## Announcers seize radio station to protest changes

Three WDBO-FM radio broadcasters took their station hostage for more than three hours Tuesday night in protest of a switch from an easy listening format to a country music format that would leave them out of jobs.

Denying the move was a publicity stunt to advertise the format switch, general manager Robert Longwell said the first he heard of the takeover was over sister station WDBO-AM while he was stuck in traffic at the Altamonte Mall.

About 8:15 p.m., announcers Gary Schaffer, 41, and Ron Kocher, 23, locked themselves in the WDBO-FM control booth and told the radio audience they had taken it over in protest of a change to contemporary country music scheduled for January. The announcers urged listeners to call the station to complain about the switch.

Three hours and 20 minutes later, the station management and the announcers, who had been joined by broadcaster Lon Wagner, 33, worked out an agreement. The announcers, who at 7 p.m. said there was no solution to their protest, decided to end their takeover in exchange for two extra weeks' severance pay, letters of recommendation and management's promise not to blackball them in the industry.

Schaffer said the four men who work at the FM station were hired in September. Schaffer said he found out Tuesday that he no longer would have a job in January.

Katz Broadcasting bought the sister stations last summer. After a study by a group that does polls for major networks, the company, which has headquarters in Bridgeport, Conn., decided to change from "beautiful music" to "contemporary country" to gain a larger share of radio advertising money. Longwell said the station will concentrate on contemporary country music, such as work by Kenny Rogers and Crystal Gayle. The new call letters will be K92-FM.

"We're just frustrated," Schaffer said. "Nobody meant to treat us badly. The Christmas party was kind of weird. The new country people were there and then here we were."

Morton Downey Jr., host of WDBO-AM's Nightline talk show, fielded calls from listeners as he took on the role of mediator between the FM announcers and the new management, led by Longwell.

"People are entitled to think exactly what they think," Downey said when asked if he thought the protest was a publicity stunt. "Being in this business, I guess I'd think the same thing. All I can tell you is it seems to be sincere." During the protest, the three announcers played easy-listening music and continued to air scheduled commercials. They occasionally played a country song to "jolt the audience" with the sort of music the station will be airing next month.

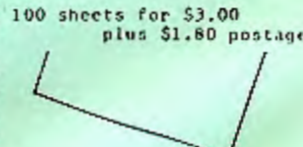
The three threatened to erase taped commercial spots if any attempt were made to evict them.

Downey said the three could have been charged with violating Federal Communications Commission regulations against taking over a radio station, but only if management filed a complaint. He said the threat of the complaint kept the three from destroying the tapes and forced them to air scheduled advertisements. A station official it would have cost \$60,000 and taken a month to replace the tapes they threatened to erase.

Longwell, in turning the negotiations over to Downey, said he was "very hurt. We've tried to handle this very professionally."

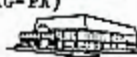

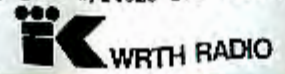

## Springfield Site Eyed For Radio Station

At least seven companies have applied to the Federal Communications Commission to open a radio station at 840 on the AM

radio band, two of which would locate the station near Industrial Drive in Springfield. Other possible locations for the station include Old Burke, Springfield, Annandale, Earlysville, Va., Purcellville, Va., and Denton, Md.

The first company to apply for the Springfield site was the Annandale Pan American Broadcasting Company, whose owner Robert Price "discovered" the available frequency. If Price's company is awarded the frequency, the transmitting tower will be built a little less than a mile north of the intersection of I-96 and the Bellway. Price, who also owns stations in Indiana and Florida, says his station would concentrate on service to the Annandale community and include programming such as high school basketball games.



Asian American Communications, Inc., which is operated by Vietnamese immigrants, has also submitted an application to build in Springfield on the same location as Price. Corporation president Nguyen Ngoc Phuc, a Springfield resident,

says if his corporation gets the frequency they will open a station which serves the Vietnamese community and other Asian minorities, as well as the Annandale community at large. The Asian American Communications' station would emphasize community news and news from Vietnam, and would include programs aimed at women, children, and ethnic and religious interests.

A Spanish-language broadcasting company, called the Archilla-Marcosol Spanish Radio Company, has also submitted an application for the frequency and plans to build its station in Annandale.

E-Z Communications, Inc., owners of WEZL-FM, has applied for the 840 AM frequency and, if chosen, plans to operate the station from its current location on Ox Road in Burke. According to executive vice-president and general manager Alan Box, E-Z would not have to acquire more land or build a new transmitting tower for the new station, but the AM station would operate separately from the existing "easy listening" FM station.

According to Charles Kelly, Chief of the FCC's Mass Media Enforcement Division, it could be two or three years before an administrative law judge chooses between applicants vying for the new frequency. Kelly said corporations are favored if they don't own other media stations, if they represent minorities, if owners plan to work at the station and if the proposed station will serve a large number of people.

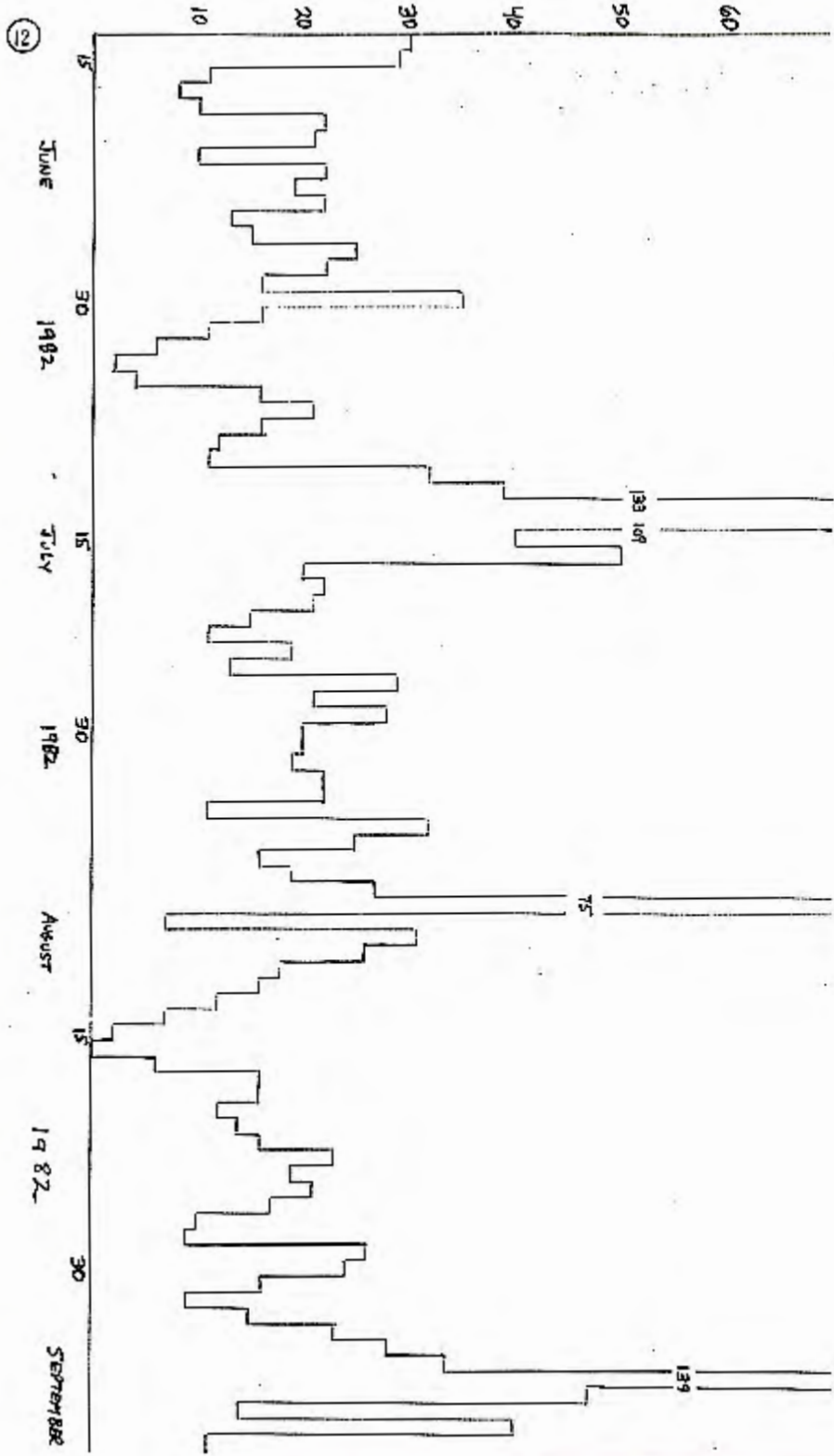

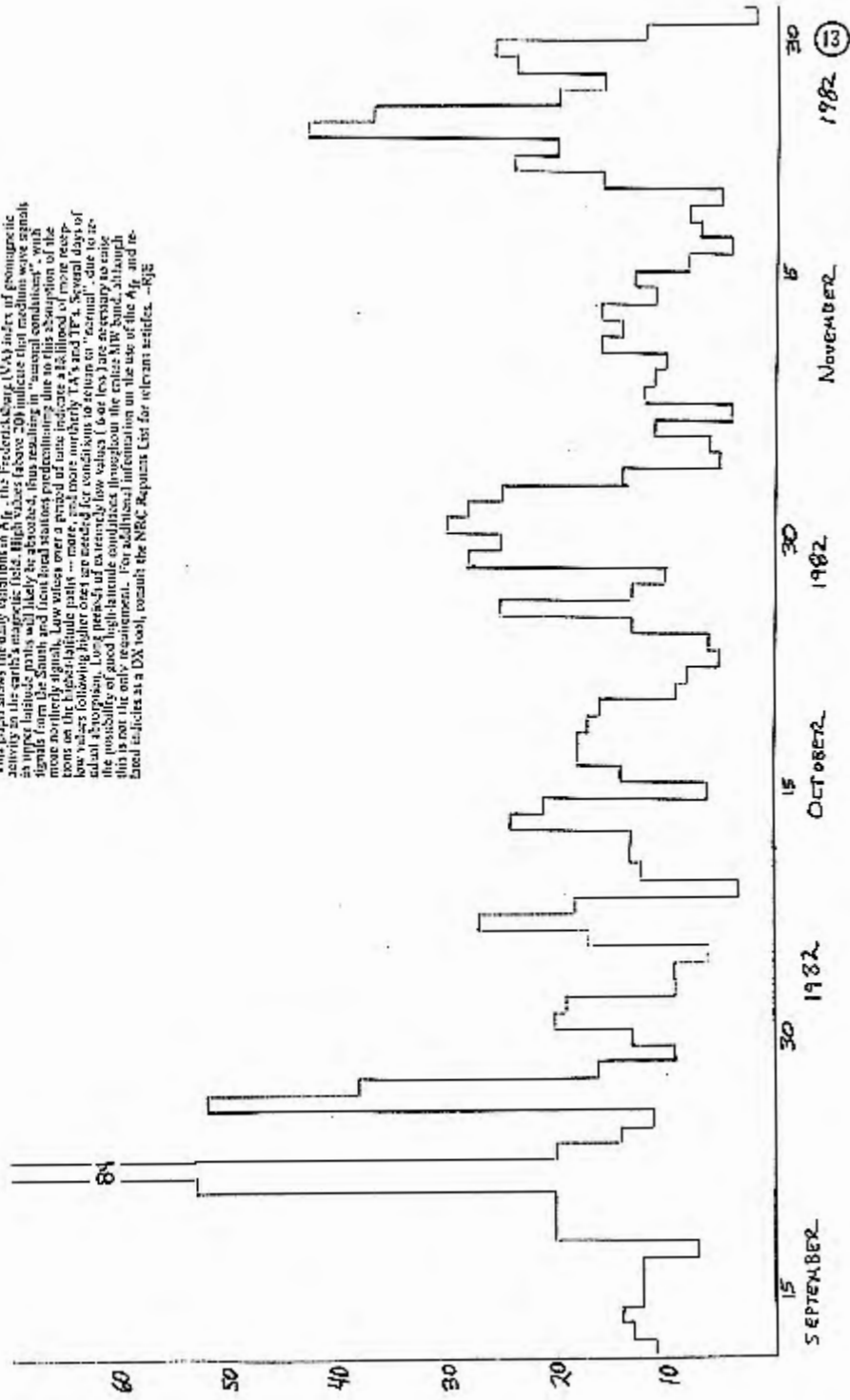

This graph shows the daily variations in  $A_{\text{up}}$ , the Fredericksburg (VA) index of geomagnetic activity in the earth's upper latitude path. Values above 20 indicate that medium wave signals from the South and local short wave stations are being received in "seasonal conditions", with more northerly signals. Low values over a period of time indicate a high level of geomagnetic storms on the lower-latitude path -- more, and more northerly T<sub>1</sub>'s and T<sub>2</sub>'s. Storms (deep low values following higher ones) are more frequent for conditions to return to "normal", due to the usual 27-day period of high-latitude disturbances. Low values (6 or less) are necessary to enable this procedure of equipment. For additional information on the use of the  $A_{\text{up}}$  and related indices see DX book, consult the NRC Request List for relevant indices. --RJE

## «A DX'ER'S TRAVELOGUE»

A receiver has been introduced by Kahn that will pick up AM stereo signals using the Kahn system (WNBC, WBT, KRJA, WBY, WFIL, WFS, et al). I'm going to try to get some more information on this. And that should just about take care of everything from this end for now; more as it hits the wire! 73's.

This has been wanted here for years. 6:20 WPMW-730 Madisonville KY "America's MX radio", in weaker than Vanceleve, heard previously. 6:30 pm WUCR-860 Sparta TN s/off, fair, just caught ID. RAYMOND J. NEMEG - 142 1/2 Hawthorn Drive - Naperville, IL 60540 (pm 2-19, r 2-22)  
I am looking for help from the readers of Musings. I enjoy reading the history of stations whenever they appear in DX News. There are two stations in Illinois I would like to know more about and I am sure someone, that is, one of our members must have some information about WCAZ, Carthage, and WTAD, Quincy. I have some old radio magazines and the more I look at them the more I get confused. WCAZ claims to have gone on the air in 1921 or 1922. WTAD sets its date at July 25, 1925. I found in a 1923 magazine that the WCAZ call letters were deleted in July 1923. I have a station listing, supposedly correct to May 20, 1923, and the station is not listed. CITIZENS RADIO CALL BOOK, Fall 1925, lists WCAZ, owned by Carthage College, and WTAD, owned by Robert E. Compton, both operating in Carthage. In 1926, issues of RADIO DIGEST, only WTAD, owned by Compton, in Carthage, is listed. The Nov. 1927 issue of Citizens' RCB has WCAZ owned by Carthage College in Carthage, and WTAD, owned by the IL Stock Medicine Corp., operating in Quincy. My next issue of Citizens' is January 1930 and owners and locations remain the same. By March 1931 WCAZ is listed as being owned by Superior Broadcasting (which was actually Robert E. Compton). I once talked to the son-in-law of the late Robert Compton and he could shed no light. My guess is that WCAZ was started by Carthage College somewhere around late 1921 or early 1922. It probably only operated during the school year, and then with somewhat irregular schedule. The 1923 call deletion was probably followed with a request for the call to be reinstated. The call and station, in some form, apparently, fell into the hands of Robert Compton around 1930. He operated it until his death, sometime in the '50's. His wife took over and operated the station until 1978 when it was sold. Compton was an engineer and may have built or helped build the station at the College. Incidentally, Carthage College has since moved to Kenosha, WI, which even adds to the confusion. As for WTAD, I feel this may have been Compton's first station, in 1925. The big question I have is when WTAD moved to Quincy, had it been sold by Compton to Quincy interests, or was he party to the move? Somewhere, somehow, there must be someone who knows the story of WCAZ and WTAD. (Try a letter-to-the-editor to the local papers, Ray. You'd be surprised at the number of those still living who can remember the most exact details -pls)

HANK HOLEROOK - 7211 Chestnut Street - Chevy Chase, MD 20815 (pm 2-19, rec'd 2-22)  
Since my last Musings typed late in '82 I've netted 15 new stations to the log here, but I think I will hold off on reporting these until the "next time." As we scan the BCB today we find more and more stations across the dial are bringing back the BIG BAND sound. Some of you guys who came along in the rock era are like Dave Schmidt who referred in the Jan. 24 issue that WSAY Salem, VA was heard with "corny" Big Band mx. Well, it may have been corny but all these stations that are returning to the Big Band format sound pretty good to this listener because they bring back to AM the sound heard when I started BCB DX'ing in 1946. NOW, IF WE COULD ONLY BRING BACK THE RECEPTION OF THOSE GOOD OLD DAYS AS WELL, WE'D HAVE IT MADE! Here in the east one had a good crack at the Pacific area. Yes, there were 24-hour stations then but one could usually find some clear channels during the week and on Sunday and Monday AM's there were quite a few open channels. And the channels that were not open were blocked perhaps by a station or two still allowing DX specialists to break through. Much too many NSP stations these days. Probably 20 years since I have heard a Pacific Coaster here and yet I have in my log QSL'ed stations (we QSL'ed our stations in those days - no heard logs nor tapes) as follows - 66 from California, 10 in Oregon, 25 from Washington. Arizona used to boom in with 18 QSL'ed. We have 24 in Colorado and 9 in Utah and so on. Many graveyard stations QSL'ed in those states. One of my favorites has to be KKIN Visalia, CA 1400, 250 w. which states in part, "Your report is the first received here from the East Coast." Another one I have to like is XEAA Mexicali, B. C. QSL'ed on 1340 kcs, 250 w for reception 5-24-52. That station frequently heard on Monday AM's with a Zenith Trans-Oceanic Portable and wave magnet antenna (that was a dandy receiver). Pushing further west we managed to QSL 27 in Australia, 11 Hawaii, 10 New Zealand, 1 Fiji IS. (VH 030 kcs - a beautiful QSL card), and one of my favorites, my only one from Alaska (KPAR at Fairbanks, 660 kcs, 10 kw); Best heard was from Australia - SPI Crystal Brook 1040 kcs, 2 kw (most distant here on BCB at over 10,000 miles) and another varse I like is from 2LT at Lithgow 1370 kcs, only 500 watts. We also have 174 from Europe/Africa and 94 in South America but it's the Pacific DX which is now non-existent. Yes, maybe some of you think the big band sound is corny but the reception sure WASN'T! (Thanks, Hank. And now ... how about some more trips down memory lane during NRC's 50th anniversary? -pls)

20 SIDNEY E. MARSHALL - 7224 Pam Drive - Millington, TN 38053 (pm 2-20; rec'd 2-23)

While my work schedule has kept me pretty busy over the past 3 weeks, I have managed to get scattered time at the dial and have logged 7 new ones which brings my station total up to 1,094 heard. The month of January ended on a bright note as on 1-31 WKYK-940, NC was in fair several times between 1:31 am and 1:55 am with their test. An SS station was giving much interference but I managed to catch several ID's tones, mx, TC (1:44 am) and most of a telephone number given. On 2-3 at 7:15 pm I caught the s/off announcement of KFRD-980, TX with mention of their FM outlet. PHILLIPS - 9603 Trailview Drive - Dallas, TX 75238 (214) 348-9055 (pm 2-18; rec'd 2-23) My interest in the NRC is primarily in obtaining information on equipment, and, for that reason, I would appreciate hearing from any members who can give me some specific guidance on the following problems: 1. How can the selectivity of the ICF-2001 be improved? It is abysmal (particularly on short wave) on this otherwise interesting receiver. 2. How can the A. V. C. on the RP-2200 be switchably disabled? 3. What are the solid state substitutions (particularly for the power supply regulator) for the corresponding tube circuits in the R-390 series? I understand that PET circuits have been developed for the signal path which can be assembled into appropriate tube size containers and simply plugged into the tube sockets. Some of these may be commercially available. Any costs incurred by those members helping me out on these projects (postage, photocopying, etc.) would be gladly reimbursed. In the meantime, best regards and good listening to all.

GENE MARTIN - 3303 East Evans Avenue - Denver, CO 80210 (pm 2-22; rec'd 2-24) For my money, the most refreshing entertainment currently on the air is a two-hour program each Saturday evening named "The Prairie Home Companion." It is carried nationwide on National Public Radio originating in St. Paul, MN. The music tends to be a strange variety of folk music, guitar, and banjo pickers, but no one listens to this program for the music. Instead, they listen for the comments and the fictitious commercials offered by Emcees Garrison Kellor and his weekly report on what is going on in Lake Wobegone, MN. This down-home feature, usually running 8-10 minutes, comes about ten minutes into the second hour of the program. Lake Wobegone is also fictitious, supposed to be Kellor's home town. Kellor has supplied it with features and characters that the more reference to them is good for a laugh. On Main Street, there is a statue of the Unknown Norwegian, and the "Sons of Knut" is a local fraternal order. The fictitious commercials in the show are for Lake Wobegone sponsors. There is "Ralph's Pretty Good Grocery", where if you can't find what you want, you probably didn't need it anyway. There is "Bob's Bank" which a Borrower Nor Lender Be." "Bob's Bank" transfers operations to San Diego when the Minnesota winter comes. Perhaps the major sponsor is "Powder Milk Blacuits", made from wheat grown by Norwegian bachelor farmers, blacuits so good they give you the strength to get up and do what needs to be done. Kellor's ingenuity, his puckish sense of humor, remind me of Will Rogers. He is getting to be a sensation on college campuses, packing them in like a Rolling Stones concert. The Prairie Home Companion, for me, is a weekly reminder of how far commercial radio has strayed from the full potential of the medium. (Amen! -pls)

DALLAS LANKFORD - 903 Sherwood Drive - Ruston LA 71270 (pm 2-22; rec'd 2-25) As we all know, many BCB DX'ers, especially those who DX foreign splits, continue to use older tube receivers. The reason is quite simple. Few recent receivers equal or exceed the BCB performance of an HQ-180A or R390A, and those that do (such as the Drake R7A) are many times more costly. Flashing LED readouts, solid state reliability, and small size and weight are undoubtedly attractive features, but they don't have anything to do with diggin out weak foreign BCB DX on split frequencies. Selectivity and dynamic range are the primary prerequisites for a good BCB DX receiver. A recent article in the

(Lankford, continued) January, 1983 issue of QST emphasizes yet another serious potential limitation of some of the next generation of receivers (R-2000, IC-R70, NRD-515) which are currently coming into general use: synthesizer noise. An oscillator produces not only the signal that converts a desired signal to an intermediate frequency, but also noise side bands that mix with undesired signals in the front end and produce noise at the intermediate frequency which can cover weak DX. I do not know whether synthesizer noise is a significant problem with any of the synthesized receivers which have recently been introduced, and making accurate measurements of synthesizer noise is probably beyond the capabilities of most DX'ers. But it should be routine for users of synthesized receivers to make qualitative determinations of synthesizer noise by comparing these with receivers in side-by-side listening tests with an HQ-180A or R-390A on weak splits. If a synthesized receiver will not dig out the same weak splits as an HQ-180A or R-390A, then excessive synthesizer noise would be a possible cause. Comparisons might also be made for weak daytime domestics adjacent to strong domestics. I am sure that many of us in the NRC would like to read of such comparisons by users of synthesized receivers.

ERNEST COOPER - 5 Anthony Street - Provincetown, MA - 02657 (617) 487-9337 (pm 2-22; rec'd 2-25) I see that Union City application for 1030 kc/s in Union City, Tennessee - but to those who wondered about Union City, NJ applying for 1030 with WINS on 1010 and WINS in not-too-distant NYC it really isn't that outlandish either, for both WINS and WHN beam away from that area and neither is very strong in the Union City, NJ area. A Union City, NJ permit with directional antennae away from NYC would, in my opinion, be feasible. To DX: Tue. 2-8 UNID TT on 1590 u/WASY @ 1:08 am. "H. Popular" breaking thru on 950; that's HIO in Santo Domingo, apparently now an AM'er, heard @ 1:31 am. Wed. 2-9: WPEA-1370 was off today and 1370 belonged to HJBO, "R. Piloto" in Barranquilla. Sat. 2-12, the day of our 21" blizzard, unu WYVA-1550 was the only one on with storm warnings that I noted. I did 2 1/2 hours at WQXR-91.9 here in Provincetown that day when other DJ's couldn't get there. SM 2-13: 0'bye 1440 - WQXR-ME has now begun its fulltime sked (ex-daytime) and, you guessed it, are going whole-hog, with the accent on the second syllable -NSP, and all-TLK (No doubt a bunch of hams, eh? -pls).
