


Radio trivia buffs will tell you that the answer is WMAS, which first signed on the air on 1420 khs on October 4, 1932. Only WBS, which soon moved to Boston, and WBS, which springfield repeater with no local programming, preceded wars. WBSA's longwire antenna is still strung between two lit towers atop a factory just northeast of downtown springfield.

WHAS owner albert 8. Noffet began his operation upon receiving permission from the FCC, from the old Metel Charles, now the Standhaven, on Chestnut Street in downtown Springfield. The station's 100 watt signal, fed from a Western Electric transmitter, radiated from a longwire antenna on the roof of the hotel. In the hotel's upper floors were located two studios, offices, and a record cutting room - where WHAS could record live performances for later proadcasts:

WAAS' call stood not for Massachusetts, but for owner Moffat, Albert &. In 1939, Mr. Noffat decided to increase power to 250 watts, and built a 52 ton (shipping weight, according to the invoice), 352 foot high self supporting tower, in a field off West Street, next to the west bank of the Connecticut River. This tower graced the center outfield to Pynchon Park, a minor league ball field. May well hit ball that cleared the fence around the transmitter became a home run. Pynchon Park, and the minor league team that called it home have long faded into Apringfield history, replaced by a sprawling steakhouse.

In 1941, WARS advanced up the dial to 1450 khz, as part of the 1941 NARBA frequency reallocation. In 1947, WARS began its FM operation.

In 1978 music lowers Bob Lappin and Al tam bought the stations. MY Lappin, a world removn planist, and the conductor of the Palm Beach Pops, dropped the disco format on WHAS-PH and the conducty music on WHAS-1450. In fact, callers phoning WHAS in the country music days would be greeted with "Howdy, Partner, WHAS".

The MYL tapes had been prepared in the studios of WDJZ - 1830, Bridgeport, CT., but WMAB beat the Bridgeport station in being the first station in the country to air the format and the tapes. The format was an instant success in the Pioneer Walley creating a dedicated audience. However, 14 years later, in late 1993, realising that the MYL audience was siging, and passing on with increasing rapidity, station menagement decided to replace it with the somewhat more youthful satellite - fed "Stardust" format, This is augmented by Mutual News on the hour and, on Sundays, numerous syndicated music shows.

The need for larger facilities in the early 1950's prompted WHAS to build single story building on West Street at its tower site. In 1953, the station moved to its present home, which contains two production studios, the PM control room, (for "PM-95 - The Best Mix"), and the AM control room. Part of the complex was originally a huge studio - capable of accommodating a small orthestrai. Offices and space for the CE are also in the building.

WANS 1000 watt dates MY1 solid state transmitter, back up transmitter, and a 25 KW Harris model for the FM are in a cinder block building at the base of the AM - FM tower. This building also has a work area and living space for the engineer.

The editor thanks WMAS AM and PM CE Chuck Herlihy for all of his help in the preparation of this station profile. Mr. Herlihy is a wealth of information on springfield area radio, and his willingness to share it is very appreciated. WNAS, Springfield's oldest radio station, and the station that first gave America the Music of Your Life format (which began the trend toward big band, nostalgia and adult standard formats) is indeed an important part of the history and life of the Springfield - Chicopes - Holyoke area.
