IRCA CRITERIA ALLOWS SUCH DEDICATIONS TO BE COUNTED, I BELIEVE. I HAVE NO ARGUMENT WITH THIS PRATICE, BUT UNDER NRC STANDARDS WE CAN'T COUNT 'EM. THE ABOVE BOXSCORE MAY STILL CHANGE SOMEWHAT SINCE WE'RE STILL UNSURE ABOUT THE STATUS OF SEVERAL TESTS WHICH MAY NOT HAVE BEEN Aired.

DX NEWS of 5/24 just arrived, & it gets better with each issue! I just wish I had more time to devote to the hobby. The list of contents on P. 1 is an excellent idea that makes it easy to locate feature articles in back issues. No new DX here. Since last writing v/q from ZBVI has arrived. Rather interesting postcard showing the "Cockle Shop, a department store for the traveller", unsigned, as reported by others, & not very specific, but I do believe the statement "acknowledgement of reception report" used by many of the British possessions is intended to acknowledge that the report is correct - not acknowledge receipt of the report. Anyway, I can't get too worked up over "non-specific" veries. In the old days I used to be a purist who frequently requested a f/up letter from a station for the purpose of clarifying "non-specific" veries, or sent a PP for signature containing details of power, frequency, statement that the report had actually been checked against their log, etc., when veries did not live up to expectations. Most stations so contacted replied obligingly. But now with the advent of tape recording, the "perfect verie" while still desirable, is no longer the best or only proof of reception. My ZBVI v/q for example is backed up w/s clear tape that includes s/off. What better combination? Verie collecting is an important part of our hobby for me as it is for many others, but I consider them primarily as souvenirs & mementoes of exciting catches & unforgettable hours at the dials. A tape of actual reception CX, plus a verie that lists date, frequency, power & other details is about as close as one can come to a complete record of reception in my opinion. Very nice to have met Carlton Lord at QFN's 6/17. He brought back memories of "the good old days". Returning home I took a look in the oldest copy of Radex I happen to have - 9/39, when I first started DXing - & sure enough, there was "With the Station Masters" by Carlton Lord, written in his unique & familiar style. Says how easy the Aussies are to hear and that every DXer should have one of their cards in his collection! When I think of all I passed up in those clear-channel days because of the inexperience of Youth! 73

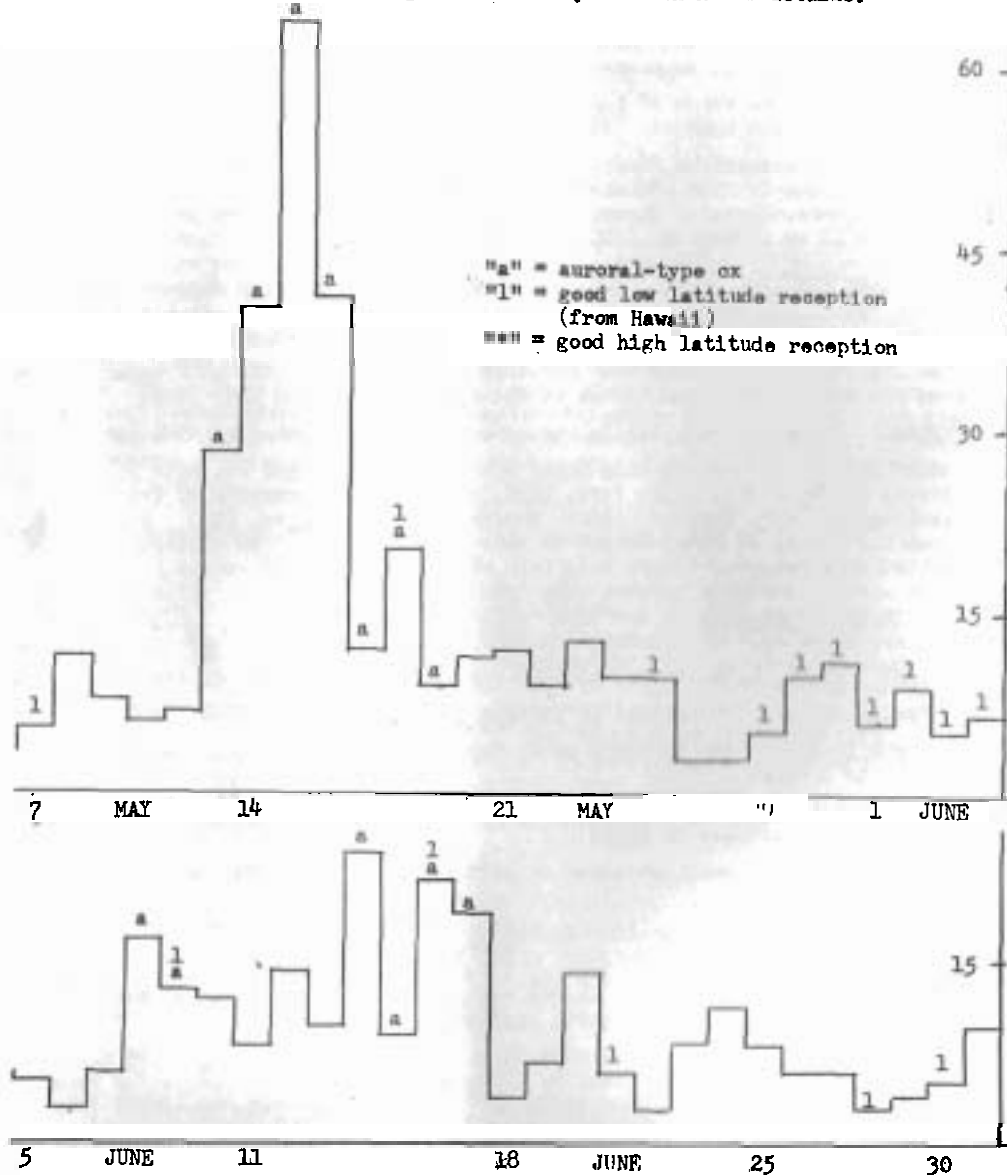
