DX'ina 'smart', with shared tips and requests by NRC members


I attached a note when I submitted the last column, asking Paul Swearingen if "Target DX" was turning out as expected. He wrote back that he had thought that NRC members would have sent in more specific requests for tips and strategies concerning particular tough targets. Well, what do you say? How about some specific requests?

I've recently been hovering around 1580 khz, giving what had become a congested frequency a second chance. Afterall, it is my favorite frequency, with about 60 loggings (including call changes), and it may be my only chance left for Arizona. Especially helpful is the apparent silence of WEBG. Although I haven't heard a thing from KNIX, the results have been very rewarding. WKNN (ex WPMO) has been logged, WTYO (7 watts according to QSL) and WLIJ were heard operating past sunset, WBBR and WTCL with sunset signoffs, WSRF and WEAM with Gospel music, and WAMJ and WKKD with post-sunset high school basketball. Has anyone heard KNIX from the east coast in recent memory? If so, what's the best month?

I had been saying to myself that VOA-Antiqua has not been heard at all lately, though quite strong a few years ago, but I finally found them the other night weak under CBJ. Only later did I notice that the 1990 WRTH shows that VOA-Antiqua operates 0000-0100 UTC, and that VOA-Belize operates from 0100-0400. Perhaps It was VOA Belize that I heard at 0127 UTC? Another mystery was something that sounded like "K-mix, Stereo 99" with CST time checks and Rock music at 1850 - 1905 EST. The rock music makes it unlikely that it was WKNN.

Although I do not DX every evening (WHAT!), I have been noticing that conditions on 1580 vary considerably from night to night, and 1 haven't been able to make any correlation with the A-Index. One night favors stations to the south, another night favors stations to the west. Even at the end of the month, when the darkness path is reduced by increasing daylight, reception conditions on this frequency have been quite interesting. Perhaps the best reception of all was WAMW, Indiana with 250 watts listed, at 1800 on January 21st.

A term that may mystify the new Medium Wave DXer is "closest unheard," which refers to the station closest to your home that you have not yet managed to hear. I was reminded of this the other night when I heard WERA-1590 for the first time, recalling from my DXing infancy the lengthy effort that ERC put into hearing a station whose tower he could practically see from New York.



Those seeking a closest unheard may spend less time monitoring atmospheric conditions than they do keeping an eye out for earthquakes, tornados, ice storms, power failures, and ownership changes, hoping against hope for that rare silent period.

My closest unheard is WVIN-1380 in Bath, NY. With local 1370 beaming its signal down my throat from a mile away, I've rarely even bothered to look for this one. My tragic moment came when WRTK went silent pending its transfer to WXXI, and I still couldn't hear WVIN. I suppose that the best solution will be to schedule a CPC test with WVIN, and then topple WXXI's tower the same night. But I really can't consider doing that, because WXXI is the best AM station in town, and I'm a member!

After catching your closest unheard you can then turn your attention to your "furthest unheard," as a real test of DXing skill!

I've been DXing for eight years and an NRCer since V55 I-1 (10/1/87). In addition to my DX, I have a collection of radio station bumper sticker (1154 different as of today, January 23). I'm also a fan of B-Movies and Oldies from '55 to '83. Looking forward to the Labor Day Convention, hope you'll be there. My unid. German logging from the last Musing turned out to be R. Antilles 930 Montserrat relaying the German shortwave service, Deutsche Welle. A new station and new country for me, but not really what I hoped for. We checked out the ham bands and heard F2 skip from San Diego; that was nice to hear. What wasn't nice to hear were the image problems this area has. The Kenwood is a first rate DX machine and the narrow mode is very impressive, but we really did a thorough check of the AM bands and noticed and agreed that this has to be the worst area for images, splatter and crowding. The Kenwood did dig out some tough ones and the loop antenna has excellent nulling capabilities. In the sunset time we heard WTYO-1580 which I think is common. Time progressed on and the be antenna was really put to the test on an unid country music on WWRL null; likely CFRB 1010 despite WINS transmitter only four miles away in a null!; and other unids too. Well, with seeing firsthand how a loop makes a big difference, I think I'm inspired enough to give the AM band another shot at some serious DXing again. That's of course after I obtain a loop antenna. In other DX related news, I have been getting WBUF 92.9 Buffalo NY 275 miles on troposcatter quite a bit lately. I've only raised my antenna 6 feet but there was a noticable difference in performance, especially on the adjacents. If anyone else DXes FM and you live several miles from FM locals and can't get adjacents, then check out my special report in the January 1990 WTFDA VUD. It might help those who are hard pressed to received adjacents next to locals. On a slightly different matter, the company that sells those filters that help to get adjacents on FM also sells filters for AM. That might be of help to those of you who DX the "splits". Once again, I guess it's time for my quaso-annual Muse. I'll take some time out doing the Answerman Column to do this. I've actually started to DX again, FM so far, but that's progress. I'd appreciate hearing from someone fairly local to Philadelphia, who's been DXing here for some time to compare notes. So far, my FM DXing has been done on the car radio of my new car, which is digital, which helps, and which seems to be pretty good

on FM. I'm located within about 8 miles of a major FM antenna farm, and am served by the same utility, and am becoming convinced that I'm getting some FM radiation through the line since there's a dramatic effect when I pull the car into the garage, and an even more dramatic effect trying to pick up the same station or anything inside, even the portables which I used for FM DX in North Jersey for years (Hammarlund HR-10 and Nordmende Galaxy Mesa 6000). Most DX is done from the spot where I park the car to pick up the commuter van into the city. It's a church lot about 5 air miles from here. The third is at my son's instrumental music teacher's house about 8 miles away, with the rest done en route. I have managed to pick off a few of the newer operations on clear (or should I say formerly clear) channels. Since most of that wouldn't even qualify as DX, since it's semi-local and previously reported in NRC, I'll omit it here. I quess I should also mention the fact that I run an Amateur Radio Net on two meter sideband on a weekly basis for this area, and NRCers who are hams are welcome to check in (147.250 MHz, 9pm ELT Mondays). Normally, check-ins are from much of Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, New York, Connecticut and Virginia. In another amateur related matter, I'm interested in gathering any information on any unusual loggings made during the big 3/17/89 aurora. I'm trying to make some correlations between loggings made on the amateur bands and BCB. This sort of thing has been fruitful in the past so if anyone has any unusual loggings made during that time, which were not reported to IDXD or either of the DDXD columns, please drop me a line with etails. As of this writing, I rather doubt that I'll be able to attend the Pittsburgh convention. Both money and time are extremely tight here, owing to seriously depressed conditions in the industry (and company) in which I'm employed. I also have much left to do with the house, maybe even including a longwire, hi. We'll see though, as it's a long way off and things can and do change. 73.

FRANK MERRILL, P.O. Box 669, Macomb, IL 61455 Aloha all. I haven't Mused in about a year. My DX blitz abruptly ended in February 1989 when I started heavy preparations for a 1-month trip and other projects, and afterward, I had to remove the antennas because they were all strung across the farm fields. In January, I had 1/2 mile of wire SSE, netting DX such as WVOP-970 GA and WJBO-1150 LA, but I was generally unimpressed with it. Some 9/89 DXing with a short SE wire resulted mostly in listening to WPDQ FL's Hugo coverage. Why is AM being treated as a dead medium? WPDQ not only proved that radio can still provide a community service, but that an AM station can serve a very large community indeed! This ONE 50,000 watt transmitter covered a larger "community" than 30 or 40 50,000 watt FM transmitters could have. Best DX on that wire was WAVU~630 AL on night power. John Clemment was here 11/19/89 and I logged 4 newies (KGFL-1110 AR, and AL/LA "clearbusters" 830/1200/1210) on his car radio at SSS. Currently, I have longwires going in NW-SE-SW, all 700-1200'. I may be trying E, W and S wires soon, as well. The road is north of me. At 700', the SW is the shortest, but it does the best. In fact, the SW has been my best DX quadrant since Day One (1960)! On this one KGHL-790 is often like a local, and I finally IDed KDWN-720 NV for state #40. I've chased this "weak EE talk w/wgn" for over a year! I keep wanting a good DX opening, because I haven't been able to do as much as "cheat CBU-690 in here" by finding a parallel to CBU's satellite feed. In November I had KOLE-TX on the GE Superradio and Nov.-Dec. DX with longwires included KFIT-1060, KLXX-1270 ND, WTAW-1150 TX, KLIM-1120 CO, KLSR-1130 TX, KELP-1590 TX, KPAR-TX, KIMB-1260 NE, KRKY-930 CO, KDSI/KWEL-1070 TX, KIVY-1290 TX, WARB-730 TX, KFED-700 TX, WEYZ-1330 PA, WOYL-1340 PA, WBKC-1460 OH, WGRA-790 GA, WAJL-1190 FL, KTXZ-1560 TX, YVRZ-1500, KSEO-750 OK, KFEL-970 CO, KDSJ-980, KRDZ-1440 CO, KOAL-750 UT. I had not time, period to send to DDXD in Nov.-Dec., so these "expired" on me. Total heard now 1200. On 1090, is it KBOZ with "Music Radio Network" AN? This is on the NW wire, fighting WBAL/Martinique (!) AN 1/16 AM with a rare KAAY SP. And you should know that Al followed, to the letter, the policies that Mike, I, and other editors had established for the columns in question. Yes, I was irritated, but if I offended anyone, I apologize. On the other hand, if we are standing in the way of progress and natural

change for what should be in the best interests of DXN, NRC and its members, then you should continue to offer your comments as did Ernie Cooper and Dan Phillips so well in #18. I appreciate the historical perspective from themas I've only (?) been a member of the NRC since 1975. And I do want your comments as to what diverse philosophies each column should serve. I do not think that we should then push back the clock and change the columns back to what existed, say, in the '60's however. Of what value then would be the improvements fostered by the Boston, New Jersey, Louisville and Wisconson publishing crews? Should we be static, and perhaps run the risk of dying, as did the NNRC, and as more of the current ailing clubs seem about to do? The NRC is one of the mst stable both in finances and membership, of the ANARC clubs, and we did not get that way by staying "clubby" and unchanging. And if, as Ernie says, the cameraderie is gone currently, I would lay the blame squarely upon those who fail to support Musings with their contributions, not upon the editors. I desperately wish that "the private friendly rivalries cr races with others" would be chronicled in Musings (not to mention IDXA and DDXA), and that, as Ernie says, reading Musings would be like "receiving 20 to 25 to 30 letters from other DX'ers, telling of their latest accomplishments." Perhaps, as a former NRC member now in IRCA suggested to me in a letter, DX catches should be more regionalized and DDXD split even further; Dan Phillips' comment that he "must go through 10 pages of DX News hopefully to find something useful" certainly has merit...although, as I've been saying, no imagined policy is keeping you from discussing your DX in Musings or being friendly (the only items I edited out when I was Musings editor were totally non-DX discussions and cheap shots at individuals, which certainly did not reflect well on the originator or on NRC). On the other hand, I sort of miss the running battle between C.M. Stanbury and Ron Shatz, both now deceased. But then we can be mature about our differences, can't we? Let me toss out some more ideas. Let's assume that I acquire a modem, allowing DDXD and IDXD editors the ability to transmit columns up to minutes before I lay out their pages in DXN, assuming that they (or you, through your dues) would be willing to stand the increased expenses, and I would be able to stand by at specified times. The turnaround time between tips sent and DXN received in your mailbox could be under a week. But let's also say that we limit the age of your contributions to two weeks, with older $D\bar{X}$ discussions related to Musings. Would you be able to send fewer DX catches more often to the columns? Would the present, rather weak support of IDXD increase? Would Bill Hale need a finger transplant? I dunno - what do YOU think? Are listings by time and then by frequency in DDXD more useful than, say, by general locale of where the DX was heard? Why couldn't these locales be six divisions of the US and three or four of Canada? Would those of you DXing the foreign stations be better served if the column was divided into TP, TA and Pan-American listings? Would it make any difference to those of you who do not share your DX catches with us? As infrequently as I DX, if I can hear new Mexican stations from the dead center of the US - no pun intended - those of you in the half dozen or so states closer to our Latin neighbors, should be able to put my puny listings in IDXD recently to shame. I think it's time we considered these questions and commented on them, preferrably in Musings. Certainly if the editors and I listed hard and fast rules for what would be included/excluded in each column wou would not be able to complain about imagined restrictions...but then we'd have to face a) the immediate resignations of most editors, who rightfully would refuse to wear their new straightjackets, and b) those jokers who started probing for loopholes. Nope, it's best to keep the rules out and the guidelines general and deal with the problems when they show up (like the poetry problem 10 years ago and the April Fool's wasted space just a couple of years ago.). That way, DXN can continue to eveolve organically to meet your needs. And if it is not now meeting your needs, now is the time for YOU, not someone else, to let us know. Oh yeah, DX. 1330, the sole call change. I previously verified them as WDLW in 1979 and WHET in 1977. The next two were NRC DX tests. WADN-1120 was an easy catch on 1/8. The much-wanted WKEN-1600 on 1/15 was tougher, but I did make out one weak ID and the pulsating siren tone certainly distinguished their signal. A phone call to Dave Schmidt provided a verbal verie and the v/l followed in 9 days (with my s.a.s.e. returned!!). My last new Delaware loging was the NNRC test of WJWL-900 in 12/69!! Thanks Dave! My final new one was at SR on 1/23 when I stumbled across the welcome surprise of WADJ-1330. The DDXD-E column has more specific details on most of the above. My only other verie was WYST 1010. I have just renewed my membership for the 30th year in our club. 73.

PAUL MOUNT, 471 Emerson Ave., Teaneck, NJ 07666-2727 Nothing like a few DX tests to get a DXer active again; even hearing CKCW for the first time in ten years while looking for the WKMT test was a thrill. Especially nice this year was getting a couple of stations seemingly unhearable. With WKEN, those sirens got through WWRL, and liely WIXY (with country music). WWRL at 11 miles isn't really that strong here at night, I'm about due N of them and their big lobe goes East; can almost always hear something behind them at night. As for WILD-1090 Boston, I've got a big problem with WEVD 1050 + (WEVD+WINS 1010) mixing product there and have only heard WBAL there (not even Little Rock!) and thus never heard Boston, so thanks to the CPC for both of those. WILD really did a good job with sending Vs and Code IDs. In the fall Arbitrons, religious WWDJ and WMCA scored less than a 0.3 (I have the ratings down to there --- saw it on the AP). That new Realistic 12-625 looks a lot like the GE; hope the ads don't say "a super radio..." Lots of people are getting pared by AT&T; if I'm a victim, I'm promising myself to take my dream US trip, visiting the 27 contiguous states that I haven't driven to myself (where Teaneck was the point of origin), before I try to get a job somewhere else. Having flown somewhere doesn't count--I set very particular standards just as for my DX calls (anywhere off the grounds of 471 Emerson gets one asterisk in the logbook and anywhere outside of Teaneck gets two! Gave up on the "25 miles" as the challenge of hearing it from home greatly appeals to methanks to Russ Edmunds and company circa 1974). Ideally, I'd rather stay with the company and get my three weeks vacation in another two years. Ones hobby and ones job have a relative importance, but most important is that you and I have a wurtzel-free life. 73s.

ERNEST COOPER, 5 Anthony Street, Provincetown MA 02657 508-487-9337 A few veries have flitted in, WYST-1010-test, WNNH-1340 NH, WADR-1480 NY & WZRX-1590 MS, for 4,350 even in a DX career begun 12/28.32, continued til 12/16/74 in Brooklyn, NY and from then on, here in Provincetown. AM DXing for this season started with logging semi-local WADN-1120 on 9/19, with folk music, and so far, they're sticking to that format. A second report sent on the day of their test, but still no verie. A call from Bill Alisauskas on 9/25 alerted me to WPDQ-690 on for Hurricane Hugo and aiming their coverage at Charleston SC, and doing a great job, but again, no veri. A period of strong auroras set in around 10/14 with WFMJ-1450 FL in most evenings during my DX time 0130-0300, w/REL, but unn here. The four goodies I logged mid-October at these hours were the two Fort Pierce stations WDKC-1330 & (smeared--ajm) 1400, while on 1450 I pulled in WIZA-GA, "The Wiz" and on 1480, to 0200 s/off WZJY-1480 w/B/GOS. None of these four replied! WRCA-1330 Waltham-Boston started an AN sports network, and they now claim to have 50 stations in the chain. Ones I've noted are WOAM-560, KXOK-630, WBIS-1120, WBET-1460, WSRO-1470, and an as yet unid one on 1560, audible only MMs when WQXR is off. Lots of scores from the most remote games, and call-ins make up their all-nite gab. Another report sent to WEZO-990-NY, and as usual, no reply. Another non-replier was WMSX-1410, MA, reported on 12/17. There's an AN Canadian network with c/w music calling itself "Star Country" and I've heard it on 1000,1320,1350,1450,1490, and maybe a couple of other spots. Fri. 1/5 WBSK-1350 with folk, "The station with less rap and more music." What is their address, the old WRAP's or WNIS's? Or neither? No report sent pending this information. My "Forward-March" show on WOMR 91.9 is now on from 10-11 am Saturday. I keep trying to log daytimers behind WEVD-1050, and have heard WSEN-NY while looking for WMDK-NH. I keep hearing much mention of WMWV, which is the FM outlet for WNBC, or have they changed their FM call now that they're simulcasting? Still no sign of the nearer WMDK-NH as yet. Sat 1/6 on 1610 I heard these few words, extremely weakly, at 1:52am : "Why not take a few minutes to --- sleigh ride --- Open seven days a week .--- Welcome to Roosevelt National Forest.--- Stan says this is on the Main/New Brunswick borderanybody have an address for this one per chance? MM 1/8-In a try for the WMNY-1370-SC test, I heard only WFEM which is unusual, but unn WXXI-NY behind them. I see according to Rick Dau WMNY came on late, after I had given up on 'em. A station w/EZL noted on 1252 kHz today and for the past couple of weeks, with no IDs noted, but I also noted this at about 4pm one afternoon and when they did ID-'twas CHWO! But they're back on track now or off altogether, one or the other. 1/12-Report to WNTK-1020 at 4:24 to their 4:25 s/off in/out w/KDKA for a report. The FFC on 1480 running AN turns out to be CHRD, which, after all, isn't deleted, says Andy Rugg in answer to my query. They gave off an interesting string of call letters at about :02 and :32 in FF but too rapid for me to interpret them. 1/17-WADR-1480 really giving it to semi-local WSAR, 3:17-4:00pm, c/w music. 1/18 with no WJBO-ME or WETT-MD noted on 1590, an EZL/BFL station surprised me with its ID @0200 as WZRX, Jackson, MS! This is a very interesting frequency here these mornings-there's a c/w station in there which I think is WCGL with "Carolina Country" slogan , and one w/B/GOS, and then another in SS, which sounds like a domestic to me. 1/25-WKZE-1020 in quite nicely today 4:30-4:45pm s/off w/America the Beautiful, this time no sign of WNTK, reported this time the other day. 2/2 5:25pm, a BFL station in WHAM null, faded out, and at 5:30 in came a REL station that didn't ID til 6pm s/off 'twas the brand new WMYT, Carolina Beach-Wilmington NC! And Sun, dug out WHTB-1400 from among WIDE-ME and WLLH-MA & WPLM-1390 slop for a report. Oh yes - another interesting one on 1610 on 1/28: 0213, "Now you have a chance to show your gratitude." Then mention of New York & Foundation, 10163, followed by a male vocal, AOR, and fadeout-sounded something like WEVD-1050 programming; what could this have been? Forward-March! clean your typewriter keys. Also I trust that you sent these more recent loggings also to DDXD?! And I can understand why stations do not reply to you if you use the same typewriter, stationery and envelopes you use when you submit to Musings!!!!---ajm)

PERRY F. CRABILL, JR., 449 Milam Dr., Winchester, VA 22601, 703-662-7526 Here's my first Musing. I rejoined the NRC back last September and would like to ramble a bit about various aspects of my BCB DXing over the years prior to WWII. This is the third time I have joined; I belonged years ago when I lived in Maryland, and got busy with other things and dropped out. The same thing happened more recently, when I rejoined after moving to Winchester in 1982. My first BCB activity was in the early thirties as a pre-teen living in Washington DC using the family neutrodyne. It used 201As and an 112A and was powered by a car battery and a "b" eliminator. It didn't have ganged tuning and you had to juggle three tuning dials at once. The dials were not calibrated by frequency either. I used to hear CMQ, CMCQ and other Cubans. Later I built an AC operated regenerative receiver with an untuned RF stage. I heard my first Californian station with this. KFWB in Los Angeles, was on 950 kHz, the same frequency as our local WRC. I stayed up one night, and had WRC tuned in before their signoff at 1:00am. As soon as they cut their carrier, I was hearing KFWB, which was 5000 watts then as now. Eventually I acquired a superhet at an auction; it may have been a Majestic. I had to pay \$10 to get it fixed, bit it turned out to be a fairly decent receiver. I souped it up by building a one-tube regenerative preselector for it. I used to read in Radio News about people hearing TA's but never picked any up. As any old-timer knows, there were very few all-nighters in those days. One of them was WEXL in Royal Caks Michigan on 1310. I had no trouble hearing them late at night, despite their low power (50 watts), because all the other stations on 1310 at that time had signed off. There was only one station in Nevada at that time: KOH in Reno. I believe they were on 1380, with only 500 watts. It wasn't an easy catch, but I finally did manage to get a good copy on them early one morning. Of course, anyone staying up all night in those days couldn't help hearing the "border giants" in Mexico. Villa Acuna, on 840, with 250 kW; XENT, Nuevo Laredo, on 910, with 150 kw, and XEAW, on 960, with a mere 50kW. In the early evening, I might listen to WJJD, Chicago, on 1130, with 20 KW. I remember their commercials for Peruna (pronounced Pee-roona); also for Color Back Shampoo and Zymol Trochees. They used to have live music by a country singer called "The Blue-Eyed Boy; " I remember him singing "Sweet Violets," more than one evening. On Saturday nights, there was "The Grand Ole Opry" on WSM, Nashville on 650 kHz, and the "WLS Barn Dance" on WLS, Chicago on 870. How many DXers remember when the US Navy operated a station on the BCB? NAA Arlington Virginia, a suburb of Washington DC was on 690 kHz twice a day. They came on at 9:55am and 9:55pm EST with five minutes of time signals in Morde Code from the US Naval Observatory. After the dash at exactly 10 o'clock, voice was used for weather broadcasts from the US Weather Bureau. This service was discontinued permanently as of June 1, 1933. I used to buy Radio Index (RaDex) at the newsstands and eventually subscribed to it. It was a helpful guide to FCC frequency checks and DX tests. I believe this was the source of information which led to my one and only South American BCB DX, LR1 in Buenos Aires, Argentina. In 1936, the US Bureau of Standards arranged with them for some periodic propogation tests after 2:00 am EST. They were on 1070 kHz, the same frequency as WTAM, in Cleveland. I tuned in WTAM before sign-off, and peaked it with my regenerative

preselector. After they signed off, there was "elle ere uno" with a surprisingly good signal. I wrote for a veri using surface mail. The card was sent the same way, arriving six months later. My best DX to the west was Hawaii. I logged KBU, Honolulu, with 5000 watts, a number of times when WJR Detroit was off the air. I was also able to hear KGMB 1320, but not as often; they were only running 1000 watts. (Perry! This muse was great! PLEASE write more about the golden days of BCB DX!!--ajm)

Results of DX tests have been mixed with listening done on dates and as scheduled in DXN: WADN-1120 & WILD 1090 easily heard. Both WKMT-1220 and WMNY 1370 were tried but not heard. Tentative receptions were noted for both 1390 and WRSW-1480 tests with code IDs only. WCIL-1020 was also tried but nothing hears on MM 2/5. Verie returns are slow with the following back: CHTN, WNEZ-910 and WHTB-1400 all v/ls. Several follow-ups are in the mail with fingers crossed. CPC efforts have been the best in some time and are greatly appreciated here. Pittsburgh in '90!! 73s.



"A record for low-powered voice transmission was made on Jan. 4, 1934, during a radio conversation from the Antarctic Expedition to radio engineers in New York City. Voice signals were broadcast from Radio Station K-J-T-Y aboard the S. S. Jacob Reppert below the Antartic Circle with a power of only 120 watts, whereas the station normally uses 1,000 watts; and the signals were transmitted a distance of 8,500 miles via both Honolulu and Buenos Aireş and received clearly in New York. One hundred and 20 watts is about what two ordinary household electric lights use."

(THE ABOVE WAS 56 years ago)...Station KJTY is the call letters now used by Topeka, KS. Religious FM Station operating on 88.1 mhz., and owned and operated by the Joy Public Broadcasting Corp. (That this would be of interest to you, and fellow NRC members who visited KJTY in last years NRC Convention in Topeka.).
