Dear Friend,

It is, indeed, a great pleasure for me to send you an answer confirming the reception of our program in the night of November 8, 1956. All the facts listed in your letter are correct. Indeed, we are very pleased to receive a letter confirming that our broadcast installations are efficient. I confess that being an announcer, I was compelled to refer to the technical knowledge of the chief operator Mr Abraham Fougy and so for further informations.

Our Broadcasting Station is rather a very little one compared to the 50 Kilowatts installations in the U.S. A. In fact, our transmitter is a modified GATES 250 G. Y. We employ a pair of 833's at our final stage. They feed a 800 Watts signal to an half wave inverted L antenna in the East-West direction. All our equipment is made by Gates company. Except pick-up. We are very pleased, once again, to have contacted you and I suppose that like my former correspondents, you are a specialist listener in the only standard broadcast band. I agree that it is a hobby very instructive and very profitable and although I am not a radio specialist, I like to spend long minutes of foreign broadcast listening. Haiti is a french speaking country though situated in the Caribbean are a just between the two Americas. - So Almost all young Haitians profess a marked tendency towards English or Spanish. For me I'm studying the English language and would

be so happy to find a correspondent in you,
Allow me to introduce myself to you. I am an-
nouncer at Radio Port-au-Prince, but I am
a student at the University of P-au-P in
The faculty of Law. I am also a Book
keeper.



Dear DX Listener,

We were delighted to get your letter and the report of reception of our 760 khz signal up there 1600 miles away to the north, on the evening of Nov. 29th.


Yes, we have increased our power considerably on that frequency. The transmitter serves the south-western part of Haiti, and is located 6 miles SW of Cayes on the south shore in rice paddies. It has been a 1,000 watt transmitter using 833 A tubes ever since it went on the air in 1958. The tower in use was 240 ft. high. We have just installed a new transmitter capable of 25,000 watts output, with a second tower 250 ft. high, phased so that we have a cardioid pattern with the lobes off to the west and east just a little heavier than to the front or north. We have been running through the month of November at about 7,000 watts output, and since Dec. 6th. at about 13,000 watts. We would like to run at full power, but the electric power costs and our financial situation make it necessary that we use no more than absolutely necessary. We have run some tests at full 20,000 watts or more, and it is just possible that you heard us when we were running full throttle. I just was informed this evening that we have been having some transmitter problems, blowing out capacitors in our final tank circuit, but will have to see our maintenance engineer (who by the way came to Port au Prince today, but I cannot talk to him because there are no telephones in this part of the city) before I have the details. The antenna gain almost doubles the effective power of our transmitter, so you may well have occasion to hear us again in the next few days. We will likely be on all night Christmas Eve as well as New Years Eve, and possibly at full power. Announcements may be made in english as well as in french.

I looked up the information you said you copied on Nov. 29, 1971 from 6:45-7:50 pm on our program log a few minutes ago, and we confirm your reported reception. Thank you for the report indeed.

You will see from the enclosed information that we operate a missionary educational and cultural radio network, with four AM transmitters, two FM, and six mountain top FM transistorized relay stations. That enables us to simulcast from either our studio at our Bible Institute at Cayes (our original installation of 1958), or from these studios at Port au Prince which we opened in 1964 following the hurricane which tore up our Cayes installations. We are on the air 18 hrs. daily, all in french and creole except for the 10 - 11 pm english language block. Eventually, - and perhaps before the end of 1972, we would like to provide an AM - FM english language outlet for the 25,000 or more people of the Port au Prince area who understand english. This is a work of love in the Lord Jesus name, and for His sake. Thus we operate as a public service, make no paid announcements, though we try to promote every kind of good, as we testify to His great work of paying our debt of sin when He died on the cross, and ask our listeners to trust Him with every problem, specially their guilt problem, since He lives and cares. Naturally we have to be very economical, have people who work not for what they can get out of it now. Just now our 5,000 watts is the most powerful in the capital also, though not the most popular. And this is a great priviledge!

Let us hear from you again, Kermit, and thank you again for your good report.



Dear Kermit

I guess I'm supposed to be gloomy, down-at-the-mouth, pessimistic. All the predictions seem to say that 1981 will be a year full of woes, both here in Haiti and around the world. Let alone the forecast for the two closing decades of the century - and of this millenium! Yet I somehow feel like St. Augustine as he tranquilly wrote his masterpiece "The City of God", while the Visigoths were besieging the gates of Hippo, his see city. For in that work he speaks long of the Finger of God that in broad lines directs human destiny. Oh, he leaves us with our freedom: the bad are free to work their meanness, and the good to work for a better world - but after Calvary and Easter, Evil cannot really win, in fact, has been roundly defeated for ever. Christ is Lord! And he has a game plan. And if we could see it, we would marvel at the beauty and the wisdom of it. We would never be defeatist again.

So with a heart full of confidence and faith in that Plan, I face 1981. Pessimism may be for others, not for me. The Church seems to be almost the only independent voice left. Please pray for me and the Radio Soleil staff that we may walk the narrow line between valor and prudence.

In closing, thank you for your holiday greetings and your generosity to me. You are such a part of the successes - humble as they are - of my missionary life.

La Direction de Radio Nouveau Monde (R.N.M.) est fière de Vous répondre aujourd'hui, après Votre réponse d'écoute, dont Vous nous aviez fait part, et nous en sommes heureux, et disposer de collaborer avec Vous.

En Cette occasion; nous prenons plaisir de Vous faire connaître en partie le caractère de RADIO NOUVEAU MONDE (R.N.M.).

RADIO NOUVEAU MONDE (R.N.M./4RNM) a vu le jour 20 Juin 1969 à 09h00 du matin (l'heure d'Haiti), à Port-Au-Prince, Notre Capitale à côté de la Place de l'hotel de Ville #12, Rue des Fenêts-Port.

R.n.m. travaille sur deux (2) fréquences Am et Fm; Le Am (Modulation de fréquence) émet sur 910 Khzt et 895 Khzt, mais travaille pour le moment sur le 895 Khzt et une longueur de 330 mètres avec une puissance de sortie de 14 Kilowatts, tandis que le F.M (fréquence modulée) fonctionne sur 96.9 avec une sortie de 1.000 Watts (1 Kilowatts) sur une longueur de 100 mètres.

Nous avons deux (2) stations mobiles; l'une pour le reportage et l'autre pour le signal de liaison entre le A.M avec les studios, l'émetteur de A.M est situé à 4 kilomètres de la Capitale à Damien (Route N° 1 du Nord) et le Fm en Ville-Les Stations mobiles travaillent sur 153.2 et 154.6.

Radio Nouveau Monde (R.N.M.) auparavant était une station Gouvernementale, mais depuis l'ouverture de Radio Nationale, 4VRD, Elle devient une station Commerciale et Culturelle et se compose de 18 Membres (omis le Journal LE NOUVEAU MONDE).

Notre émetteur de A.M est de la marque COLLINS du type EM-112 et le F.M toujours de la même marque du type M-21 respectivement de 14 Kilowatts et 16 amp, et le F.M de 1 kilowatts de 10 amp, en Septembre prochain nous travaillerons en F.M et F.M stéréo (96.8 Mghz) et le jour de Notre Anniversaire le 20 Juin 78, Nous émetrons sur 10 Kilowatts afin que les Auditeurs de l'étrangers puissent mieux nous capter (se sera à 12h00 l'heure d'Haiti), mais pour le moment notre puissance est de 5 kilowatts.

Nous nous excusons auprès de Vous Cher Ami de Vous avoir répondu en notre langue car la traduction exige que toutes lettres qui viennent de l'étranger doivent répondre en FRANCAIS, c'est une loi en HAITI pourvu que c'est dans la RADIO.

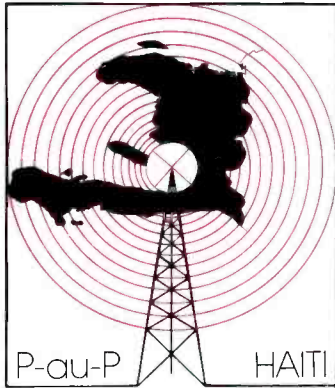

The report is absolutely correct and accurate in every aspect.

Our transmitters are maintained in good shape by experienced technicians.

For technical information, we operate at 20KW on three directional towers; the signal is shaped to cover the entire haitian territory, and although this does not happen very often, we do receive occasionally reports from people in the States and the surrounding Islands.

Unfortunately, we do not have an official QSL card, the reason for this is that our short wave facilities have not yet been set up, but in a very near future, you will be able to receive our Station on the frequencies listed on that page.
