Dear Mr. Hartlage:

Effective January 15th we began signing off on Sunday morning instead of Monday morning. The reason for this change is the feeling that people are relying more on our station for information early Monday than on Sunday. Also from time to time, if the situation warrants, we will remain on the air and postpone our maintenance schedule until the following week.

Regarding your inquiry of a pre-sunrise authorization of 500 watts, WAVE has never had such an authorization. At one time we had a pre-sunrise authorization to run at reduced power, approximately 4600 watts, which was later terminated. The FCC at that time offered us a 500 watt pre-sunrise authorization, but we felt we could better serve our coverage area with our present directional pattern.

## TAPE INTERCONNECT - THE RIGHT WAY!

- Don Davis

So you think you've got it made by using a tape recorder in your shack? Well, you're right! But, is it as versatile and as convenient as it could be? Perhaps not. For years I've struggled along with an ailing S-76, and a maze of patch cords to facilitate recording, and then being able to play-back through the vastly superior audio section of the Hallicrafters. This also permits use of the receivers' head phones (which are a necessity for me!) to spot check an ID or other information just taped.

The circuit detailed here, will be directly applicable to all tube-type receivers, being used with either a transistor or tube-type recorder. For use with a transistorized receiver, the value of isolation capacitors C1 & C2 may need to be increased, or eliminated entirely if the low frequency response is not acceptable.

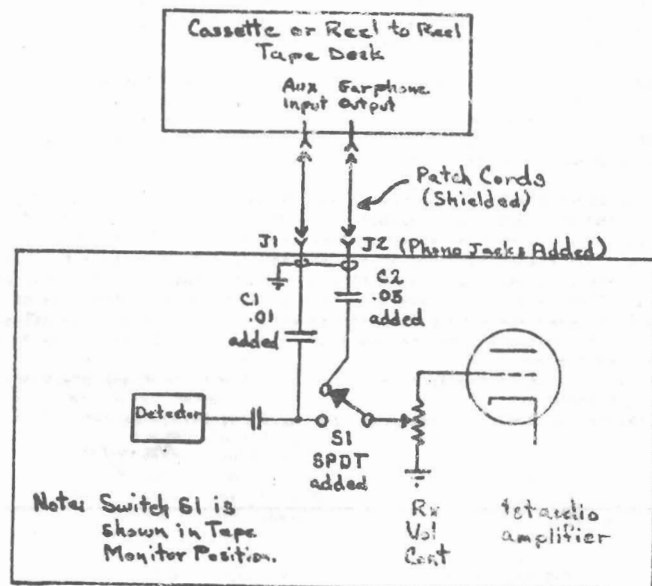
Wiring is straight-forward, and parts values are not critical. I used two chassis-mount "RCA" Phono jacks on my receiver and bought RCA to 3mm patch cords to make the inter-connect between the receiver and tape deck. I disabled the standby switch in the Hallicrafters and installed a SPDT toggle switch in it's place. To this, I ran very short wires to the volume control. Shielded wire should be used on any wires over 2" long, as hum pick-up may become intolerable.

During operation, the receiver will function normally in the "Receiver" position, (The switch is shown in the "Monitor" position on the schematic). If you wish to record the station you're listening to, simply start the tape deck on record, and you're recording. To play back, place switch S1 to the "Monitor" position (as shown in schematic), and start tape deck in play mode.

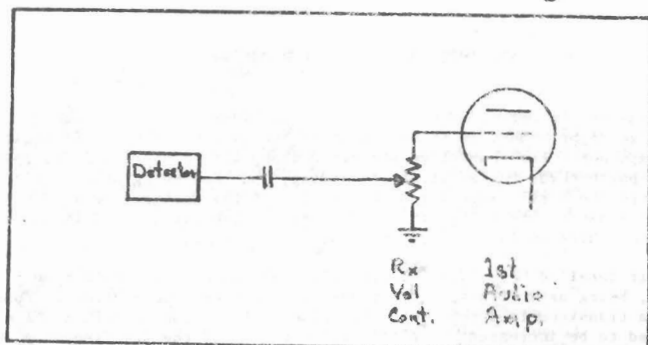
I hope that everyone who uses a tape machine in their DX work will benefit from my experiences, and be able to improve on my primitive method outlined here. What? You don't use a tape recorder.....

January marked my fourth year in NRC & it's time for a re-intro. I started DXing in the early 30's using a Radiola 18, one of the first AC-operated superheterodynes. My best DX in those days was three Japanese stations one cold winter AM. I have never equalled this since! My main interest now is TAS. Most often heard last season were Dakar-764, Portugal-1034 (on SSS), Guinea-1403 & West Germany-1586. Others were heard, but not well enough for radable audio. This season CX have been poor, & only Guinea is consistently heard. I am now using a Drake 2-C ham receiver with home-brewed converters for MW & LW. I also have a counter for PFMs. The PFMs in DX NEWS have been a big help in locating the splits and wanderers. I also collect historical data and need some help. Around 1936 there was a writup in Proceedings of the I.R.E. on the WBER/KFAB-770 synchro operation. Can anyone tell me the title and issue? If CX don't improve I will have to shift my DXing efforts to the Canadians. Don't laugh-they are scarce down here. The DA night pattern book shows why. Their nulls are pointed straight at TEXAS! 73.

On my first daytime patrol since getting my TRF (why does this Muse sound like a commercial for a "certain AM portable from a certain radio company?") on 12/31, I logged only (?) 15 new stations, including WTVN-610 12:30pm weak but audible w/Paul Harvey (good day?), WOI-640 w/Iowa State FB (Peach Bowl, methink) @ 1pm, WLPO-1220 11:45am weak but good in WRC null w/obits, local ads. CADX (Chicago Area DXers) GTG 1/1-2 was interesting. It was hosted by Bob Kramer (IRCA) and his Hammarlund - not a bad receiver really, if you've got the room my "shack" lacks. That's all for now - 73 & C U sometime between next week and next year. (A Muse is a good Muse!)

 big group lately) I am hoping to improve my future situation with a better degree. The DX  
 shack will not move yet as I plan to commute the 40 miles this first term. Now on to a sub-  
 ject I should have written about earlier - the Sony ICF-5900W portable. This RX is one of my  
 favorite all time bargains. I have increasingly become interested in listening regularly to  
 certain SW programs & find the Sony to be an easy one to use and very effective as an SW RX.  
 As the owner of two Hamarilows I prefer to listen to SW on the Sony except during very poor  
 CX or when looking for low-powered DX. On AM the Sony is adequate but not as good as a TRF.  
 On FM, it is very sensitive and selective but does tend to overload in the presence of very  
 strong FM signals (It has never overloaded on AM or SW or produced any images, etc.) I am  
 very reluctant to listen to Perry Ferrell's warning about the ICF-5900W as I have used mine  
 quite strenuously for about four months now (including running it about 18 hours a day during

 as 1630, 1628, & thereabouts. However, my TRF tunes up to 1620 & I hear them around 1615 so  
 so much for an accurate frequency report. The WGOR people are located in Brooklyn, probably  
 on the South Shore & are using two phone numbers which suggest they have someone at the phone  
 company who can hook them up to an unused trunk or whatever those things are called. They use  
 626-9906 and 283-9979 (last four digits give the phone company connection credence). If this  
 sounds familiar it is because the same system was used by WCPR-1620 last year & some of the  
 same guys are involved in WGOR. They use pseudonyms match, but the names Perry Harris, Gary  
 Stevens, Howard Lewis & Larry & Harry Wong (the D.J.'s) & the voices match my tape of WGOR.  
 They call themselves "Free Speech Radio" and "The Pirates of Brooklyn." I called to see if I  
 could get any more info and spoke to Howard Lewis who was very clever at avoiding my questions.  
 He did get into some interesting conversations with the callers who ranged in age from 15 to  
 a grandmother and amazingly the callers were better informed and more articulate than those

 Pa. 5pm s/off & WGSO-1280 La. 2:30am. That brings new stations on the TRF to 41 including  
 one TA (Monte Carlo-1466).

DAVE SCHMIDT - 42 Chelwynne Road - Castle Hills - New Castle, Delaware - 19720  
 I guess it's about time for another report. To DX: 1/14- WLBG-860 5:36-5:45  
 pm. S/off mentions "business station," first time I've ever heard a radio station call it-  
 self that, hi! 1/17, a check for the f/c from WLT-1330 proved successful, w/Dixieland mx  
 being copied 12:15-12:21am, IDed at end. Then w/WFBC, a mention of Tallahassee was noted, &  
 later an ID surfaced for WVCV-1330 on an ET, noted 12:15-12:31am. F/ups have gone to CFBC-  
 930 & WXTT-1490, in care of Jeff Kosnett. Veries: Both v/ls from KBQC-1020 & WJW-850. KBQC  
 mentions over 120 reports for the DX TEST, & Mike Cenditti the CE mentions that he'll answer  
 the reports as soon as work is completed on their new 50kw night array (six towers). I sent  
 the f/up via WCEH. Mike mentioned that he heard the station while he was CE at WRCP a couple

#### MOTHBALL MEMORIES

CHAPTER LXXXI - THERE WAS GREAT DX TO BE HEARD DURING WORLD WAR TWO! READ WHAT NORMAN MAGUIRE  
 HAS TO SAY, "TF (and other) DXING FROM EAST HARTFORD & VICINITY DURING WWII  
 (1944-1946)." DX was excellent during this period. I rented a room from the  
 late Phil and Mrs. Nichols and did my DXing on Phil's HQ-120, using a 60-foot N/S antenna (the  
 necks of two broken beer bottles serving as insulators, hi!) Each AM DX session we would  
 first check for 7BU, Burmie, Tasmania on 660 khz with 50w and WVUW, Espiritu Santo, New Heb-  
 rides on 1045 khz. We would look for other stations of the MOSQUITO NET: WVUR, WVUQ, Guadal-  
 canal, Solomon Is. (690 khz) and WVUS Noumea, New Caledonia (975 khz). On rarer occasions,  
 NQMI Midway (800 khz) would show up. The best DX was WVIF Hollandia, New Guinea (1400) and  
 WVTH at Lae, New Guinea (1415). Both these stations operated with only 50 watts. I failed  
 to heed the late Joe Becker's (former NRC president) advice of "report them when you hear  
 them, - regardless!" I always waited for better reception so I failed to send many reports.  
 Phil reported and verified WVUR, WVIF, WVTH & 7BU. We both reported and verified WVUQ, Guadal-  
 canal. There was always very deep fading on these signals, making long reports or contin-  
 uous copy almost impossible. Some stations seldom IDed. This was the case of the station  
 in Port Moresby, New Guinea on 1010 khz. I heard the station several times, but did not know  
 where to send any report. In those days, we were greatly aided by the FBIS logs, giving loca-  
 tions and powers of the stations. Roger Legge was of great help to us with the latest in-  
 formation. At later stages during this period, both Phil and I acquired brand new HQ-129Y  
 receivers. I had moved a few miles South to Glastonbury, Conn. Other stations that were  
 verified included: KSAI (1010) and Radio Saipan (800), AFRS (790) Canal Zone and WXLQ (1240)  
 Fort Bell, Bermuda, with 50 watts. I heard and reported WYLS (850) Greenland on a DX Special  
 that they never verified. "Can't win 'em all." Note in looking over the NRC bulletin of  
 October 20, 1945, list of U.S. Forces stations, that WYLS was assigned to Eriwetok in the Mar-  
 shall Islands (1320). It is now a familiar call from Canton Island on 1385 khz.

 Newfoundland, with 10,000 U-4, & they s/on circa 4:30 a.m. weekdays. He says also that Radio  
 Cristal-1340, David, Panama, has moved from there to 750 kc/s. So two new ones on 750!

ERNIE COOPER - "The Cape Tip DXer" - 5 Anthony Street - Provincetown, Mass. 02657/617-487-9337  
 Well, another big storm hit us, this one 11" of snow on Fri. 1/20 - don't believe that once famous Post Office motto of "Neither snow nor sleet--" etc. - we had NO mail delivery that day, nor did a truck come in with mail for the next day's delivery, and now, on Monday, we're still one mail day behind in receiving mail. 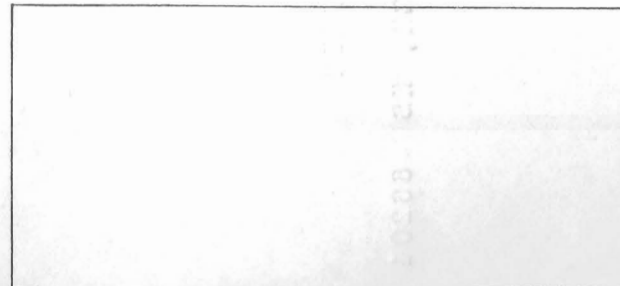
