby. The attitude of the NRC membership toward the proposed merger with all its benefits for the entire hobby stands as a tribute to the NRC's long tradition of concern for the MW DX hobby.

Looks like a small issue this time; we suspect it'll take a couple of issues for everyone to adjust to the new deadlines. Admiral Nelson's section will resume next week; seems the "n" key broke off his typewriter while he was trying to type a report to the "Ca al Zo e" - Yawn, the DX God, continues his malicious tricks... The publication crew is taking advantage of the small issue to include samples of Walt Roger's report forms and of extra pages of the NRC Log for those who haven't seen what it looks like yet.

BEPC continues to investigate the possibility of producing the NRC bulletin by commercial printers; while the details are not totally worked out, the situation looks very good at the present time. We expect to announce a possible alternative publication system that will offset the present publication workload and forever protect the NRC from future "publication crises". We anticipate no alterations or major changes in format in the foreseeable future.
