620 KIPA HI Kalaoa/Naalehu: power increase for these synchronous transmitters (relaying KIPA Hilo) is on the air already (see Grant above)
840 WPGS FL Mims: application for power increase and relocation to Casselberry, FL has been DISMISSED
950 XEKAM BC Tijuana: referred to two issues ago as XETRA in Otherness, bad case of brain fade on your editor's part
980 WMAK KY London: silent station is being sold, should be returning
1120 WYNO OH Nelsonville: station is SILENT
1160 WPVG MD Funkstown: although several months behind their target date, this new station is ON THE AIR with an odd mixture of rock and country
1170 WCTF CT Vernon: has been noted operating in dark hours after midnight recently, possibly testing for their increase to 2500 D3. This station does NOT hold any CP or even an application for fulltime operation. Being one of those remote control/robot repeaters for Family Stations with no living people on duty during most broadcasting hours it's possible this operation is unintentional.
1330 KWLO IA Waterloo: station reported silent is back ON THE AIR, may have been off very briefly for technical problems
1340 KPGE AZ Page: silent station has been sold, is expected to return
1410 WRDC MS Boyle: silent station with new owners, should be back on
1530 WVGZ MI Lapeer: silent for over two years as WDEY, this station is back ON THE AIR relaying "Wings 103" from their FM

- Welcome to DDXD-E, new reporter Ken Romstadt of Ottawa Lake, MI. Good to have you in our DX family, Ken. Hope to hear more reports from your listening post! And thanks to Kermit Reid for the WWL SPECIAL item.
- Just a reminder, about 5 minutes of this column can be heard each month on the DX Audio Service.
- I must say, deciphering some of this week's reports was a real challenge. Let's try to make some sense out the way reports are sent, or I'll send 'em back. I cannot read your minds or logs to see where the punctuation and breaks belong.

- 550 **WKRC OH CINCINNATI** - 10/25 0226 noted with Sally Jesse Raphael on ABC TalkRadio - add to '91 Log; also Log shows 550 and 1530 carrying Larry King, where I think it's WCKY that carries LK (WPF-IN)
- 580 **WMGA GA RIVERSIDE/MOULTRIE** - per veric, station moved to 580 from 1130 on 12/4/89; is in C-Quam AM Stereo (EB-GA)
- 610 **WRUS KY RUSSELLVILLE** - 11/6 1044 noted format change to AC or MoR from C&W (WPF-IN2)
- 640 **WBMX MI ZEELAND** - 10/16 1309 now noted with C&W mx; simple ID at 1330 *WBMX Zeeland-Holland-Grand Rapids* (WPF-IN)
- 830 **WKTZ OH CORTLAND** - 11/2 semi-local missing during daytime bandscan; phoned WKTZ-FM in Mercer, PA who sed AM is silent due to money problems; FM sed they hope to get AM back on soon if fund raiser is successful (REH-ON)
- 840 **KVJY TX PHARR** - is not 50 kw days; rescind my report in Issue 7 and change your logs back to 5 kw as in Log; sorry 'bout that [Ed.-TX]
- 860 **KONO TX SAN ANTONIO** - is now simulcasting with 101.1 FM KFAN, Fredericksburg-San Antonio with KONO's OLD format from 0600-0200 (what happens the other 4 hours...??); another instance of an FMer taking the programming of an AMer, instead of vice versa; plans are to change FM CLs to KONO-FM; they've got one of my FM buttons! [Ed.-TX]
- 870 **WWL LA NEW ORLEANS** - 10/28 0545 with anncet they were going off for an unknown period so the station engineers could inspect the transmitting facility for damage caused by alligators; damage must not have been too severe as station was back on several minutes later (KR-GA)
- 910 **WSUI IA IOWA CITY** - per DS-WI's non-logging in Issue 4, WSUI runs the BBC World Service M-F 1200-1300, 2300-2330 and Midnight-0030 ELT, Saturday 0600-0700 and Midnight-0030, and Sunday 0300-0700 plus MM 0100-0600; this per their November schedule; don't know what Doug heard 10/2 0052, should have been *Asian Communique*, WOI-640 does indeed run BBC WS overnight (DB-IA)
- WVVO SC DORCHESTER TERRACE** - my unID of 10/30 (Issue 8); called WDXZ(FM) who confirmed that WVVO (ex:WKCEN) was the *Foxy-104.5* hrd here; AM-FM simulcast was temporary and that WVVO would switch to a blues/GOS/Motown format on 11/6 taking part of their programming from SMN's *Heart and Soul*; also sed the FM would also be changing CLs to something better resembling their *Foxy* slogan; some info sources have incorrectly listed the change to WVVO as an FM call change (REH-ON)
- WRNL VA RICHMOND** - 11/5 0510 | WRXL(FM) with *The Birds* (1990 version) and non-ID *XL-102, Richmond's best new rock and best classic rock*; when asked if the AM had changed CLs to WRXL, reply was *Nope, we've had the WRNL call letters for over fifty years and we want to hang onto them* (REH-ON)
- 1160 **WMLD GA EAST POINT** - 11/11 1310 hrd with Motown OLD and light UC going north on I-575 near Kenneshaw, GA, with mild WHNE-1170 splash; noted on both the DX-200 & TM-152 in Woodstock with only a trace of WHNE splash with *This is WMLD East Point - Atlanta testing ID* at 1345; so look for this to hit the airwaves soon, if not already, with UC/OLD format, competing with WIGO-1340 and WALR-104.7 (EB-GA)
- 1310 **WIBA WI MADISON** - is not all-news as logging in Issue 30; they do have AC overnight during my reception (WPF-IN) [What say you, Doug Smith?? - Ed.]
- 1330 **KWLO IA WATERLOO** - definitely on the air; not off as questioned in Issue 4 (DB-IA)

- 1360 **WKMI MI KALAMAZOO** - 10/22 0300 received FM 103.3 station and they ID'd as *WKFR and WKMI Kalamazoo*, so has not changed CLs yet (WPF-IN)
- 1400 **WWXX GA ALPHARETTA** - 11/14 1710 noted while driving from work in Alpharetta with REL mx, *The Western Carolinas are listening to WRAF slogan - How to Manage Your Money* with Larry Burkett, *This is WRAF Toccoa Falls, FM and WWXX Alpharetta AM* legal ID @ 1715, mentions of 90.9 FM and 1400 AM before mx sets; CLs likely to change to WRAF; simulcasts WRAF-FM 90.9 Toccoa Falls, GA, whose address is P.O. Box 800128, Toccoa Falls College, Toccoa Falls, GA 30598; UPI Net; change from Moneyradio Financial News; back after a nine-month silence; the feds goofed again (EB-GA)
- 1530 **WWGZ MI LAPEER** - 11/3 1057 silent station (as WDEY) is back on the air, was doing a remote from an auto parts store and mentioned *...oldies but goodies from the 50s, 60s and 70s...* followed by ad for *Grand Video Super Stores - Out of Limits* by the Marketts followed by 1103 ID: *WWGZ AM & FM Lapeer - Flint*; had several FM 103 non-IDs; less than 80 miles, but very poor even with WEHN null'd (REH-ON)
- 1560 **KNZR CA BAKERSFIELD** - 11/5 0300 with legal ID in the clear: *Only one station covers the southern San Joaquin Valley with around-the-clock news, News Radio 1560, KNZR Bakersfield*, then - CBS N; WQXR was on SP, no sign of WSLA with Sports Final (possibly off) and super thanks to KCJJ who had 16 seconds of dead air right at ID time; CA #63 and first in nearly 14 years; ex:KMPK (REH-ON)

- 910 **WVVO SC DORCHESTER TERRACE** - see 910 in SPECIAL (REH-ON)
- 1020 **UNID AB LONG PRAIRIE** - 11/5 0700 poor with *Canada Country Music Giant CKTA?* - Broadcast News; mentions of Long Prairie, not sure on CLs & no Canadian listed here (SA-MB) [Seems I saw something about a 1020 out there, but a quick scan of past AMS columns disclosed zip - Ed.]
- 1150 **WKPA PA NEW KENSINGTON** - is RF-OH's unid in Issue 4; when local WNRJ-104.7 changed CLs to WEZE-FM and format to EZL about 6 months ago, their AM went 24 hrs and simulcast except for its own HS FB coverage and some *oldies & polka* programming on weekends; the AM is still WKPA but its call & frequency are never given during the simulcast (CC-PA)
- 1280 **WYSY IL AURORA** - is MH-NE's unID of 8/13; they simulcast with 107.9; Y-108 always used, and IDs only on the hour (WPF-IN)
- 1510 **UNID ??** - 10/28 1715-1725 SS anncr, mx, nx; fade out at 1726, ~~CKKT~~ ~~tosl~~; over briefly (DT-ON)

DX AND EQUIPMENT TESTS

- 614 **KOJM MT HAVRE** - 11/8 0216-0220 good with 1000 Hz TT over WTVN's null; regular f/c (KMR-MJ)
- 540 **WPAW WI FT. ATKINSON** - 10/14 not tried for, has been received on the Canadian/Mexican Clear nite power (WPF-IN)
- WPAW WI FT. ATKINSON** - 10/14 0500-0545 test tried for but not heard, in AU conditions (RA-MA)
- 990 **WITZ IN JASPER** - 11/4 not heard, has been received on SSS; my 27th B'day (WPF-IN) ... test tried, but not heard, too much WRMM (RA-MA)
- 1130 **KLEY KS WELLINGTON** - 11/4 zilch from 0630 to 0700 except for a couple of minutes of sweep tones at 0646 that could have been anybody; but at 0700 they went bananas with CIDs (CLs only) 'til 0703 [Similar comments from Dave Hascall in last week's issue - Ed.] when they either faded or stopped sending; IDs were sent at rate of about nine per minute using 4kHz tone which really cut thru the QRM (especially local WCKD); patience sure paid off on this one or was it the prayer to St. Jude? hi [Is there a saint for DXers??-Ed.]; one of my most-prized catches, thanks CPC; KS #40 (REH-ON)
- KLEY KS WELLINGTON** - not heard (WPF-IN) ...no chance, with WNEW (RA-MA)
- 1260 **KSNO CO ASPEN** - 11/8 0200-0210 poor with 1000 Hz TT; regular f/c (KMR-MJ)
- 1280 **KVOX MN MOORHEAD** - 11/4 0600-0630 test tried for, but not heard (RA-MA)
- 1350 **WCOP GA WARNER ROBINS** - 11/11 0430-0500 not heard; just 5 unIDs: (1) black GOS mx with DJ *AM 1350, we are your gospel station*; (2) reggae mx, including very lengthy selection *Suzy Wants More From Them*; (3) Top 40 mx & *This is the nation's superstation, American Music Network*; (4) contemporary C&W; (5) tele-talk with male host (BH-NJ)
- WCOP GA WARNER ROBINS** - 11/11 0430-0500 test tried for, but not heard in CKAR/WSLR QRM; inspirational mx noted briefly at 0451, but don't think it was them (RA-MA)
- 1380 **WSYB VT RUTLAND** - 11/11 0530-0600 not heard, WKDM too loud; sent thank you w/followup for unanswered February report (BH-NJ)

Old Radio Jokes, Goat Glands

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — From live reports on the invasion of Europe to the medical advice of the goat-gland doctor, it's still all there for anyone to hear. And the good thing is, anyone can hear it.

The history in sound, dating back to the 1920s, is available through more than 3,800 radio broadcasts on file at Memphis State University.

While the collection is not the largest of its kind, it's certainly one of the most accessible. Unlike most radio archives, it isn't just open to broadcasting students and researchers. Any radio fan can drop by to listen to a little Abbott and Costello or perhaps a bit of "Inner Sanctum."

"Not only can you hear it—if you bring an audio cassette with you, they'll high-speed duplicate it for you," said Marvin Bensman, founder and chief overseer of the collection.

An associate professor of broadcast history, Bensman began putting the collection together in 1969 while working at the University of Vermont.

His students, he said, had little access to early radio broadcasts except through such sources as the National Archives in Washington.

"That's sort of ridiculous, to ask a college student to pay his way to Washington to listen to some old radio programs for a essay," he said.

From a variety of sources, including former broadcasters or their families, Bensman has put more than 1,300 radio hours on tape.

There's a 1949 plot of "Gunsmoke" starring Mark (that's right, Mark) Dillon and world-saving battles between "The Shadow" and various forces of evil. Fibber McGee and Molly build a lighthouse or search for lost keys while J. Edgar Hoover warms of creeping communism.

The collection includes several hours of live

coverage of the Allied invasion of Europe when the outcome of World War II and the fate of the world was very much unsettled.

"Everyone was hanging on their radios to see where we were going to make it," Bensman said.

It also includes a series of shows by Dr. Joseph R. Brinkley, an almost-governor of Kansas who broadcast medical advice in the 1920s and '30s. Brinkley picked up the nickname "goat gland doctor" because of claims he could improve the sex lives of his male patients with animal implants, Bensman said.

"He did a 90-minute program where you would write him and describe your symptoms. He would then diagnose your problem and prescribe to you over the air," he said.

Raising the ire of the American Medical Association and the Federal Radio Commission, Brinkley lost his broadcasting license in Milford, Kan. He moved to Mexico and set up a hospital straddling the U.S.-Mexican border.

"He was a real pioneer," Bensman said. "His voice is wonderful on the radio. I've listened to the stuff and his advice is not bad."

A stack of 16-inch recording discs of Brinkley's

show were recently found in the attic of his widow, Bensman said.

While academic researchers and biographers of radio personalities often use Bensman's radio collection, it can also come in handy for such people as the daughter of the "Silver-Masked Tenor."

The tenor, whose real name was Josh White, performed on a radio show sponsored by a tire company in the 1920s. To promote "silvertone" tires, program managers staged a yearlong contest featuring an unnamed singer said to be wearing a silver mask. Listeners were urged to guess his identity.

White's daughter contacted Bensman looking for a recording of her father's voice and a performance by the "Silver-Masked Tenor" was found on one of his tapes.

"We sent a tape and she was overjoyed," Bensman said.

The older programs in the collection are on 16-inch discs which can hold up to 15 minutes on each side. The broadcasts are put on reel-to-reel tapes and then on the cassettes that are made available to the public.

The collection continues to grow as more old programs are located and as modern ones are added to keep up with the evolution of radio.

Bensman said he has a list of 60 to 70 programs he still seeks from the early days of radio. "When we get those, we think we'll have every known program that ever appeared on the networks," he said.

The sought-after shows include such programs as "Eyes Aloft."

"It's a program about air travel or being in the Air Force, I think," Bensman said. "It's hard to say. Nobody has heard these programs in years."

KEEPER OF ARCHIVES

Henry Sapoznik takes his audience back to Yiddish radio's golden age

“I just chipped a tooth on this language,” jokes Henry Sapoznik, host of a new all-Yiddish cultural program debuting on WEVD (1050 AM) today at 5 p.m. Sapoznik, 37, is actually much more at home with the mother tongue of Ashkenazic Jews than he would have you believe. Raised in a Brooklyn household where Yiddish was spoken since he was “in the womb,” Sapoznik now runs the Weinstein Sound Archives at the YIVO Institute of Jewish Research. He’s a yeshiva dropout who drifted into bluegrass music and then went on to play a pivotal role in the revival of klezmer music (sometimes referred to as Yiddish Dixieland) in the late ’70s. Yiddish has come in handy in both his archival work and his career as a professional musician.

Hosting his own radio program is something that Sapoznik has longed to do for many years. He produced a four-part series on Jewish music titled “One People, Many Voices” for public radio in 1985 and has appeared

as a guest on numerous programs, so now he’s eager for his chance to sit behind the mike and call the shots.

“WEVD is willing to gamble with someone who’s never been on the radio but who is a performer,” he notes.

Sapoznik will host a new edition of “The Forward Hour,” a potpourri of music, drama, poetry and comedy that has aired on WEVD since the 1930s. After today, his program will next be heard on May 20 and every other Sunday after that. Four other hosts who have been handling the slot until now will take turns filling the hour-long slot on the weeks that Sapoznik isn’t on.

The quick-witted banjo player is particularly adept at communicating with an audience. Fronting for his klezmer band, Kapelye, he often introduces a Yiddish/English song called “Chicken” by explaining it’s about the Jewish national bird.

Not surprisingly, a Kapelye cut is used for the program’s intro (“the band would kill me if I didn’t”) and other New Wave klezmer artists will get regular airplay, in-

cluding the Klezmatics and Andy Statman, the virtuoso clarinetist and mandolin player.

But man cannot live by klezmer alone. So Sapoznik will be playing, he says, “a lot of stuff that just hasn’t been heard on the radio because it’s not thought of as high art.”

Expect to hear some cantorial music. Sapoznik’s father, Zindel, was a cantor, so it’s a form he knows about.

Every program will have poetry (a reading of Shakespearean sonnets in Yiddish will mark the debut broadcast) and Sapoznik hopes to assemble a Yiddish radio drama ensemble. But the real jewel of each week’s broadcast is likely to be recording of Yiddish radio from the ’30s and ’40s, which Sapoznik has come into in his capacity a director of YIVO’s sound archives.

More than 500 hours of programming from Yiddish radio aired in New York and Philadelphia line the walls of Sapoznik’s cramped YIVO office. Most of them were originally on large 16-inch discs that contain 15

minutes per side. Some are vinyl and others are aluminum or glass-coated acetate but YIVO has transferred them all to cassette. Thus far Sapoznik has listened to a little less than 200 hours of the radio treasure trove, which includes a substantial collection of WEVD programs that the station itself has no copies of.

Among the gems are recordings of the Barry Sisters, a Jewish singing sister act that was popular in the ’30s, ’40s and ’50s; Yiddish game shows, a commercial for Stanton Street Clothiers sung by Yiddish Theater heart-throb Moishe Oysher, and WEVD radio dramas produced by Nuchem Stutchkoff, a well-known Yiddish writer.

Ironically, Henry Sapoznik approached WEVD in 1978 asking if there were any recordings of the old programs. He was doing research on klezmer music at the time and when he asked a popular WEVD host whether the vintage broadcasts had been saved, he was told, “We threw all that garbage out.”

giving birthday greetings and talking to listeners. "Idolos" slogan still used. KFRE and possible other SS stations noted underneath. [TH*CA]

950 **MEXICO XEKAM, Tijuana** 2140 11/10. Noted w/DC all afternoon. Returned later w/somewhat distorted signal. Station takes many SPs, most of them currently during the day. [TH*CA]

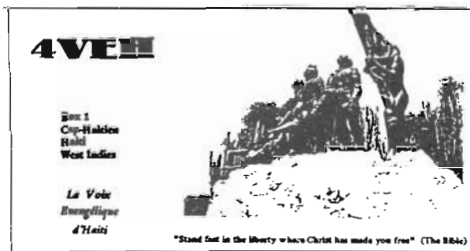

1040 **MEXICO XEBBB, Guadalajara** (tent) 0740 11/11. Not sure, but thought I caught their "Energía 10-40" slogan here u/XEHEF. If so, would mean that they're no longer a daytimer. Has anyone else logged this one? [TH*CA]



1170 **MEXICO XEIB, Caborca** 0355 11/11. ID by M, 1kw mention poking right through local KCBQ. Since this station is indeed on the air, we know that XESN-1180 "R. Sonora" is not in Caborca (ex-1250) after all, but somewhere else in Sonora. Has anyone heard XESN lately? [TH*CA]

1200 **MEXICO XEWT, Culiacan** 0050 11/11. Fair, w/Juventud format mixing w/WDAI. ID @ 0056: "XEWT, 1200 khz, 1 kw de potencia, desde Culiacan, Sinaloa. Esta es la nueva WT, el 1200 de su radio." Frequent use of "La nueva WT" slogan. Had assumed this station didn't exist, as the calls have been in use in Tijuana (TV channel 12) for at least 15 years. S/off seems to be 0300. [TH*CA]

NRC Common Abbreviations

The abbreviations used by the National Radio Club, as well as the radio hobby in general, are many and vary in meaning from club to club. They may even be expressed differently from one part of a magazine to another. To help standardize the several thousand abbreviations, we have taken those most commonly used (or supposed to be) in the NRC and put them in this handy list. It is suggested that wherever possible use the full length of the word instead of the abbreviations. There will be times, however, when article or column space will dictate otherwise. Please note that the meanings will apply only to these abbreviations when used in any NRC publication or product.

- AD** Advertisement or commercial
AN All Night
AM Amplitude Modulation. See BCB.
 BCB Broadcast Band. (540-1700KHz US) (530-1600KHz Canada)
 MW Medium Wave. See BCB.
BBC British Broadcasting Corporation
CBC Canadian Broadcasting Corporation
CRTC Canadian Radio Television Commission. The Canadian equivalent to the United States' FCC.
DX Long Distance listening
ET Equipment Test. A station testing some aspect of its physical equipment, often at a time it is not usually on the air. Normally between midnight and 5am.
ER Election returns.
f/c Frequency check. A test conducted to measure a station's frequency to assure it is within the FCC's specifications.
r/c Regular check. A regularly scheduled frequency check. normally scheduled once a year
Freq Frequency
FM Frequency Modulation, channels for FM broadcast begin at 88.1 MHz and continue in steps of 200 Khz through 107.9 MHz.
FCC Federal Communications Commission. The federal governing body that is responsible for regulating all radio and TV stations in the United States, as well as anything else that radiates a radio frequency.
Het Heterodyne. Interference caused to one station by another on a very nearby frequency. (example: a station on 891KHz interfering with one on 890KHz). This type of interference is normally heard in the form of an audible tone.
SAH Sub-audible heterodyne. Although

this type of interference often is un audible it still can cause the station being listened to, to be of poorer listening quality.

- OC** Open carrier. The station has left its transmitter on the air but with no audio present or detected.
ID Identification. Such as call letters, station slogan, or location.
Legal ID In the United States, the call letters and city of license is required to be given at the top of the hour, +/- five minutes.
VID Voice Identification. This is the normal mode that an ID is given in, usually announced by a radio personality (DJ) or a prerecorded announcement tape.
SID Singing Identification. An ID given in the form of a jingle. Perhaps the most difficult of all ID types to hear when mixed with static and other interference.
CID Code Identification. Morse Code is used to give the stations ID, normally at a rate between 5 and 12 words per minute.
unID Unidentified station. Not enough was heard to really get a good solid ID on the station you were listening to.
jx Jingle. Often used as an informal ID. Most stations have them to help their listener remember and identify the station. Examples: "54 Rock", "Magic 61", "Power 13". Many that simulcast their FM use jingles such as: "Y-106", "Magic 100", "Rock 101".
IRC International Reply Coupon.
KHz Kilohertz
Kcs Kilocycles. The old term used to identify the frequency in thousands of cycles per second.
MHz Megahertz
Mcs Megacycles. The old term used to identify the frequency in millions of cycles per second.
MX Music
NET Network
NX News
SSB Star Spangled Banner. U.S. national anthem or may mean Single Side Band
OhC Oh Canada. Canada's national anthem.
PSRA Pre-SunRise Authority. FCC authorization for a daytime station to sign on-the-air at 6am, even if it is still dark, usually at a lower power. May also apply to full time stations using a lower power but on their daytime antenna pattern.
PSSA Post-SunSet Authority. FCC authorization to operate after local sunset, with lower power, and often for limited times.
// Parallel to, or the same as. Such as an

AM station carrying the same programming as an FM station.

QSL Taken from the Amateur Radio "Q abbreviations" meaning 'verification'. The verification can be in the form of a postcard or letter from the station saying that the programming you heard was theirs.

QRM Taken from the Amateur Radio "Q abbreviations" meaning 'man-made interference'. Such as the noise heard from a fish tank heater, light dimmer, TV set, computer, video game.

QRN Taken from the Amateur Radio "Q abbreviations" meaning 'natural interference'. such as fading, atmospheric static or noise, or lightning.

QTH Taken from the Amateur Radio "Q abbreviations" meaning 'location'. Normally used to identify the station's city of license. Or the DX'er's home location.

r/s Regular service. Part of a regularly scheduled program period as opposed to a special or unusual schedule.

SAT Satellite

SINPO Signal/Intelligibility/Noise/Propagation/Overall rating. This abbreviation is used in the shortwave world and NOT in the AM/FM Broadcast band world.

Instead, the following apply:

Excellent (XLNT): Local station signal; no noise; no interference.

Very Poor: Barely audible at best; below or at the noise floor; very difficult, if not impossible to identify the exact station being heard; mixed with others on same frequency; strong interference from stations on the same or nearby frequencies.

Very Good: Near local station signal strength; very little if any noise; no interference from other stations on the frequency.

Good: Some noise with audio; little interference from other stations.

Fair: Audible; some noise heard; some interference with other stations on the frequency; slight, if any interference from strong stations on nearby frequencies.

Poor: Barely audible; at or just above the noise floor; strong interference from stations on the same or nearby frequencies.

SKED Schedule

Skip The effect of radio signals reflecting from the ionized layers of the ionosphere.

SP Silent Period. A period of time when the station is off the air, combined with a time

period. Example: SP:0100-0500 indicates the station is off from 1 to 5am)

S/on Sign-on. When station starts its broadcast day.

S/off Sign-off. When station ends its broadcast day.

\$ (Dollar sign) indicates stereo.

room or better yet, turning it off.

PCI Personal Computer Interference (or video game). Caused by the frequencies created by the personal computer system and can be any part of the computer system, from the monitor, printer, to the computer or hard drive. Same cures work here as with the television.

TT Test Tone. A tone, often 1000KHz, used to test station equipment.

SASE Self-addressed stamped envelope. To be sent out of courtesy, to a column editor or club offices or when you want them to reply to your questions. Or to a station in the case of a reception report. The stamp should be affixed

to the envelope.

CPC Courtesy Programs Committee. A National Radio Club committee made up of volunteers who contact normally hard-to-hear or daytime-only stations to try to arrange a special test transmission at night when most of us listeners may have a better chance of hearing that station.

Test A CPC Test occurs when a station agrees to put on a special broadcast at a prearranged time as requested by the NRC CPC committee.

v/s Verification signer. The person who signs the reception report at the station.

Formats: This simplified list should cover most formats adequately. However, every station will use its own version, and exceptions to any format are common. Even opinions will differ on the same songs. Please note that only these abbreviation meanings will apply when used in any NRC publication or product.

“:” indicates a combination of formats or language and format, e.g. = SS:REL would indicate that the station has religious programming in spanish.

“/” indicates more than one format is used during different times of a stations broadcast day. e.g. C&W/CHR would indicate that the station has a C&W block and a CHR block.

n = night format, when used with a format example: C&Wd/ACn

d = day format, when used with a format or AC/CHR/TLKn

C&W Country & Western: Broad coverage of country/western.

CWM Modern Country: A narrower version of C&W, mostly current hits.

BLG Bluegrass: Just as the title indicates.

FLK Folk Music: Just as the title indicates.

R&R Rock and Roll: A very broad selection of rock and roll music, singles and album cuts.

AOR Album Oriented Rock: Stresses the most popular cuts from current and past hit rock albums.

ROK Loud Hard Rock: The heavy metal brand of rock.

WAV New Wave: Approximately the same as ROK, newest groups.

NAGE New Age: A blend of jazz, EZL, with a touch of CLA thrown in. Heavy use of synthesizers.

CHR Contemporary Hit Radio: Formally Top40. Based on the most popular music of the day, songs selected for mass appeal with at least 75% being current hits. Jingles and sweepers are common.

AC Adult Contemporary: Middle of the road

rock, softer rock, featuring songs from 70s thru today. Target age group is 25-49.

OLD Oldies: Music which was once popular (CHR, ROK, AC) and normally prior to 1980. Target age group is 35-49.

CLA Classical Music: Fine arts programming.
EZL Easy Listening: Also includes Beautiful Music, many cuts from the past (50s/60s) and may include many instrumentals.

NOS Nostalgia: Adult Standards. A broader selection of the EZL format

BBD Big Band Music: Limited to music from the 30s,40s & 50s.

MYL Music of Your Life: A copyrighted feature format program (Al Ham Productions, Inc.), satellite feed, more network than format, softer 40s thru early 70s songs.

SHOW Show tunes: Music taken from Broadway and off-Broadway productions.

EDU Educational: Often non-commercial. Public radio type station.

KID Children: Programming aimed at kids under 15 years old.

ETH Ethnic: Music features aimed at a localized ethnic group.

GOS Gospel: Heavy on gospel music with little paid religious programming.

REL Religion: Heavy on paid time preachers. Example: The World Tomorrow.

INFO Information: Little music, call-in or panel discussion type shows, public information programs, with a mix of business and sports thrown in as well.

BIZ Business oriented: Stock market, world of business/finance features.

NWS All News: Features local and national news continuously.

SPT Sports: Programming is mainly sports, all types.

TIS Travel/Tourist Information Station: Basically a continuous commercial, highlighting the areas tourist attractions and businesses for the traveler/visitor.

UC Urban Contemporary: Formerly known as “B:” Soul, Disco, Rhythm and Blues are all covered by this category. The common ground is that it serves the Black community plus an attraction to the general audience. Content varies widely from station to station using this format.

JAZ Jazz: A narrow version of the UC format.

R&B Rhythm and Blues: A narrow version of the UC format.

VAR Variety: A mix of any or all of the above formats. This grab bag format is for the small station that wants to please everyone in the community in which it broadcasts.

Networks: Network or audio news services, including state, provincial, and regional networks. These are:

WKLV-AM Ch. 11 plan dismissed

A financial reorganization plan filed by the owners of silent local radio station WKLV-AM has been dismissed, leaving the station's landlord free to sell equipment to pay off several thousand dollars in past-due rent.

Miami-based Biscayne Broadcasting Co.'s Chapter 11 case was filed in Tampa in March to protect the company from creditor's claims.

"It's a possibility we'll get paid back" by selling the equipment, said building owner Don Miller of Miller Enterprises, 1111 Third Ave. W.

Station offices at the Bradenton Memorial Pier have been vacant since June, when the 1,000-watt, 1490-AM station unexpectedly went off the air and General Manager Tony Lupu abruptly left town.

The offices, with expansive views of the Manatee River, may be used as a banquet room for The Pier restaurant, Miller said, or might be rented as another office.

No buyers with the required \$75,000 down payment on the \$250,000 to \$300,000 sales price have shown an interest in the frequency, Sarasota broker Stan Raymond said, adding the station would probably show a loss for the first six months after purchase.

Radio station purchase prices are based in part on advertising revenues, and being off the air has put WKLV in an undesirable position, local broadcasters say.

The station's major problem was a insufficient number of capable salespeople, Raymond said.

The station's books showed about \$18,000 per month in advertising income, while only about \$4,000 per month was actually collected, he said.

WKLV has other disgruntled local customers, among them Conley Buick, 800 Cortez Road, which bought radio time on the station through a Chicago marketing firm, which was never told the station was going off the air and was up for sale, spokesman Steve Salkos of the marketing firm said.

Biscayne still holds the 1490-AM frequency, and has not notified the Federal Communications Commission that it is off the air, an FCC spokeswoman said on Monday.

"If (Biscayne) abandons it, someone else can claim it," Raymond said. The station's license expires in 1996.

WTRL-AM held the frequency at the historic pier for 44 years prior to the sale to Biscayne in October 1988.

Biscayne's principals, Miami attorney Milton Wallace, who owns 90 percent of the station, and Miami banker Mark Davis, who owns 10 percent, did not return repeated telephone calls, nor did their Bradenton attorney, Turner Matthews.
