## 3 area residents plan to buy WBZY

NEW CASTLE — An agreement to sell local radio station WBZY to three New Castle area residents was announced Monday by the Lawrence County Broadcasting Corp., station owners.

Robert McCracken, current station manager; William Andrews, former partner in the Sporting Goods Co.; and Samuel Shirey, retired certified public accountant, will purchase the station, pending

approval from the Federal Communication Commission.

They declined comment on the sale price.

McCracken, according to a release handed out yesterday, will continue to be the general manager. Andrews will direct public relations and marketing, and Shirey, a former partner in the Hill, Barth and King public accounting firm, will be the chief accountant and treasurer.

The announcement of the pending sale was made by Robert Purcell, president, and Thomas Fletcher, secretary of the broadcasting company.

WBZY was first licensed in 1968 and went on the air in August of that year.

Fletcher is a former New Castle resident who practices communication law in Washington, D.C.

Purcell, a consulting engineer, met Fletcher through a mutual client, Lee Dixon, who then owned WSOX in Salem, Ohio. They were the founding partners until Dixon was bought out in 1970.

WBZY, located in the Haney Building on Kennedy Square, is heard at 1140 on the AM dial. It is a

## Raising the roof on the AM band

After years with a 1600 khz ceiling, broadcasters and FCC are trying to decide how to handle newly allocated spectrum boosting top limit to 1705

Late last year, Maine broadcaster Allan Weiner built a 100-watt AM station in his hometown of Yonkers, N.Y., and, using the auxiliary broadcast channel of 1622 khz, began broadcasting a noncommercial format of music and community information. As the station demonstrated, most radios are able to

tune in frequencies above the conventional AM band (535-1600 khz), at least as high as 1622 khz.  
 But when the FCC caught wind of Weiner's using his auxiliary broadcast channel for a broadcasting service, it, in the words of Weiner, "went ape wild" and knocked the station off the air.  
 Despite the protestations of the FCC, it may have been that Weiner's only real crime was being ahead of his time.  
 The U.S. and the rest of the countries of

the western hemisphere are moving forward with plans to expand the AM broadcasting band from 1605 to 1705 khz, a 10% increase, by the end of the decade. The new band will make room for hundreds of new AM stations in the U.S.  
 But it's not yet time to flood the FCC with applications for the new channels. As a matter of fact, it's likely the commission will not accept any until after 1988. Broadcast industry and government planners are making preparations for a Regional Administrative Radio Conference in Geneva next April

Assorted miscellaneous notes ... DX hasn't been terribly interesting in  
 October, with this area holding in summer weather patterns abnormally late; it's been very  
 warm and thunderstorming for most of the last month, it seems. Only three new ones  
 recently, and two of those - WBIU-1210 IA and WQIS-890 MS - were relatively easy catches of  
 stations recently moved to "clear" channels. The other new one was WACV-1170, noticed the  
 morning of 10-23 7:40-8:00 am with Montgomery Weather, easy listening/standards music, and  
 finally an hourly ID and news. I found very interesting the application by KRCL-870 W for  
 a synchronous transmitter in the Las Vegas area. With the pressure being applied to the FCC  
 to reform the technical standards of AM radio (read: deregulate it completely) to make it  
 more competitive with FM, it wouldn't surprise me to see such applications get approval.  
 This could lead to a whole new category of AM stations to be DX'ed - serving much the same  
 function as FM translators have for years, but with a far greater potential (at 250 or 500  
 watts) for travelling distances. As if the DX bands weren't crowded enough already!  
 Finally, I'm pleased to report that the practice of tuning distant clear channel stations  
 for their programming isn't entirely dead yet. I've turned on several other people in the

Two weeks after I got back, the WADXA held a GTG at Joe and Donna Erwin's pad in Largo, MD near our "temple", the Capital Centre, with fifteen including Tom White, Greg Monti, and yours truly attending. WAGE Leesburg VA is now on 1200 (ex-1290) as of Fri., 10-4. Exit one pest on 1290 for DC area DX'ers, making WGLI on Long Island and WFBG (itself a pest at night) good midday targets. WPCW Quantico, VA is now on 1480 (ex-1530) as of Fri. 10-18 (maybe earlier). 1530's loss is 1480's gain. It sounds like WPCW upped its power from 2500 to 1000/500. Some inviting targets for midday DX in the DC area are WVFC McConnellsburg, PA, WJDM Elizabeth NY, WRBX Chapel Hill, NC (itself a pest here on SSS), and WFIC Collinsville, VA. Next spring, when the April Fools issue comes out, I expect to be in DSA (Chile) for two weeks, chasing Halley's comet, which will be closest to the Earth and best seen from DSA and DU, and closest to the sun in late January. Enough for now. 73's de WPT.

**Andy Rugg - 669 de Gaspe, #218 - Nuns Island, Quebec H3E 1J1**

The DX keeps rolling in, with 5 more new ones. On top of that, there were 2 "that got away" and one "maybe". However, half of that whole package was just call changes. At 6:29 pm on 10-12, WCSS-1490 topped the channel with an ID, and promptly vanished. The second "one that got away" was WGEZ-1360, who pulled the same trick on 10-13 at 1:26 am. Right after that, I got my first new one, WANK-1360 on a call-change. I hit paydirt on 10-17, with 4 more new ones. WREX-1150 finally came thru on their day pattern, at both 6:30



and 7:13 am. At 7:15, CJRC switched to their day pattern and blew them away. The old WCOB/WACQ used to be regulars at night until about 1977, but hadn't been heard since. I never managed to snag the WHUE call. At 7:19, WKPE-1170 upsurged and battered WWA until 7:29 am tune-out. That's a call change from the old WVLC. Then the new WJJP-1180 barely squeaked through the ubiquitous WHPM from 7:32 to 7:35 am. In the evening, I took a log on CFJR-830 from 7:45-8:02 pm. At 7:46 am on 10-18, I stumbled across my one "maybe". After a fruitless try for a repeat logging of WJJP-1180, I tuned across 1170 and heard a garbled ID that strongly resembled WJCC, the Nirfolk, MA station. I'm less than sure about that one. So far in the 1985 calendar year, I have 28 new catches, my best year since the mid-1960's. CFJR-830 was counted as a new one, although I had verified them on 1450 back in 1962. I count frequency changes as new loggings only if the move exceeds 250 kHz, such as CHYM and CFJR. For small moves like CKRW, WROX, and WDOT, to name a few, I don't count it as new. It would be interesting to hear what other DX'ers do for frequency changes. (I would count any frequency change, but not call letter, and probably not tx location change or city of license, except in substantial change of reception condition -pls) So far this season, veries are very slow, just like last year. 73.

Lansing recently dropped its remaining am tlc shows and is now "soft soul", with 4 female DJ's around the clock. Well, WJPC does need help. Its ratings are horrible. The NHL Hawks will soon leave WIND for WBBM-AM. The Bears are enjoying their first season back on WGN; the NBA Bulls will not be interrupted by delays this season on WPAQ. Only other Chicago stn carrying sports is WBBM-1490 doing the Univ. Ill. Chi. Flames hockey games - big deal. Yes, there is a Chicago entry in a midwest football minor league, but they get NO publicity, only newspaper scores. Now for the summer Arbitron ratings released Oct. 1: (1) WGN 9.9; (2) WBBM-FM 7.0, the Black Music Xperience is now second here; (3) WLOO (FM 100 nationally syndicated, nice TV ads, also) 5.1; (4) WBBM-780, 4.9; (5) WCCI-FM, 4.8 (another Black stn in the top 5); (6) WLS-890, a big rise, 4.2; (7) WBBM-96.3, 3.8; (8) WKQX-FM, 3.6; (9) tie at 3.5 WLUP-FM and oldies WJMK; (11) tied at 3.4 WIND and WLAJ-FM; (13) WJJD, 3.0, a drop from 8th in spring; (14) tie at 2.8, WPAQ and WFYR-FM; (16) WUSN (US-99), 2.7; (17) WCIR, 2.6 - much TV ads lately; (18) tie at 2.5 WRTT-FM and WLS-FM, a big drop here; (20) WOJO-FM 2.3, big drop here also; (21) WAIT 2.0; (22) WDET-FM 1.7, big drop; (23) WCKG-FM, big TV ad pronos now; (24) WJPC 1.5, a waste of 5 kw; (25) tie at 1.3 WVON and WEMT; (27) WNIB-FM, .9; (28) wow - WCFL at .6. Now you know - We Can't Find Listeners!!; (29) tie at .5, WVVX-FM and WCCI-1390, another waste of 5 kw; (31) WBBM-1490, .4, who cares? and (32) at .3 WAVR-FM Aurora and WJZQ-FM Kenosha, WI. One thing I'm a little disappointed about is all those new stations on clear channel frequencies. I have tried, but failed to log any of them. #### Radio Roundup

Pete Kemp - P. O. Box 73 - Bethel, CT 06801

Greetings, all ... The AP Radio Network has added four full-time regional bureaus to their news gathering efforts, New York, Washington, Chicago, and Dallas ... WWAL is sixty years old ... Sportscaster Pete Franklin has a new three-year contract with WME ... WRAT is the new home of the Larry King Show in South Florida, taking it away from WGBS ... Arbitron has advised its stations that it will introduce quarterly ratings, instead of semi-annual ones, in the top 75 markets, with the exception of Akron and San Diego. Some stations are reacting negatively to this change, as it will represent additional financial charges to the stations for this expanded services ... ABC's TalkRadio is being partially dropped by its own flagship station??? That's right, WABC-New York is not too pleased with some of the program offerings, so Los Angeles-based talkers Michael Jackson, Dr. Toni Grant, and Dr. David Viscott are getting the hook, in the Big Apple, on November 1. The rumor is that crosstown talker WCA is considering picking up the dropped shows ... On the international

front the Dutch government has voted to ban all alcohol-related advertising on radio and television ... WNEP is re-broadcasting the classic War of the Worlds broadcast, as a tribute to the late Orson Wells, in time for Hallow'een. Wonder how many other stations are doing likewise? (I listened via KABC-790; the program apparently originated in Portland, OR and was carried by ABC-TalkRadio - pls) ... Taft Broadcasting has taken over WNDZ, in Indianapolis, and is promising that the last-placed station is on the move. WNDZ is bringing back a news department and has hired a traffic reporter and is moving from a '50's/'60's music mix to a late '60's to '80's musical balance ... Also in the Colt's city (no, not Baltimore) WNEP is bringing back the syndicated "Your Hit Parade" series with Andre Baruch and his wife Bea Wain. Sort of an American Top 40 show, but for the 1930's early 1950's generation, with original artists ... In San Francisco, Bill Rafferty, former Laugh-in and Real People personality, is now doing an airshift on KFRC ... KFYI, which has been off the air after its ill-fated attempt as an all-news station, is reverting back to its KDIA Soul format, following its sale ... Believe it or not, I have spent some time listening around the bands. With the late sun in the morning, just prior to our reversion to Standard Time, I have bagged WGRP-940, coming in over local WINE with CBM in the background. Last week WILK-950, Wilkes-Barre, was capture, with a QSL sent out and a response received within a week. Just love that response time ... So much for now.

Bill Hardy - 2301 Pacifi Ave. - Aberdeen, WA 98520

For the third straight year, and the fifth time in six years, Nancy and I vacationed in the Canadian Rockies. Not a lot of new notes this trip, but we did get a wealth of Alberta phone numbers for Albert Lobel. CFHC-1450 Camrose, Alberta, and its 50-watt LPRT on 1340 in Banff, have expanded and changed their local studio time, which is now 7-11 am, noon-12:30, and 2-6 pm Mon.-Fri., 7 am-5 pm Sat., and noon-4 pm Sun., all Mountain time. We attended Klondike Days in Edmonton July 22, where we finally saw the real Stanley Cup that we missed by two days in 1984; Nancy and I must be Canadian, eh, because we love hockey! One FM note near Blue River, B. C., was a relay of CFMI which in Victoria, hundreds of miles away; excellent station, but not very local! The Jasper-Kamloops highway still has long stretches of radio desert, both AM and FM; so does the Trans-Canada Highway between Revelstoke and Golden. Back in the U. S., noted KSGA-900 Wenatchee, ex-KUEN, with a "solid gold" oldies format, delays Mutual Lifestyle Reports to the top of the hour. Saw billboards for "KUTV-980/KOED (FM) 24 Hour Country" in Yakima, and a Selah-Yakima ID on the hour; sure enough, heard them at night after returning home so fulltime is on. DX at home got worse last spring. Local KGHO moved from 1560 to 1490 on 3-7, remaining a daytime until 4-10. At that time they jettisoned their satellite MOR-oldie format, which I learned later was Transtar's "Format 41", and went NSP with Satellite Music Network's "Stardust." They're 1/2 mile away, and between them and local KAYO-1450 the 1400's are useless for DX'ing unless we go camping at the beach. KAYO does have a silent period Mondays midnight-5 am Pacific time, which at least removes many images, but KGHO blocks 1470-1510 all the time.

However, KGHO has very few ads, and the owner took a financial bath with his weekly paper going bankrupt this year, so there's a possibility 1490 will open up again. Other happenings in the Pacific Northwest this summer: KQIN Burien, WA moved from 800 to 820 in May, still a temporary 500-watt daytimer, but planning to go NSP this fall, format change from SNN-adCon in the works there. In Eugene, KEED's country format is now dominant nights on 1600, ex-KASH; 1450 is now album-rock KRXX, heard only Monday mornings during KAYO SP. And CRQR Castlegar, BC, moved to 760 from 1230 in September, good most evenings, blocking WJR, but nulloable to hear KFMB. Saskatoon's new KCOM-650, ex-1250, has been blocked by CISE so far; as has that city's CJWW-750, ex-1370, by KXL. KXL has also kept KAMA away; only DX in KXL's null has been KERR. 73 and good DX.

#### \*AIWA Has Retired\*

John R. Malicky - 995 Shadycrest Rd. - Pittsburgh, PA 15216

After 16 great seasons of catching 1,224 stations during an exciting 60,736 minutes and being named to the DX All-Star team for a record 13 seasons, AIWA AR-158 has officially announced his retirement. The announcement came at 3:30 pm on Sept. 24, 1985 just before the end of training camp and before the start of the '85-'86 DX season. In 1970 he moved into the starting role after spot duty as a number one draft pick in 1968 from the College of Somewhere. Immediately, AIWA began thrilling Pittsburgh Point fans with his catches of KPI-640, KNBR-680, KSL-1160, and CBW-990 during the early years of the league. He missed almost a year while being on the injured reserve list, but came back strong in 1979 through the '80's with catches of KNIX-1580, KKK-1070, KFEB-1530, CBK-540, plus others too numerous to mention. He also returned a record 722 confirmations, a number so great it may never be broken. He baffled Chief Engineers and Program Directors alike with his ability to move around noisy interference, slippery fading, and overlapping, tackling signals to receive their spiraling programs. AIWA survived numerous injuries that threatened to cut his career short, including splicing of his AC cord several times, a cracked window panel, loss of 3 other bands (FM, VHF 1 and 2), a dented speaker face, and many abrasions of banana stickers applied to him (DS can attest to this). Yet Dave Schmidt, G1 of the Delaware Dens, was amazed at his longevity. He also kicked through 35



shortwavers. Alas, AIWA never did have a great longwire ... The end came swiftly as another great talent also drafted number one from David Weis University (a self-serve merchandise store), G. E. Superadio II pushed Aiwa into retirement. G. E. received rave reviews from many NRC scouts about his sensitivity and feel for the station, his selectiveness to read through defensive interference, his strong and bold features, plus his bass control, something AIWA lacked. It was all this and his tuning speed which led the Points into drafting G. E. Salary and terms were over quickly for only \$42.90, plus a clause of careful treatment. Also, in addition from DW on the 4th round, New Haven quartz clock (battery-operated) made the team with features of big bold numbers on a white face. It is a sure bet the G. E. at 8 1/2 inches and 7 pounds will fill the shoes of the AIWA, having already caught 26 new stations in the '85-'86 season. However, no one will ever forget AIWA from his fans or rivals in Louisville, Rochester, Wildwood, Virginia Beach, and Infield, where he starred so many times. Aiwa has, you guessed it, made plans for a career in sports broadcasting! His number, 158, will never be worn again! Sob! Thanks for the memories, AIWA.

Don't know if NSP or not. Not 24 hr; GOS otherwise. CFJR-830 and CHAM-820 both logged 10-19, CFJR to 0100 off GSO. CHAM easy o/WAIT/WBAP c/w. WMYM-1570 WI, ex-WFBZ now with 5 kw hrd 10-20: "We Make Your Music" to 6:15 s/off. That was #2930 in 25 years of DX'ing. WEEP-1430 is still daytime only. Lady at station said only XR change, not a full-time CP.

## New Antenna Replaces Topped Tower

At 5:01PM on April 5th of this year, the heavy winds of a late afternoon Spring storm toppled the 48-year-old, 50,000 watt antenna tower of WHAS Radio.



Nearly six months later 84WHAS has completed construction of a new antenna tower scheduled to begin full service the second week of October.

The new tower was delivered in mid-August, erector set-style, by three flatbed trucks. The 117,000 pounds of steel were assembled and painted on the ground, according to Bill Bratton, Director of Broadcast Operations and Engineering for WHAS, Inc. The initial 105-foot section was erected by a large crane. Then individual 30-foot sections were hoisted and stacked on top until the tower reached its



ultimate 664-foot height. Eventually the ground system was installed—a job that included laying 27 miles of copper wire!

In contrast, the original tower, built in 1937, was delivered by a barge via the Ohio River. The delivery was delayed by the 1937 flood and mule driven wagons brought the tower materials to their new home in Eastwood, Kentucky.
