- 625 -NORTH KOREA Only a carrier 1223 SM 9/7. (Pejza) / (Wilkinson)
- 635 -CHINA Only a carrier 1016 MM 9/8. (Pejza)

645 -CHINA Peking, woman talking in CC 57, 1145 9/13. (Allen)  
 646 -CUBA CMQ Havana, w/KFI off 1019 MM 9/8; mentions of Babaza, mx. (Pejsa)  
 647 -ENGLAND BBC Daventry w/correspondent reporting the daily atrocities in No. Ireland. 100% readable, 0407 9/9. (Schatz)  
 -RSPSR Vladivostok, just caught end of Kremlin bells 1330 MM 9/8, followed by what sounded like JJ. Covered by strong KFI sloop at 1334. (Pejsa)  
 650 -HAWAII KORI Honolulu only Hawaiian heard so far from here, 1143 9/6 w/"The New Edel Rock". (Pejsa)  
 655 -NORTH KOREA Radio Pyongyang male speaker 57, 1128 9/13. (Allen) \* 9/6 1143 w/chorus; YL in EK MM 9/8 1025. (Pejsa)  
 700 -CHINA Un. man talking in CC weak 55, 1214 9/13. (Allen)  
 -JAPAN JO... man in JJ 1140 9/6; also JJ talk 1225 SM 9/7. (Pejsa)  
 735 -NORTH KOREA Only a carrier 1024 MM 9/8. (Pejsa)  
 750 -JAPAN JOIB Sapporo in QSM w/EMW 1147 9/13. (Allen) \* Atop everything at 1156 on 9/5. (Wilkinson)  
 -VENEZUELA YVES Caracas, Radio Caracas must have gone superpower by now, as quite dominant here now, replacing "X". (Schatz) Tis 100 kw. (ED)  
 785 -NORTH KOREA Weakly w/time signals, 55, 1200 9/13. (Allen)  
 810 -COLOMBIA HJCY Bogota, Radio Sutatensa atop another IA at 1043 on 9/1. Very strong at times. 250 kw I believe! (Wilkinson)  
 812 -COLOMBIA HJ on this freq at 1052 on 9/1. Could this be HJEW? Good for about 3 mins. (Wilkinson) HJEW used to be here, but not since HJCY went on the air.  
 817 -EGYPT Al-Mansurah likely the Arab drifting here from 818 and fighting/hetting s/same most 9/11 eve. First noted 0036 9/12 w/AA mx. Not likely Habet, as quite gone past 0430 while 818 was still present. (Schatz)  
 818 -MOROCCO Habet fair w/man in AA 2310, flute mx and walling female 2313, man chanting 2318; this heard 9/9 on car radio at beach in Eastham. (DeIorenzo)  
 -UNID Could only catch some OM talk, but bet from 817 above was too strong to make out language, this 9/11 eve (9/12 GMT). Likely Habet. (Schatz)  
 821 -GUATEMALA TOTO Guatemala City, Radio Internacional here 0443 9/14 ending mx, then "Banco de Guatemala" ad. (Schatz)  
 830 -JAPAN JOIB Osaka no problem here. Best after 1130. (Wilkinson) \* 1137 9/6 man in JJ mixing w/WCCO. (Pejsa)  
 835 -CHINA Manchang, gal in CC 1136 9/6. (Pejsa) \* Women talking in CC, 55, 1149 9/13. (Allen) / (Wilkinson)  
 840 -PANAMA HOLBO Panama City, Radio Libertad o/u HJCY and JOJK at 1122 on 9/5.  
 -SOUTH KOREA HJCY Seoul good sig 57-8 at 1150 9/13. (Allen) \* w/beautiful chimes ID at 1100 on 9/5. JOJK Niigata NHK ID hrd at same time. (Wilkinson)  
 -UNID Possible Aussie or Zedder at 1203 on 8/31. Man in British accent w/news items. Weak sign. Long fades. Will try again next Sunday AM. (Wilkinson)  
 -UNID Gal in language, classical oriental mx 1133 9/6. (Pejsa)  
 844 -GILBERT & ELLICE ISLANDS (Tentative) VSE-1, Tarawa. 9/8, carrier first noted at 0757, inaud out for next hour until WHDS s/on 0900. Generally weak, some audio noted mostly man talking and mx. 54 at best. (Shaftan)  
 845 -ITALY SAI Roma noted 0436 9/9 clear enough for me to catch the Italian. 75% modulation. (Schatz)  
 854 -PERU OXLA Lima, Radio Nacional del Peru good at 1014 on 9/1, and 1040 on 9/5. Must have increased power. (Wilkinson)  
 -SPAIN ENE Murcia w/OM in clear Castilian 0434 9/9. Easily distinguished from Lisa w/LSCA. (Schatz)  
 860 -BRAZIL Radio Mundial, Rio very clear w/pretty pop vocals, man in PP 0754-0807; faded quickly after 0800; had a couple of ads w/sound effects, one EE song; very lively station. (DeIorenzo)  
 865 -CHINA Manchang weakly and faded after 5 min, never heard here before. 1120 on 9/13. (Allen) / (Wilkinson)  
 -UNID Oriental language stn heard here from 1112 to 1116 on 9/5. Good carrier-low modulation-no clues. Perhaps China? Will try again. Anyone else?  
 870 -JAPAN JOGB Hamamoto very strong at 1152 on 9/13. (Allen) \* Made its first appearance atop WWL at 1158 on 9/5. (Wilkinson)  
 -UNID loud oriental w/JOGB while JOGB was giving NHK ID at 1200 on 9/5. S. Vietnam stn w/100/400 kw on this freq. Will try again. (Wilkinson)  
 875 -NORTH KOREA Radio Pyongyang broke through and remained steady earlier at 1103 on 9/5. Good musical program. (Wilkinson)  
 877 -NORTH KOREA Strong 58 signal w/chorus from 1125-1151 on 9/13. (Allen)

 926 -BELGIUM Brussel 0431 9/9 w/ID, fair signal, Juvenil-925 makes this all but impossible here without the LSCA. (Schatz) / (Schatz)  
 1000 -COLOMBIA HJAJ Cartagena, Vos de Cartagena, RCN now 30 kw per station promise. -COLOMBIA HJDP Meiva, Radio Colosal loud, alone 0836, 9/15. Has apparently moved from 1005 (at least temporarily); also mentioned RCN. (DeIorenzo) Did you catch a definite Colosal ID Marc? I would suspect this was HJAJ. (ED)  
 1031 -CUBA Pinar del Rio (Province), Radio Guama, new, noted days weaker than CMAC-1020. Likely CMAS from 1010 khs. (Schatz)  
 1040 -CHINA Radio Peking FS, Shanghai, man in CC 1155 9/13. (Allen) \* In JJ w/YL 1151 9/6. (Pejsa) \* Atop WHD at 1108 on 9/5. (Wilkinson)  
 1085 -HONDURAS Tegucigalpa noted 0533-0557 9/14 w/mostly US soul/rock. Weak to gone signal. Caught it in ad, but no more. (Schatz)  
 1088 -CUBA Camaguey CMJB, CMF relay here from 910 khs, latter now occupied by CMFA, ex-1030. (Schatz)  
 1094 -UNID CA Per GMT-6 TC \*11:45\* at 0544 9/14, "Background" mx. (Schatz)  
 1124 -YUGOSLAVIA Noted by accident 9/6 0327 while tuning down from 1133 which was very good at time. 1124 had same IS and was // to Zagreb at s/on, with almost as good a signal as 1133. Still there at 0352 recheck. (Eckman)  
 \*1165 -ANTIGUA St Johns, "Caribbean Radio Lighthouse" IDed 0131 9/15. Sounds like 1 kw or less. Still another FUD2 type religious station. S/off ca 0210 following devotional. (Schatz) \* Noted by ye ED after getting Hon's report, at 0145 on 9/18 and again around 2345 on 9/19, weak both times and severe WWVA splash, sounded like canned religion in EE. It'll take a good aurora to get a good log on this one. (ED) / (Pejsa)  
 1178 -HUKUHU IS VOA Okinawa, gal in what sounded like JJ, lotsa sloop 1216 9/7.  
 1210 -JAPAN JOOR Osaka, looping toward Japan 1211 SM 9/7, mixing w/CC. (Pejsa)  
 1295 -NICARAGUA Radio Plata, s/off 0500 w/"Radio Plata la de Baitos", then into NA. Caught this ID 9/14 in the middle, so still no city for this one. (Schatz)  
 1376 -FRANCE Lille was probably my previous unid at 0500 9/2. I understand that Lille is now French Culture, not //1554, and has PP sked at 0500. (Eckman)

Saturday, the first formal day of the convention was indeed jammed with activities. We arrived at the ARRL about 2 PM and were met by NRC'er Chris Schenck of Newington who served as our tour guide of the ARRL HQ's and WIAW.

We saw how the ARRL put together its magazine "QST" and their fantastic museum consisting of the earliest items of radio transmissions (spark-gap transmitters, the first tubes, souvenirs of historic firsts-the first Trans-Atlantic Xmission).

Chris then took us over to WIAW and showed us all of the equipment at the station which included a demonstration of Slow-Scan TV. Before we left he contacted a ham in Florida and a short conversation ensued.

Saturday night and things really got rolling. First the banquet where an excellent roast beef meal was served. For dessert we had sherbert ice cream with creme de menthe.

Our guest speaker, Mr. Harold Dorschug (CE-WTIC-1080) entertained the conventioners with his personal experiences in early radio. A highlight of his talk had to be what actually transpired the night that he was in the control booth at the CBS Network when Orson Wells gave his famous "War of the Worlds" program.

Upon completion of the banquet, the convention committee yielded the floor to the NJPC for the annual state of the NRC message and the actual business meeting part of the convention. The NJPC was brief and we were all happy to learn of the healthy status of our club.

A vote was taken on the 1976 Convention site with bids being received from Orlando, Florida and Louisville, Kentucky. Louisville was an almost unanimous choice and the convention will be held during Labor Day Weekend of 1976.

The DX QUIZ was then held with Al Merrimam scoring 136 points out of a possible 150 to take the honors.

The editors of the DX columns announced the recipients of the DX'er of the Year awards for both Foreign and Domestic categories and their names will appear in DX NEWS.

The Annual NRC AUCTION followed with Ron Musco and Frank Dailey acting as auctioneers. In about two hours almost \$250 was realized due to the generosity of the NRC'ers in attendance.

The committee would at this point like to express our appreciation to those NRC'ers who were kind enough to send or deliver items for the auction and to those fine people who submitted the bids that resulted in having a very successful auction.

While this was the end of "formal" activities for the night, festivities continued first in the meeting room and later in private rooms until the wee hours of the morning.

Sunday got off to a slow start (probably because we were all tired). NJPC moderated a lengthy discussion on the subject of getting more DX TESTS on the air. While any discussion of this nature almost always ends in the proverbial "?" it was indeed fruitful and hopefully will inspire those present to be a little more active in the CPC.

As people started departing, friendly good-byes and plans for future get-togethers could be heard. Small gatherings followed while awaiting the supper hour and the departure to the Beverage

Antenna site.

As night fell, a small group of the hearty under Ron Musco's leadership took the short trek to the Trolley Museum where many, many mosquitoes awaited us. Luckily Ron remembered his can of "OFF" and practically saved the day.

We were indeed fortunate Sunday evening as conditions were fairly good. The 1400 foot antenna pulled in signals from at least 15 Latin American countries and some excellent catches were noted. Ron Schatz was heard to say: "Some of these signals are as loud as I hear them in Miami!"

Details of these loggings will appear in IDXD. We also wish to thank Ron for the use of his Collins R-388 receiver.

After the DX-Pedition the 1975 NRC Convention was officially over. Again, farewells and talk of future get-togethers were in order. As in any convention, seeing old friends and making new acquaintances, sharing DX stories and tips, were all highlights of the festival.

To all those who attended, the Connecticut Convention Committee hopes you enjoyed your stay and we want to thank you for coming and for your help in making this convention a success.

To the LADS: Best of Luck for the 1976 NRC Convention in Louisville. You have a lot of hard work in front of you to make the 1976 Convention the success we're sure it will be.

And all your efforts will be rewarded when one DX'er says to you: "Thanks a lot. I really enjoyed myself!"
