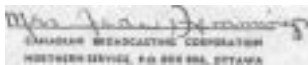

- 164 -FRANCE ORTF Allouis heard 3/9 0400+ w/fair sig thru QRN. Usual FF talk and FF or EE mx format. (Eckman)
- 209 -MOROCCO RTM assumed to be the one w/poor sig 3/9 2307. Local QRN moderate. AA mx and talk was heard. (Eckman)
- 540 -DOMINICAN REPUBLIC Radio ABC, Santo Domingo 3/11 at 0050 w/SID and IA mx.
- 555 -ST KITTS ZIZ Basseterre 3/11 0055 excellent w/"ZIZ Radio Time is 8:55". US mx such as "Frankie and Johnnie". (Brodsky, last 2)
- 580 -PUERTO RICO WKAQ San Juan 3/11 at 2305 end of news. "WKAQ Noticias" SID "WKAQ", R&R mx. (Brodsky)
- 650 -AUSTRALIA 2NU Tamworth, NSW 3/10 only mx heard //660, 820, etc. 1332. (Vernon)
- 660 -AUSTRALIA 2BY Byrock, NSW 3/10 fair 1232+ again //820, 810, 700. (Vernon)
- 700 -JAMAICA Radio One, Montego Bay 3/11 good at tune-in, 1039 w/mx then ad for washing, sponsor given as Colgate-Palmolive Jamaica Ltd., wx then JBC Radio One promos. (Vernon)
- 750 -AUSTRALIA 4QS Toowoomba, Qsld. 3/14 1222-1227 w/BBC comedy show "Dads Army". Mx followed to 1230, went independent of NSW at 1230 w/different mx program.
- 760 -NEW ZEALAND 1YA Auckland, 3/14 this noted 1235-1243 steady and clear o/KFMB and unid rr, presume KGU, w/ballads, etc. TC 1243. Strangly // 720 at 1236 and 1242 when checked, who's that? (Vernon, last 2) 4YZ Invercargill listed on 720 w/20 kw. (ED)
- 810 -AUSTRALIA 2BA Bega, NSW 3/10 weak, then fair 1332+ //660, 820. (Vernon)
- COLOMBIA HJCY Bogota, Radio Sutatenza. Heard 3/10 coming in good. ID at 0207 and also a couple of mentions of Bogota. (Anderson)
- 818 -ANDORRA Sud Radio finally heard 3/8 2350-0000 s/off. Sig fair to good w/TVI and het bothering it someshat. National hymn played at 2359 which came thru quite clearly. (Eckman)
- 820 -AUSTRALIA 2GL Glen Innes, NSW 3/10 very strong again 1333+, seemed to ID at 1350 before religious program. (Vernon)
- 830 -AUSTRALIA 3GI Sale, Victoria, 3/10 this logged 1204+ w/ABC Radio 2 program to 1215, then went //NSW. Local news noted 1305-1310, announcer mentioned joining ?? Melbourne at 1310. (Vernon)
- 840 -AUSTRALIA 4RK Rockhampton, Qsld. 3/10 this logged 1205+, went independent w/presumed Queensland only mx programs 1215+ same 820-830 etc. mx 1300, but local 1305-1310, also Qsld. news 1358 following national news 1355-1358. Noted //1550 khz at 1314. (Vernon)
- CUBA/Unid CMHW Santa Clara, R. Dobleve w/"Dobleve" ID at 2330 3/13. Unid in FF w/man speaking and part of William Tell Overture as sort of an IS over Cuban at 2340. Talk on General Spinola and then fade at 2345. Noted on 3/14 as well but again no clear ID. Believe it is St. Lucia. (Brodsky)
- 1000 -UNID Radio Mil, now which one is it? ID as R. Mil, IA vocal mx. Think it is probably Venezuela since 2 other Venezuelans were noted around that time, 3/16 at 2340. (Brodsky)
- 1020 -VENEZUELA YVRS R. Margarita at 2331 on 3/16. Full ID "Desde Margarita, transmite Radio Margarita, YVRS en 1020 kilociclos". Ads for a local movie and something called "Mucho Mas", SID then faded. (Brodsky)
- 1035 -HAITI 4VEH Cap Haitien, s/off at 0130 on 3/10, coming in fair. During s/off 4VEH mentioned their address and they would like to hear about their reception they would follow up reception reports w/their QSL. (Anderson) //(Brodsky)
- 1110 -VENEZUELA YVQT R. Carupano ID and time at 2320 on 3/16 followed by mention of R. Nacional de Venezuela. No sign of WBT. Carupano sounded like a local.
- 1394 -ALBANIA Tirana heard 2315+ 3/9 w/SS program. Good-excellent strength. S/off at 2326 w/Internationale. (Eckman)

If you're DXing, let us know what you're hearing. There's still good DX to be had.

- 1457 -ALBANIA Tirana heard in unid language w/very good sig 0403-0445 3/15. Internationale at 0425. R. Peking relay s/on at 0429 w/East Is Red IS and into program in unid language. (Eckman)
- 1466 -MONACO Monte-Carlo heard w/excellent signal 0510+. GG religious program ended at 0515. One IS played, then into FF pop mx program. (Eckman)
- 1475 -MALAYSIA-SABAH Kota Kinabalu, 3/9, believe this, w/chimes to 1059, seemed to have a few more notes at the end, than noted in WRTH-74. Good level 1103-1146 o/CJVB-1470 splash w/ballads and generally EE MoR mx, unid language between mx. Tried many times before (over 8 months) but never noted before. (Vernon)
- 1586 -WEST GERMANY WDR Langenburg w/excellent signal 0500+ 3/15 w/GG mx. Several other high band TAs (eg. 1538, 1554, 1562, 1602) also in w/fair-good sigs this AM. (Eckman)

## Spot vacated by radio WVON goes begging

The Chicago AM-radio frequency once operated by WVON but silent for a month has failed to attract any applications from the Federal Communications Commission.

"We've received some inquiries but no applications and frankly, we're a little surprised," said James Faust in the FCC's application division.

The frequency, at 1450 AM, is the first opening in Chicago proper since the 1930s, Faust said. WBEW, at 1570, was granted authorization to operate out of Harvey in 1955, and WCGO, at 1600, was turned on in Chicago Heights in 1959.

The frequency came under the control of the FCC in February, when the former owner, Globetrotter Communications,

failed to find a qualified buyer by the FCC's deadline.

It's unlikely any broadcasting will be heard over 1450 for several years because of the time required by the FCC to settle on an operator that meets its approval.

GLOBETROTTER had to abandon the 1450 frequency when it acquired WNUS-AM at 1390 and WNUS-FM at 107.5, because FCC regulations prohibit one owner from operating two radio stations in the same market.

Globetrotter moved WVON, with its black-oriented programming format, to the stronger frequency at WNUS-AM, but retained the background music programming of WNUS-FM.

Globetrotter planned to sell the 1450 frequency and had set

up a deal with Latino-American Broadcasting Co. for \$1.2 million, but the FCC prohibited the sale on grounds that the Latino group failed to meet certain financial and other conditions.

Globetrotter president George Gillette said he had another buyer lined up for the 1450 spot but couldn't get an extension from the FCC to close the deal, and the frequency went silent and reverted to the FCC.

SINCE THEN, Globetrotter, which says it soon may be facing a "credit crunch," agreed to sell all broadcasting assets, including WVON and WNUS-FM, to Combined Communications Inc., Phoenix-based broadcasting firm, for \$35 million.

## WLTD to switch formats, dump staff

WLTD, THE small suburban radio station that puts most of Chicago's broadcast giants to shame when it comes to creative, meaningful programming, is being transformed into just another ineffectual music outlet.

The hatchet officially falls in mid-May when all WLTD personalities will be let go. Chuck Schaden, Bruce Dumont, Bill Nigut, Ted Weber, Don Lucki, and Mike Schwimmer all have been given notice by Ernie Anastos, the station's new general manager.

Anastos told the air staff the firings and format change are necessary because the station is a chronic money loser. The personalities argue, however, that a proper effort never has been made to sell the station's air time.

"THEY'RE ruining a fine radio station without ever giving it a chance," said one disgruntled staffer.

Anastos reportedly is a partner in a new company that is expected to purchase WLTD from Cummings Communications very soon and change the call letters to WSHR. The daytime station broadcasts on 1,000 watts at 1590 on the AM dial from studios on Lee Street in Evanston.

Lydice is one of many far out WHAM listeners. Tarmo Knotro of Haapavesi, Finland picked up the Rochester station one recent winter night. Ditto for Sam Dellit of Brisbane, Australia, and Robert M. Keelean of Jacksonville, Florida.

In Liverpool, England, Maupin, Oregon, Waverly, Nebraska, Honolulu, Hawaii, Youngstown, Pennsylvania, Fort Worth, Texas, Stockholm Sweden, Winnipeg, Canada AND Ben Franklin Junior High School, Valaparaíso, Indiana, people get Rochester's 50,000 watt station on their AM radios.

And each year they write hundreds of letters to WHAM reporting their hit.

Most are from DX-club members. They belong to clubs sponsored by national science magazines or local radio clubs.

Their hobby is to pick up as many radio stations as possible, the farther away the better. In their letters they describe what they heard while listening, ask for a post card QSL (code for acknowledgment) and sign off with a jaunty "73" (good buy).

They often come from obscure little places where there are few accessible radio stations:

R.R. + Colborne, Ontario  
Gentlemen: I am writing to inform you that WHAM is received loud and clear in this area all the time. (This area is about 10 miles east of Cobourg) . . . I like listening to your "Opinion Program" with Ed Hasbrook."

During the evenings WHAM is the only radio station in the country broadcasting



He sounds so pessimistic, no offense of course. He said that the night's low would be from 0 to 5 below zero. It's the way he said it that bugged me. He sounds like it was the end of the world.

"A few weeks ago we had a snow blizzard. The wind chill factor made it 75 below zero. That was cold. But the weatherman probably didn't mean what he said, so tell him to carry on for me."

The letters are written on post cards, note book paper, mimeograph sheets and the back of a piece of Bronx Community College Alumnae Association stationery.

They are supposed to describe enough of the program to prove the listener really picked up WHAM. At times they are a bit general. A Youngstown, Pa. novice writes:

"I recently began the hobby of Medium-Waver DX-ing. . . I hope you will be able to confirm that you were on the air at 7:00 to 7:40 AM, Jan. 26, 1975.

"I hope you can help me in my hobby by sending some sort of verification in the form of a letter or QSL card.

Violet

"P.S. Yours at 1180

Besides DX-ing, distant listeners have other motives. A husband and wife from Liverpool, N.Y. report their son, a pilot at Columbus Air Force Base in Columbus, Mississippi, listens to WHAM every evening to get the hometown news.

A man from Silver Springs, Maryland listens to Mystery Theater on WHAM. The local station carries the show, he writes, but an hour after WHAM does. Just can't wait.

And finally there are the great masses who get in the way of a WHAM wave by mistake:

Dear Sirs:

Today I picked up WHAM quite clearly on my radio.

I live in Merrick, about 50 miles east of New York City.

Is this a normal occurrence?

The new N.B.C. "National News and Information Service"----H.W.B.

Many of you may not know about the second NBC network expected in service about June 1st.,1975. This new network will in no way curtail operation of the existing NBC network, except for moving "features" to the half hour.

The new network will be available in markets with stations now using the existing NBC network. Such stations will be given first chance to convert to the new network, but it's expected most will not convert. In many cities the station with the new network will be FM, but many AMers will also use it.

Programming of the network itself will be "all news", 24 hours a day- 7 days a week. This will allow many smaller radio stations the opportunity to go all news,almost overnight. Many stations with a telephone talk or news format in smaller markets at present can't operate 24 hours due to the great cost of such operations. However the N.N.I.S. will change that quickly.

Hourly operation of the network is expected to be as follows::

Exact operation will most likely vary some, but the overall operation will be very similar. Special "weekend feeds" on the regular NBC net will allow more local programming to stations on NNIS. This will be between 9AM and noon, and 9 to 10PM each Sunday (ELT).

It's expected that the new network will have over 100 stations when it goes in operation. Network officials expect 50 to 75 of these to be in the "top-100 markets". As mentioned earlier, some stations using this network will be on FM, but many will be on AM. This network offers the smaller station a chance to go 24 hours with a "pro sound".

This article is provided to inform DXers of the new network, and of it's operation. The hourly format listed above should be a much needed help in logging such stations.

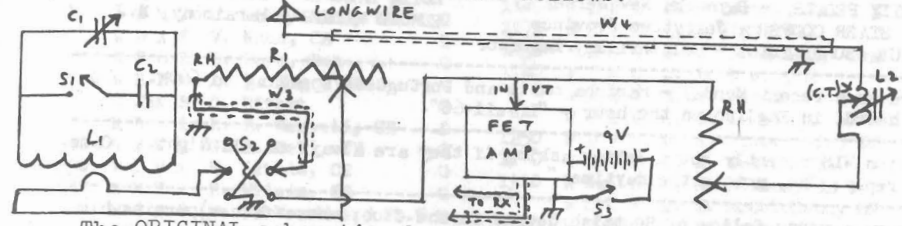

A correction is due on the original LSCA-1 construction plans that appeared in the DX NEWS of 10 March 1975; the schematic diagram under Step 24 does not match the instructions given under Steps 17, 18, and 19. The "correct" schematic follows:



The ORIGINAL schematic, however, will work fine, and may even be superior in performance to the one above. If you wish to reproduce the original, substitute the following steps:

- 17A) Wind the loop secondary with W2, paralleling the third primary winding from the outside. Double back ends around appropriate machine screws at the bottom of A, then bring them into the chassis box via the top corners crossing them behind the amplifier. After drawing the winding tight, tie holding knots where the wires exit from behind the amplifier board. Attach each end to the nearest respective center terminal of switch S2.
- 18A) Use a piece of W3 to connect the center terminal of R1 to one "criss-cross" of S2; connect braid to amplifier ground.
- 19A) Connect the remaining "criss-cross" of S2 with amplifier ground via the W3 braid.

Thanks to Mike Maloney for informing us of this discrepancy.

Re Step 22: The builder may wish to make the connexion to ANY terminal of L2, as the center connexion may not work as well for certain lengths of longwire. Experiment for best results.

According to Mike Maloney, the address for the BAX-1 amplifier kit should be 10 North Lee, Oklahoma City, OK 73102, correcting that given by the NJPC. It runs \$3.75 postage paid.

Mention was given in the plans of the LSCA-2. This will be a future modification of the LSCA-1 based on suggestions of improvement to be submitted by LSCA-1 users. LSCA-2 will be effected by converting an existing LSCA-1.

This graph shows the daily variation in Appr. the Fredericksburg index of geomagnetic/auroral disturbance in the Earth's magnetic field. High values of the A index usually result from a heavy influx of electrically charged particles into the upper atmosphere following certain types of solar disturbances. The severe medium-wave signal absorption produced by one of these events is most intense in higher latitudes and affects high frequency MW signals less than those on lower channels. Values of A above about 20 are inevitably associated with heavy signal absorption along TA and TP paths; very high values (above say 40) are usually accompanied by D and E-region blanketing over North America and Europe; on such a night reception from the south is favored. The maximum absorption for some events may be delayed a few days after the geomagnetic disturbance or may occur immediately. Extended periods of low geomagnetic/auroral activity are necessary but not sufficient to guarantee excellent high latitude reception throughout the MW band; other ionospheric effects such as sporadic E and the winter anomaly may mask what would otherwise be excellent cx following prolonged quiet.
