Noted in passing...

WABA in Aquadilla, PR has been granted permission to build their station at 1000 Watts in place of the 500 watts originally authorized. They'll have to use a directional antenna -- I'm anxious to see its pattern. I doubt they can focus much signal up toward the U.S. due to Gainsville, and Raleigh...we'll see.

WASG wants to change their construction permit in Atmore, Alabama to allow them to transmit with 50,000 Watts during the day up until 2 hours from sunset, then to use 5000 Watts during those "Critical Hours", then reduce to 2500 Watts for night operation...then, of course, to repeat the steps during the "CH" of morning. Oh yes, and they'd use a DA-2 for their trouble too!

Sundry...

During the Annual Convention, I buzzed around to several members to discuss the notation the Club uses for antenna patterns, and various operating hours, etc. Of the four I collared, three preferred my use of official FCC notations, one preferred the NRC abbreviations. In addition, I know that Ernie Cooper prefers the NRC style. So the vote is pretty much split and, since I'm supposed to be the FCC liaison, it appears I should stay with the FCC notation. If I get more mail on this that changes the balance, I'll change over. Let me know what you think. And, just so all is clear, here is the key to the FCC notation:

- DA = Directional Antenna for a daytime-only station.
- DA-1 = " " with same pattern day and night.
- DA-2 = " " different patterns days and nights.
- DA-3 = " " 2 different patterns days, another nights.
- DA-N = " " only at night.
- CH = Critical Hours; 2 hours before sunset, & 2 hours after sunrise.

At the Convention it was generally known that the United States will apparently not be pushing for 9 kHz channel spacing at the upcoming Regional Radio Conference. You should know, however, that the U.S. study of the matter is not over -- and that several South American countries (each of which gets the same one vote that the U.S. does) have said they favor the 9 kHz spacing. Obviously we've all got to use the same spacing...it will be interesting to watch.

Enough for now ... back next month!

NATIONAL RADIO CLUB -

THE FIRST 50

For over a year I have been discussing the forthcoming 50th anniversary of the NRC with several other members. All seem to be in agreement that it will be an ideal time to publish a soft cover book commemorating those great years in the history of both the club and DXing on our beloved great mystical broadcast band.

At the 1901 convention the idea was presented and discussed. The projected book is targeted for completion in time for the 50th anniversary Hartford convention in 1983, 2 full years away. Being that it was my idea, I have volunteered to run the project and function as editor, although I certainly expect that others will volunteer to be co-editors and/or contributors!!!

NRC has successfully published several high quality items over the years, such as the NRC Log, the pattern book, and of course DX NEWS. It should be our goal to publish the book to those high standards, I envision the book to be in 8.5x11 format, high quality paper (agreed in the convention discussion), with a professional quality photograph section, original artwork, and a knockout of a cover. It should be something that the members in the year 2033 A.D. will be hard pressed to surpass for the 100th anniversary!!!

Within our ranks I am sure we have a well of talent that will volunteer those talents to the project. Besides writers, there is a need for someone to do the photograph section, working with whatever aged prints or photos from the DX magazines of the 1930s find their way into the book. Also am looking for people to do original sketches of shack, receivers, stations, & DXers over the years, and someone to come up with an idea for memorable cover artwork.

I hope to get a good response to this article from YOU!!! The next article will incorporate those suggestions received. If you wish a direct reply, please send an S.A.S.E.

To get the ball rolling, I am going to list several IDEAS from others at the convention and myself. Respond with which ones you like or don't like, and with any new ideas of your own.

- 1.) At the 1901 convention, several veteran DXers spoke at the banquet about our hobby's golden years in the 30s. Those speakers were taped. I would like to have taped interviews made with veteran DXers about the 20s, 30s, 40s, and even the 50s. A uniform set of questions and topics could be developed. The resultant tapes would be then edited and collated into a simulated round table discussion. Those interviewed would have the right to read their transcribed words before publication and modify any of their own statements.
- 2.) A near complete set of DX NEWS exists according to Dick Deoper. This is of course a gold mine of information. A lot of research into these should uncover such material. Possible articles for the book could include DDXD and DXD highlights over the years, the best of the traditional "April Fool issues", a history of the conventions, memorable mixings over the years, a republished vol. 1 mail of DX NEWS, some old supremacy ratings and perhaps some long forgotten articles way before the days of the "NRC reprints" service.
- 3.) A photographic section would be great, providing the veteran DXers can come up with enough pics from old conventions, pics of shacks, stations, etc.
- 4.) A history of the band from a technical standpoint: the evolving frequency limits, powers, directional arrays, the days of the V1et top antennae, the en masse frequency shifts over the years, experimental stations, etc.
- 5.) A survey of receivers used over the years by BCD DXers, with illustrations and perhaps comparisons of the performance of the vintage Scotts of legend with today's receivers.

6. A bit of what I call "BOB DX folklore", the now de plusse days of Count de Venise et al, the days of the midnight riders, the story of MUMBA, copies of bizarre and quaint verbe messages, (Hi Rocket Paul ... maybe someone can do an article on the psychological makeup of the kinds of people who can take up such an esoteric hobby as ours.
7. A section of the cartoons related to BOB DX that have run in DX NEWS over the years.
8. DX Hall of Fame: perhaps have a vote for this one, then publish pics and biographical sketches of all those voted in.
9. A short survey of all the other BOB clubs that have existed over the years.
10. A history of all the technical innovations and propagation research done by NRC members and published in DX NEWS.
11. A good sized section would have to be devoted to verbes. The earliest dated one anybody has, EKKO stamps, really prize catches, international verbes, rare and unusual stations, Carroll Seth's poetic verbe messages such as the WPNE QSL card (Carroll Seth was the first and last post laureate of NRC), artistically notable QSLs etc. This section would essentially consist of photo copies.
12. Predictions for the next 50 years.

OK, those are just for starters. A lot of work will have to be done. Comments please, ladies and gentlemen! If you want to be part of the project, let me know what topic you want to work on. NRC is still the classiest radio club of all time. Other clubs have put out special publications - in the past few years, such as the SPEEX utility guide. NRC certainly can rise to the task.

Constructive criticism of the project is welcome, but I don't particularly want to hear from the minuscule minority of misfits in this (and all other) hobby who have a reputation for such hostility and no creativity on their own. Let's make this a positive group effort.

We have advance information for the 1982 NRC Convention. Already the site has been tied down. The 1982 confab will be held at the Admiral Benbow Inn in Louisville, Kentucky on September 3, 4 and 5th. This site is one block East of the 1976 NRC Convention site on Bardstown Rd., just off the I-264 beltway around Louisville and convenient to reach from all directions. In addition, it is adjacent to over 10 different fast food restaurants, one of the largest shopping malls in the state (yes we briars DO have shopping centers) and also a cinema complex housing 8 movie theaters. We also have been blessed (or cursed) with the talents of Ted 'Flywheel' Fleischaker who will conduct the annual NRC Auction with great gusto!! Ted actually blessed us with his appearance at a recent pub session and promised to return often as the season progresses. Work is underway to line up several station tours (different than 1976) as well as a noted speaker (can we outdo the chairman of the FCC who arrived for 1976?)

Stay tuned for more details. Although it is a bit early to make reservations, it is NOT too early to circle those dates for the 1972 NRC Convention in Derby City!!!!!!

Display was implemented with a discrete logic counter and also an interesting chip from old semiconductor for that is mask-programmed to subtract the 455 kHz IF. This neat chip is available in an LCD drive version that would make an excellent display for the TRF or most any other radio for that matter. Next comes a high level vmos (?? -RC) mixer and a synchronous detector; the prospect of the final product being turned loose on the MW band is very enticing. I was sorry to miss the Convention this year but I had been up in that area four times recently and did not have the desire to revisit Northern Jersey. A good bit of the fun in a Convention is going to some new place. Oh well....where will we be next year? Certainly not back in Atlanta, Ga. (Try LOLSVILLE, Chuck -ERC)

HIS BFO WENT BOFFO

It will always be the fate of the Dier to suspect his receiver is not performing as well as it should - that it chronically is afflicted by bugs that prevent hearing some much-wanted station. If the Dier is not well acquainted with technical insight into the receiver and lacks the know-how to run down problems, he is often troubled by those suspicions that bugs are hard at work. Just recently and through sheer dumb luck, I stumbled upon the remedy for poor performance that was becoming troublesome in my HQ-180. Many Diers have this receiver, so I would like to share this experience and perhaps some technically-qualified person would be able to tell me what I did and why it worked. This was a trouble that began by affecting the tone and placement of the BFO oscillator. I had long ago realized that the zero-beat point when the BFO was turned on located itself 1/2 kc below the mid-point of the station's carrier. And when I turned off the BFO, I would routinely turn the vernier tuning control 1/2 kc toward the plus side to center on the signal. I first noticed the BFO whistle didn't sound right any more. Next I discovered that the zero-beat point had shifted 2 kc/s over in the minus direction. Not only that, the BFO whistle existed only on the minus side. If you would zero beat a signal you would find nothing, silence, as you would turn the vernier control over to the plus side. Checking out the HQ-180 manual - learned that a 12AU7 tube, one half of it, controls the BFO. I had another 12AU7, and used it to replace the tube which had some under suspicion. No change. The HQ-180 contains another 12AU7, so I shifted the two tubes in the set. No change at all in the tone and placement of my BFO signal. I looked around for something else to do, and found I had a couple of spare 6AL5 tubes. I pulled the one in the set, put in the spare, and presto, the old HQ-180 and the BFO began functioning just the same as before. Problem fixed. I don't know why it worked, but it did.

I discovered a few new TIS outlets in Canada. The West entrance to Mt. Revelstoke National Park, BC, has 1230-FP and 1490-EE outlets. Banff National Park, Alberta, now has two locations for its 1230-FP and 1490-EE Tizzies: near Banff townsite, and at the East park entrance. Both 1230's announce CBPG calls, both 1490's are CBPH, even though the messages are totally different. The East gate messages are brief, about one minute long, so are repeated several times between IDs. A bandscan from our campground near Banff, on our seven-band J.E. 7-2963A portable. Thursday 7/31 12:50-1:15pm EDT good signals from Calgary 50kwers CHQR-810, CFAC-960, CBR-1010, CFCH-1060, CKXL-1140, also good sigs from local CBC LPRT-860, TIS-FP-1230 & TIS-EE-1490 (townsite XRA). CJDV-910 & CHRB-1280, 10kw in Calgary suburbs, had moderate signals & 630-630 Edmonton was poor. Barely audible was CKKA-570, the only non-Alberta heard daytime, & CKLA-580 Edmonton. By comparison, the only AM audible at Lake Louise was from the 50kw Calgary outlets with fair-to-poor signals. And at the East entrance to Glacier National Park BC, where we camped Mon. 7/27, there were absolutely no AM signals of any kind during daytime hours! The most severe "radio desert" I've encountered yet! No FM there, either! At least Banff and Lake Louise had local FM repeaters of CJAY-92.1, & Banff had an FM CBC LPRT, too. One more Canadian TIS note: upon arrival at Waterton Lakes National Park, AB, we found no trace of any TIS (on Sunday afternoon of a major Canadian holiday weekend) and no written references of any TIS, either. THE OLD LAZY-SLEAZER/BF-2900/CIGAR BOX/SK-2 TRICE

The possibility of directive reception, with the ability to actually null out unwanted stations has intrigued me since I came over to BCH from the SW hobby in the Spring of this year. When my SK-2 arrived, I spent several days just experimenting with it on various portable and communications receivers. To make a long story short, the very best performance of the SK-2 was achieved when it was mounted 7 or 8 inches above and in line with the BF-2900. This means that this arrangement was far better than when it was used with a communications-type RX which had an internal loopstick. It obviously has something to do with the SK-2 & the ferrite loop of the portable RX working together! Since the BF-2900 has a flat top, and the loop is inside the RX, (remember when above it, in a hands) the mounting of the whole affair was quite simple. The SK-2 top section was removed, a piece of a cigar box stop the SK-2, cigar box & it can be held together so that the whole mess doesn't come tumbling down, by a length of elastic from handle to handle of the RX, looped over the top of the SK-2. All of this sits atop a large Babcock's easy burner, which is rotated at the touch of a finger. I took the unit apart and liberally applied graphite powder to act as a lubricant and spread it. Oil is a no-no, as I found out with a previous model. An external speaker is almost a necessity, &

(Neal Perdue, con'd.) plenty of room must be left on the table to allow for the trailing wire to be free to move as you rotate the RX for directivity. I tied the speaker cable and the AC cord together so that they would trail as one. A final note, as I approach 30, is that I have also used this arrangement without the lazy susan, as a macrame-type hanger from a low overhead suspension, with the bottom of the RX an inch above the table top. Modifications would permit the use of the M-2 above a BX with a handle on top. A wooden frame to fit over the handle would be required.
