Here's some recent DX: MM 5/19- WSFB-1490 Ga. testing @ 12:21am, WGNB-1480 Fla. testing @ 12:15, WMID-1340 unnn heard @ 12:50, WCOP-1150 Mass. weak @ 1:25am, WHSY-1230 Miss. testing from 1:48 to 2am w/good signals, probably KVET-1300 mentioning Austin under strong WMAK @ 2:16, KLIF-1190 Tex. unnn, weak @ 2:25. All foreign DX sent to KDXD. That's about all DX-wise. Not much new on the local radio scene except WFUN-790 has changed format slightly, having ten minutes of NX per hour (:45-:55) in keeping w/the nationwide radio "news-trend." That's all for now so until next time, 73s.

They played EE & SS records, IDing between each w/SID "La Pantera de la Juventud." 4/12- KCOH-1430 Tex. s/off w/SSB @ 7:50pm; KBRZ-1460 Tex. s/off @ 7:45. 4/14- CX were excellent this MM. KCKY-1150 Ariz. 2:10-2:20 w/IRCA DX. Frequent IDs & mentions of test for IRCA by CE; fair signal. Local KTHH-790 ETong @ 2:20; KCAL-770 Minn. NRC/IRCA TEST in L&C 2:35-2:45, NX, ID w/mention of test, followed by classical selection, then hints on how to make a report, giving details of program, RX, type antenna, reception quality; KVET-1300 @ 3:50 past their listed s/off of 1am, called themselves "The Country Giant." WIFE-1310 Ind. heard their ID @ 4:04 between WRR PoP measurements; WRR-1310 ID @ 4:13 announcing PoP tests; XEAI-1320 @ 4:28 ID. A few minutes before I'm almost positive they IDed as "R. Tropical." WNPS-1450 La. in weakly for 5:02 ID. 4/19- KGBC-1540 Tex. s/off @ 2am, no SSB; CBW-990 Winnipeg L&C w/NX & s/off @ 2:15am w/stirring mx I did not recognize, (Oh Canada -ERC) then GSQ, my second Canadian. KSVF-990 NM @ 2:20am w/ID, frequency, power, & announcement of f/c, then TT, very clear w/WNOX looped & KNIN not heard. 1240 Montana test not heard. My list puts KEMY on this frequency & KURL on 730. 4/20- XEVIP-1560 from 8:10 to 8:30pm in EE including CBX NX & SS ID. This has to be more than 250w. I have enjoyed the special articles. I'd like to see articles on: The measurement of frequency and the best devices to use. the Spiral Loop, and the best methods for determining reception CX when beginning a DX session. Adios for now. 73.

FRANK KENNEDY - 20340 Argonaut Drive - Saratoga, California - 95070

Not much DX lately, due to poor CX, six reports out, though. It is interesting to note some of the long-range changes in CX o/the past 12 years. For instance around 1960-3 WLS was always as strong or stronger than WWL, w/excellent skip to the Great Lakes almost every MM, & virtually no skip to SE U.S. (Ga. Fla. etc.) However in more recent years WLS has faded considerably in strength while WWL is now often as strong as KOA KSL etc. Also there is now fairly good skip to the SE (when there is any skip at all). To the West, Japan is not nearly so strong as in 1963-4, whereas Australia & N.Z. are somewhat stronger, & China is somewhat weaker. (In considering these relative strengths one must also consider the generally poor CX at present & make allowances for them). In daytime DX there have been a few changes also. Until the past year 630 was occupied by KIDD & KOH was un audible or very weak on a good RX. Now however KOH is often on top or fighting it out w/KIDD. 73.

- \*\* 725 Guatemala. TGN here 0600 MM 5/26 w/hymn medley incl. "Venid, Fieles Todos" (O come all ye faithful). S/on 0602 as "Emisoras Culturales"; mentioned freq as 730. Had long period of OC before 0600.(Hauser,Co.)
- 760 Chile. CB-76 in nicely again at 0552 MM 5/26 w/AST TC, Chilean nx.(")
- 780 Venezuela. YVOD Ecos del Torbes very good w/tropical mx 0205 5/10 on usual AN pgm; 4YA looped, very slight WBBM QRM. (Wood, Hawaii)
- \*\* 830 Dom. Rep. Editora del Caribe HIJB Santo Domingo is a projected new station. Details later. (César Objío, D.R.)
- 830 Haiti. 4VEC surprisingly good signal 4/21 2030 to 2102 s/off w/hymns in FF and WNYC looped. No sign of 1035 stn at these same times. (Waldron, N.J.) 4VEC first hrd here on this freq 5/12 w/EE lessons for a FF-speaking audience. Signal was good that day, believe CMCA was off. They've been noted only occasionally since. (Bill Brubaker, Miami, Fla.)
- 880 Perú. "Estamos en Radio Unión desde Lima Perú" hrd here at 0015 ID with ads and pop mx. (Objío, D.R.)
- 900 Mexico. XEW was always noted during the week CHML was silent, 0009 to 0127 s/off w/Band anthem. ID and 3-chime tone, mx, nx w/2 men talking hrd appx. 0110. Can't hear them thru CHML when latter on.(Johanns, N.Y.)
- \*\* 922a Colombia. Emisoras Fuentes, HJAE, hrd regularly here, especially late evenings w/nx reports and with a good signal. (Brubaker, Fla.) Listed as 920 even in latest HJ-- list appearing last issue;make change -Ed.
- \*\* 930 Montserrat. The 200 kW Radio Antilles here has CHANGED PROGRAMMING at night from EE to SS. Pop mx in EE and SS. Suspect the response to the EE programs wasn't very good, thus the change to SS. They are now on the air 90 minutes longer than before with s/off at 0000. If some of the northern domestics on 930 s/off at 2300 (midnight local time), maybe they can be hrd the final hour while DST in effect. (Brubaker, Fla.) (Rough on EC w/WPAT, WSOC, WSAZ and CFBC etc. AN here. I'd guess a good Auroral night would be needed to bag this one. Ben D. has 'em verified, I believe the only NE Dxr to have them. So there's hope. -Ed.)
- 950 Mexico. XEGM Tijuana, B.C. 0658 s/on and into SS 5/16. Very good sig; Mex. #32 here. Listed 3000 day, 2500 night, can this be correct power with such small difference? (Wood, Hawaii)
- 970 Mexico. XEDF, Mexico, D.F. at s/off o/WAVE 0257 5/19 giving their call letters. (Dick Truax, Lexington, Ky.)
- 1010 Peru. OAX4U, Radio América, Lima at 0620 5/16 w/Andean mx, interspersed w/spots for Eau de Cologne. Such Indian style mx would probably be played by big-city stns in the mornings only, when most of their audience is Indian; it is played by country stations in Indian-settled areas all day long. A beautiful signal, Peru #2 and my only significant holdout among the IA stations regularly reported from New Zealand. In view of the fine signal, I'm surprised I didn't hear it before.(Wood,Ha)
- 1100 Cuba. CMHU, Radio Ciudad Milagro, Cienfuegos, L.V. 5/18 at 0525 w/full ID as Radio Ciudad Milagro, a new call, I believe; cf. HJH-1600. Fine signal for listed 500 watts but in view of current cx, I believe this power is correct. (Wood, Hawaii)
- 1135 Colombia. HJAC w/TC's each half-hour, native mx and "coocoo-clock" ID, 0137 to 0250 5/19 (Ralph Johanns/Bl0;NY\*)(whose rx only hears"10 and 5" kc/s, hi..ever considered DXing Hi-Fi amplifiers, Ralphie? Hi! -Ed.)
- \*\* 1160 Colombia. HJBL, Ondas de Cienaga Grande has raised power to 5 kW and now being hrd regularly w/good signals. First reception 5/18 and a regular ever since. Consistently s/off at 0002 nightly. (Brubaker, Fla.)

- 1180 Chile. CE-118 new here at 0541 MM 5/26; "en Portales... ¡Levantarse! ¡Arriba! ¡Arriba!" and wake-up music. If getting Chile twice in one morning doesn't wake me up, I don't know what will, hi. (Hauser, Col.)
- 1190 Puerto Rico. WBMJ San Juan w/ID but nothing else heard 2326 4/27 so apparently an ET-OC. (Waldron, New Jersey)
- 1190 Colombia. HJCT La Voz de la Costa w/non-stop mx 2335 to 0002 s/off w/ NA 4/27, clear of WOWO, good signal and QRM from another LA. (Waldron)
- 1200 Costa Rica. Now that DST has arrived, TIQ Radio Casino should easily be heard; nightly s/off at 0101. Many commercials are always noted and they are fairly easy to log, even though the announcer's voice (a British-Caribbean EE accent) is hard to understand. QRM from WOAI and the Cuban. (Bill Brubaker, Miami, Fla.)
- 1200 Venezuela. YVOZ at s/off 2310 5/26, freqs and Venez.NA hrd. Excellent signal and channel seemed clear w/no WOAI. (Paul Kilroy, D.C.)
- 1210- Guatemala. TGED, Radio Cadena 1210, Guatemala. Hrd at 0615 5/25 with request show, Mexican charros. Commercials included one for voting in an upcoming election. When is this? Should provide another fine CA AN MM field day. Very good signal and Guatemala #2 here, maybe a couple hundred Hz on the low side, not as much as 1209.5. (Wood, Hawaii) (I believe we had a list of some election dates for CA about a year ago in DX news, but it would likely be dated by now. Can anyone check? -Ed)
- 1230 Australia. 2NC Newcastle at 0305 5/22 with TC in AEST, best signal this year. (Wood, Hawaii)
- \*\* 1260 Dom. Rep. Radio Vision, Canal Doce-Sesenta, Santo Domingo is a new stn testing, will send details later. (Objío, D.R.)
- 1270 Alaska. KBYR, Anchorage 0630 YL deejay show 5/25, very good indeed. I hadn't expected to get a new Alaskan, and this loud, in late May. This stn is AN Sunday mornings only. (Wood, Hawaii) (Add sked to NRC log-Ed.)
- 1270 Australia. 2SM Sydney at 1030 5/22 with Good Guys show in a completely American style and language, which confused me for a moment as time & bearing were not right for a U.S. station. (Wood, Hawaii) (No wonder we have a balance of payments problem... Australia would never dare export to the U.S. anything of comparable net worth as the "Good Guys" hi hi-)
- 1310 Colombia. La Voz de la Patria, HJAK Barranquilla hrd here MMs w/fair-good signals. For instance, they were hrd 2324 5/25 (Sunday evening EST) altho I usually hear them from 2300 to 0000 EST (MM-EDT). They give frequent TCs and IDs. (Brubaker, Fla.)
- 1326 Costa Rica. TIJGG, Columbia Canal 3, Liberia. 5/11 0615 call-in charity show, probably for Mother's Day. (Wood, Hawaii)
- 1345 Ecuador. HCPB-6, Radio Paz y Bien, Ambato. Hrd 0540 5/29 w/mx, then into religious. Quite good and Country #50 here. (Wood, Hawaii) (Congrats)
- 1460 Cuba. CMCG Radio Marianao at 0510 5/19 w/political talks, good for a 250 watt stn., Cuba #13 here. (Wood, Hawaii)
- 1469a Cuba. CMGE, Radio Ciudad Bandera, Cardenas at 2001 5/24 getting 1470, maybe 500 Hz on low side, hrd every sunset since. (Truax, Ky.)
- 1480 Puerto Rico. WMDD, Fajardo at 0420 5/19 w/tropical mx, PSA's ID only in SS 0428, included patriotic songs with highly political texts, an obvious response to such songs being produced in Cuba. Country #49 here. (Richard Wood, nr Honolulu, Hawaii)
- \*\* 1505 Anguilla. According to the BBC (via Sveriges Radioklubb) Radio Anguilla is operating on this freq. 0500-1200. (Objío, D.R.)
- \*\* 1513 Colombia. HJGX, Radio Progreso, Lorica. Hrd 0500 5/29 w/mx, frequent IDs and correct TC's. (Wood, Hawaii) (Listed 1040 in HJ-- list 5/24DXN)
- 1520 Colombia. HJLQ, Radio Minuto, Barranquilla, at 0445 5/19 o/KYXI. Frequent TC's as "Radio Minuto da la hora" (..gives the correct time), and not "..de la hora" as is shown in WRTVH '69. (Wood, Hawaii)

- 1550 Colombia. HJAX, La Voz Porteña at 2304 5/25, strong w/CBE nulled, w/many IDs and instr mx (tends to confirm KGS in 5/10 MR), stn was NOT operating AN. (Kane, Mass.)

- 870 KAIM, Honolulu. Correcting previous report; s/off now 0505.
- 940 KAHU, Waipahu. SP MMs is now 0400-0900.
- 1090 KHAI, Honolulu. I have no info on the planned format or a possible change in call letters. Reactivation has been delayed.
- 1380 KPOI, Honolulu. Stn has been sold to the owner of KMEN-1290. Change in call letters seems unlikely.
- 1420 KCCN, Honolulu. Stn has just stopped ANing, now has daily 0500 s/off. This will make Noumea, New Caledonia much easier in future. (!) (Yah, it's rough to have heard Noumea only once so far, hi-Ed.)

- 683 SPAIN. Centro Emis. del Sur, Sevilla, sent standard RNE v/q and a pennant, specific, no signer, took appx 150 days. (Kilroy, D.C.)
- 750 COLOMBIA. HJDK Medellin sent v/l on Caracol stationery, only 9 days from reception to verie. V/s Maria Elena Vasquez. A new v/s? (Kilroy)
- 1010 DOMINICAN REP. HIJP, Radio Comercial sent a nice v/l signed by César Objío's friend Luis Cambero Gil, Secretario Correspondencia del Exterior. A big Thank You to César for help on this one. (Merriman, Va.)
- 1550 COLOMBIA. Voz Porteña, HJAX, Barranquilla, Apartado Aéreo 1643 sent card and pennant. I doubt if card can be considered a verification, with no details. Text translates: "Station 'Voz Porteña' has confirmed your report with the Technical Department, which is correct. Thank you for your attention and we pray for your personal prosperity. (signed) Ing. Plutarco E. Barraza D'Olivares, Gerente General." This is on one side of card, and on the other side a small map of Colombia, name, call letters, frequency and address of station. A letter is mailed in order to explain to them the importance of details such as date, time, frequency, etc. (César Objío, D.R.) (Although the exact wording of a reply from a station determines whether that reply constitutes a verification, or merely an acknowledgement of the DXer's report, in the strict sense of the word, I believe virtually every DXer (at least, those in the U.S.) would accept your reply as a valid verification. Even with the date, time etc. missing, the statement, "...has confirmed your report...which is correct." is generally held to be acceptable as verification. This is especially so in the case of the LA stations, which are difficult enough to get any reply at all from. If a station includes all details in the reply, then that is even better. On the other hand, a card saying, "thank you for your recent letter. It is always nice to hear from our listeners." would probably not be considered a verification by most of us. It's up to the individual, of course, how we count verifications.-Ed.)
- Nice v/q and multi-colored pennant received in 7 days from La Voz Porteña, HJAX. Card was not signed but sent by Ing. Plutarco E. Barraza D'Olivares, Gerente General. Affiliated with Radio Corporacion Barraza (offices in N.Y., Bogota and Barranquilla). No power given. QTH Apto Aéreo 1643, Barranquilla. (Brubaker, Florida)

Good to hear from Bill Brubaker after a little absence. I think our reporters this issue are showing there is still DX to be heard, this late in the season. Next Issue Pub. date will be 7/5. Please have all info to Box 2111 by 6/30 for inclusion in the next issue.

Non-Verifiers Bite the Dust, a newsflash from Jerry Starr. The new WAHT-1510, Annville-Cleona, Pa, now has verification cards and will soon be answering all their reports dating back to July of 1968. Card has good, specific text, w/time, date, etc. If they owe you a verie and you don't get a reply within about a month, follow up to Francis Hemler, CE. They began RS on 8/4/68 and have been very busy. The semi-new (8/3/68) CKJD-1250, Sarnia, Ont, is now verifying from Brian Hooper, Eng. Dept. WMAJ-1450, State College, Pa, will now verify from Carl Volz Jr, CE. They saved all reports from the past few years, and you might try a f/up if you don't get a letter in the next month or so. WXVI-1600, ex-WHEW in W. Palm Beach, Fla, will now send v/l from Pamela Ronfeldt, Music Director. Four more down, only a few hundred to go!

The following is most of a personal letter received from Jerry which I believe is of sufficient value to include here.

In the 5/24 DDXD you say, in reference to the WPXY-1550 contribution, "You can be sure the FCC doesn't know, think, or care about it" (pre-sunrise operation by daytimers). Evidently you don't read Broadcasting magazine, hi! (I do, but not regularly; can't afford a subscription, hi. *mk*) Very rare is the week when their "For the Record" section doesn't list a number of stations receiving fines for illegal operation and other violations. The most common is "...failure to observe terms of licenses by operation prior to local sunrise." In this week's issue these stations, each fined \$2000, were WUFE, WJEM, WNGA, and WPPM. Within the past month, these stations

■ KRSD Rapid City, S. D.—FCC rescinded notice of apparent liability for forfeiture of \$2,000 issued for apparent operation with daytime power after time specified in license to change to nighttime power. Action April 2.

■ KFTI Twin Falls, Idaho—FCC notified apparent liability forfeiture of \$1,000 for willfully or repeatedly failing to observe terms of license and rules by operating during pre-sunrise hours with daytime power and without PSA. Action April 9.

■ WAVA Arlington, Va.—FCC ordered to pay forfeiture of \$500 for consistently modulating in excess of 100% on negative peaks. Action Feb. 12.

■ WJSW Maplewood, Minn.—FCC ordered forfeit of \$5,000 for repeated failure to observe terms of license and rules by operating prior to authorized sign-on time.

■ KPOR Quincy, Wash.—FCC notified of apparent liability for forfeiture of \$750 for operating with daytime power before sunrise. Action Feb. 5.

■ WACA Camden, S. C.—FCC ordered payment of \$10,000 forfeiture for repeated unauthorized pre-sunrise operation. Action April 2.

■ WVOZ Carolina, P.R.—FCC notified of apparent liability of \$7,500 for failure to reduce power at sunset, fictitious log entries, over-modulation and failure to log external frequency measurements. Action Feb. 12.

were similarly fined, with citations of violation: WBBK, KSPO, WTTT, KULB, WACA (\$10,000 for multiple offense), KFTI, WJSW (\$5000), KWOF, WNUS, etc. Note sample clippings, above. The FCC does know and care, hi! Beside these types of violations, there are usually a number of fines for others; second most frequent technical fine seems to be for over-modulation, usually running about five grand.

With this as common knowledge, any broadcaster who willfully violates FCC law damn well deserves to have complaints made against them. If, in the future, any reporter to DDXD mentions such illegal operation, I hope you will remind them to send a letter off to the FCC. They must state the time and date which the violation took place and they must sign their name. The FCC is not permitted to divulge these names if requested not to. If the writer seems to be knowledgeable (not a crackpot complaining that the neighbor's radio makes her sterile) the letter will be brought to the attention of the regional office from which inspection teams are dispatched. Of course, you won't get same-day service, but complaints are almost always followed through. I know this to be true; I've seen it happen first hand. I used to work for an over-modulation monster whose CE insisted we'd never get caught...but we got to say "I told you so" when the inspector fined the station, and the CE became quickly unemployed. Mighty is the wrath of the FCC, hi.

Your point is well-taken, Jerry, and I apologize for my over-cynicism. All of us, I might add, would very much like to see the FCC tackle the greatest illegal annoyance for DXers: stations testing without identification. I really wonder if there's anything they can do about that...

There are several errors in Russ Edmunds' NRC Log Updater of last issue -otherwise a fine contribution- which are luckily corrected in the DDXD of the same issue. Talk about same day service!
