**MEDIUM WAVE RAMBLINGS**

- Recent Club-joiner **Gil Chesney** of Wilkes-Barre, PA took time to send in his initial report. And we welcome him! Now to get all the rest of you to send in your DX for all the world to see.
- **Kermit Geary** notes that the CBC Network (CBL-740, CBM-940, CBE-1550, etc.), per anct, is AN7 for the duration of the Persian Gulf war, carrying a CLA mx request pgm and nx on the hour. *There goes the chance to log CHCM-740 and other goodies.*
- I'm afraid I've opened a *Pandora's Box* when publishing the recent list of Non-Directional Beacon stations (Issue 13). I've received correspondence about NDBs from no less than 6 members, detailing their NDB activities and all the stations I missed in my list. I in no way inferred that my list was complete. Remember, I started from scratch. Zero. Zilch. So with the reference material I had, in limited time, the list was prepared. Some of the stations logged by the above-mentioned reporters do not exist any longer. I checked. And...some of the stations reported are not NDBs at all. They are what are called 'markers', which lie inline with an airport's runway giving a positive position indication to the pilot when immediately overhead. These usually have 25 watts and are supposed to shoot straight up. NDB's, in North America are a dinosaur, as far as the airplane business is concerned. But will remain a vital part of navigation in other parts of the world for some time. I did some more research. Also, **Perry Crabil** writes to say that U.S. NDB stations are being moved from the 1600-1700 range to accommodate the expansion of the MW band. Some will now operate in the 1900-2000 kHz portion of the 160 meter Ham band, while others are expected to move to from 195-550 kHz region. And for anyone interested, The Aero/Marine Beacon Guide is available for \$15 postpaid in the U.S., and of course, others pay more...\$20. Orders should be sent to: Ken Stryker, 2856-G Toughy Avenue, Chicago, IL 60645. An updater will be included with the guide. Mention the NRC! And it won't take much persuasion for me to turn the NDB project (if there is one) over to anyone willing to volunteer.

Above you'll see the first known FM TISes, it is expected that they will not be the last. FM is in some ways better suited for TIS broadcasting than AM, especially because of its short-distance properties. Twenty years ago, when the first TISes went on the air, there were very few cars with AM/FM radios. Now, virtually all new cars and trucks are sold with AM/FM radios, and many of the AM radios in older cars have been replaced.

Also above are the first known TISes outside the U.S. and Canada. They operate on the European low-power channels and their programming is much like their North American counterparts. I hope that the NRC members in England will supply information on any more TIS stations in addition to the new privately-owned commercial stations receiving licenses.

# Moose, Maltais and Memories

## WKBR Radio Leaves Behind a Legacy

**R**EMEMBER the time WKBR Disc Jockey Norm Bailey told Manchester listeners he saw a moose floating by on an ice flow in the Merrimack River? The broadcast brought droves of curious animal lovers to the old Amoskeag Bridge, creating a huge traffic jam. The stunt also brought an angry game warden who didn't appreciate the hoax perpetrated by Bailey, who is now deceased, but fondly remembered.

The story from the late '50s is being re-told now that 1250 on the AM dial signed off the air Monday at 4:33 p.m., ending a 45-year tenure on New Hampshire airwaves.

When the studio went dark, so did a little piece of a lot of hearts.

"Norm was sitting there one morning a little bit bored, asking himself what can I do as he watched pieces of ice flowing over the Amoskeag Falls. All of a sudden it hit: 'My God, there's a moose on one of the ice flows coming down the river,' he told his listeners. The phones started to light up," said Donn Parker, a former station manager at WKBR.

Parker, 59, who owns a radio station and advertising agency in Leominster, Mass., yesterday recalled his 17 years with the station that was number one in Manchester for many years.

Like many of the station's former personalities, Parker was saddened that WKBR closed up shop after negotiations with a potential buyer failed because of the economy and uncertainty over the Gulf crisis.

The Weston Properties Limited Partnership bought the station in November of 1987, but the station's real heyday ended in the early 1980s.

"I cried. It was such a great, great radio station," Parker said.

He left in 1979, but had no regrets about deciding to leave one of the top 10 radio stations in the country to raise five children in New Hampshire, all on a handshake with one of the former owners of WKBR, Ralph Gottlieb.

There were many great moments for the station known for its dedication to the people and community of Manchester. If there was a fire or major catastrophe, people knew WKBR would be there. If they lost their dog or cat, they called WKBR.

There were talk shows and Joe Maltais' French program and lots of pizzazz and personality.

Listeners showed their appreciation in return with intense loyalty.

"I'd say something like I wish I had a pizza and somebody would drive one up. It got to the point my boss would say, 'You've got to stop.' It was fun," said Eddie B. Baker, also known as "Elm Street Eddie" and the "King of the Queen City" when he was spinning platters at WKBR beginning in 1964.

Baker, 51, now works for the highway department in Lawrence, Mass., and plays the piano from April to November at the Sidewalk Cafe in Salisbury Beach, Mass., still concentrating on that good old rock and roll.

Baker charmed his audience for four days straight once and faked falling asleep so he could finally go home even though he didn't break the record for the longest-running show.

"We were the people in the city. WKBR meant something. We were the Big K," Baker said.

It was radio legends like Baker, Parker and Gary LaPierre, now of WBZ radio in Boston, and Bill Morrissey, who went on to become PSNH's public affairs coordinator, and a long list of others that made disc jockey Ernie Jenkins just love walking in the doors to do his morning show.

"I grew up listening to WKBR and I'd think, here I am at WKBR. If I was still in high school,

I'd be the king of West High," said Jenkins, a Manchester native, who like the rest of the station's staff lost his job Monday.

Jenkins, 43, started listening to WKBR when he was 3 years old and remembered being weaned on the Beatles via one of his heroes, Eddie B. Baker, who was also known as Eddie "Beatles" Baker.

The abrupt goodbye left some disc jockeys no chance to say goodbye. Joe Maltais told his

listeners in French on his last broadcast Sunday that he was praying for peace. He didn't know then he wouldn't greet them again when the outcome is known.

Al Blake Jr., general manager of WGIR radio, said his station is interested in broadcasting the Red Sox games now that WKBR is gone, but it is too early to say if it will get the contract.

Blake started his career at WKBR where his father, Al Blake Sr., worked for many years.

# Tuning In to the Desert

**Somewhere in SAUDI ARABIA** Imagine writing down a list of your favorite songs and taking it to a drive-through at the local radio station instead of calling in your requests.

Or how about tuning into Shadow Stevens' *American Top 40* countdown in the morning, *American Country Countdown* in the afternoon and an oldies show in the evening—all on the same station?

Sounds like radio from out of this world?

More likely, it's just a day in the life of the Desert Shield Network, a low-power local radio service set up for the nearly 200,000 American soldiers stationed in Saudi Arabia.

Three radio stations have been established in the country as of 12 August by the Armed Forces Radio and Television Service, a division of the Department of Defense. Each delivers information, news and entertainment programming 24 hours a day.

"Our mission is to get news and local information out to the troops," said Lt. Col. Ray Shepherd, operations officer with the Armed Forces Radio and Television Service, who helped set up the station overseas.

But the broadcasts also serve another, equally vital mission. According to Shepherd, they help boost morale.

"The main purpose is getting out whatever the commander in the field wants to," he said. "But morale and entertainment are the hooks in terms of getting people to listen to the information."

The stations broadcast out of 8'x12' standard military shelters, capable of transmitting both radio and television, according to Robert Young, director of engineering for Navy Broadcasting. The air-conditioned units can be transported by truck or airplane.

Most are equipped with Studer CD players, Broadcast Electronics cart machines, Teac reel-to-reel players and turntables, along with ½" Beta equipment for TV, he said.

Most Armed Forces remote stations are processed through a 50 W transmitter (100 W for television), using a 120' transportable tower that reaches a seven- or eight-mile radius.

"For some of the locations, we've been

putting antennas on anything we could mount them on," Young said. "We had one in a soccer stadium in the middle of the grandstands. It's not the greatest coverage in the world, but we're getting it to the troops."

For the largest of the three Saudi stations, however, the signal is pumped through a 1.5 kW transmitter to an existing 1000' radio tower. This station, which reaches the majority of the troops, covers 100 miles. The two smaller Armed Forces stations there operate under the traditional guidelines.

Each employs three broadcasters and one engineer. Equipment and some of the staff are provided by Navy Broadcasting. Staff also are contributed by the Army and Air Force, Shepherd said.

Each of the stations must obtain permission from host countries to sign on, and frequencies are assigned as available. In all, Armed Forces Radio is transmitted in 130 countries.

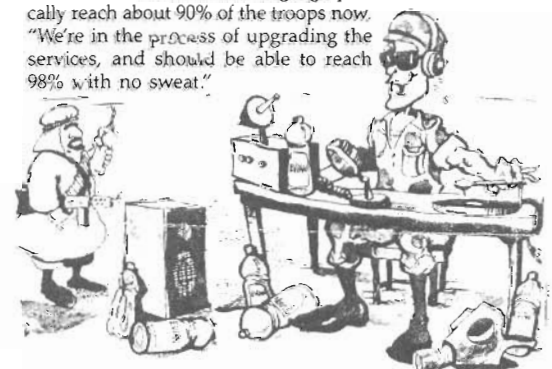
A weekly broadcast in Saudi Arabia typically consists of about six or seven hours or original programming daily, including local news and announcements, and rock, urban and country music played from records, reel-to-reel and Century 21 packaged compact discs.

Non-original programming includes regular national news fed by satellite, along with such pre-recorded domestic staples as *American Top 40*, *Rick Dees Weekly Top 40*, *American Country Countdown* and a syndicated oldies show.

The stations also air one- and two-hour programming blocks provided by stateside stations across the United States. Submitted shows are reviewed and approved for troop consumption in Los Angeles and sent to Saudi Arabia.

Collins said the broadcasts geographically reach about 90% of the troops now. "We're in the process of upgrading the services, and should be able to reach 98% with no sweat."

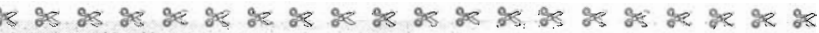
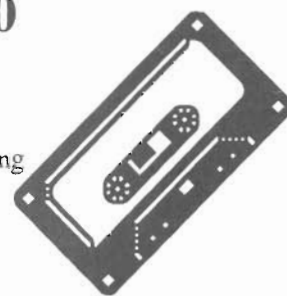
