Your letter of March 4th has been turned over to me. I am amazed that our signal skipped that far! I also didn't realize there were that many DX ers out there anymore. Haven't had much DX mail lately.

As you are probably aware, WISP's daytime power is only 1000 watts and at night we reduce to 250 watts as do all class IV AM stations. The other N.C. station you mentioned, WFAI in Fayetteville is also 1000/250 I know cause I worked there also many years ago, from 1958 till 1961.

This is to confirm your reception, as the commercial you heard was for a firm called "Baker Brothers."

WISP has been known for years as WISPy, so it can be pronounced. The Dragnet you heard was part of our WISPy Little Theatre presentation, which airs each weeknight at 5:30---6PM. We feature a different old radio show each night of the week. Monday's it's The Jack Benny Show. Tuesday's Gunsmoke. Wednesdays Fibber McGee & Molly of Thursday we broadcast Dragnet and Friday's it's The Life of Riley. So as you can see, the old radio shows are alive and well here at WISP.

Interesting to read about your listening equipment. Especially the part about the 175 foot well.

Incidently, you might be interested in the bulk of our programming other than old radio. We are broadcasting a music format called "Hit Parade." It is sort of a unique blend of music from as far back at the mid 40's right up to some of the better music of today. All the way from Frank Sinatra to the contemporary group Air Supply.

We are using Western Electric equipment, 310B transmitter, 23B speech console, saltshaker microphones, and RCA turntables. The antenna is a Blaw-Knox, onehundred seventy-five foot vertical.

The transmitter of WCNC is located about one mile from down town Elizabeth City on the outskirts of Disimal Swamp, and about twenty miles from the Atlantic seacoast. Elizabeth City has appopulation of approximately fifteen thousand, located in the extreme northeastern part of the state, about thirty miles from the Virginia line, fifty miles from Norfolk, Virginia, our mearest large town. Approximately seventy miles South of the City is located Roanoke, Island, where the Lost Colony was founded and the forst white settlement in America. It was here that Virginia Dare was born.

Dear DX Friend:

It was a real pleasure to receive your letter reporting reception of WGBG. We have checked your report against our program and transmitter logue, and find it to be correct. This letter serves to verify your reception of the station 6:01 A.M., EWT, May 2, 1942.

The transmitter and studios of WGBG are located in a new modernistic building designed especially for broadcasting purposes. We are located south of Buffalo Creek, 2 miles south of Greensboro proper. Our ground system, which is laid in a low swampy area, consists of 180 radiales, 250 feet long. We have approximately 900 square feet of hardware cloth directly under the tower. The 235-foot Blaw Knox vertical radiator is fed at all four legs. The transmitter is a Western Electric, 1 Kilowatt, type 443-Al. Our speech equipment is a Gates Console, with associated 5-C Speech Racks. Western Electric Combination Vertical, Lateral Pickups are used in connection with two Dual Speed Presto Turn-Tables. RCA Velocity Mikes are used in all studios.

All in all, we believe we have one of the best-equipped and most modern Radio Stations in the South. We are very proud of our coverage, which reports seem to indicate is far better than the average l-Kilowatt Station.

If at any time in the future you should be passing through Greensboro, do not hesitate to stop by and look over the Studios and Plant. All visitors are assured a hearty welcome. Of course, our control and transmitting rooms are closed to all persons, except employees, due to Wartime restrictions. However, each piece of equipment has been arranged so you may view it from a large window from the outside.

At the present time, we do not have a regular monitor schedule. We will be on the air at various times in early hours, for test broadcasts, or frequency check programs. Our regular schedule is from 6:00 A.M. to 7:30 P.M. We will be happy to hear from you at any time with any comments you might wish to make regarding reception.

I am happy to confirm your listening report of December 24, 1982, Christmas Eve. I was even happier, although surprised, when I checked the Operating Log, and verified the fact that WAME changed patterns at the correct time (5:15 for the month of December Day to Night).

WAME operates on 1480 with 5,000 watts day and night, DA-2. Our daytime pattern looks like a figure 8, with a fatter bottom than top, and the sides are not nearly as compressed as a figure 8 would be. Our nighttime pattern is the nightmare. The pattern is virtually eliminated to the north (there are 5 minor lobes and 6 nulls, the deepest null being on the shoulder of the major lobe, and having no more than 10 watts in it). WAME uses a four tower in line array, and uses all four towers, day and night. In fact, one tower in the night pattern is a negative tower. This means that that tower is receiving the signal from the other towers, and feeds it back into the system, to be redistributed. In our case, that fourth tower has about 250 watts in it, that gets redistributed.

Again, I am happy to confirm your listening report, and the comments about the audio quality were greatly appreciated. If you hear us again, drop us a line, or if you are in Charlotte, please stop by.

Thank you very much for your nice remarks about our station. We have worked hard to make it what you say we have. I wanted to answer your letter sooner, but it seemed that I just could not do it. We had some bad luck the morning that you heard us. The HV plate transformer shorted and put us off the air at 3:28 AM. It was Thursday morning of the next week before we could get back on for test. We had to have it rewound.

I know you are interested in the equipment we have so I'll give you some dope on it. have a Temco Model 250 GSC Communications Transmitter, modified for Broadcast service. We also have a REL Console and a Raytheon RL-10 Limiting Amplifier. Our tower is a triangular welded, uniform cross section Fisher 275 ft. high. On top of this guyed tower is a REL Model 642 3-bay FM Antenna which is 14 ft. and 11 in. above the top of the AM tower. Our FM station WSIC-FM is 96.5 mc. 1000 watts power. We use an open-wire transmission line to the tower and the same to the top of the tower to the REL Antenna. The FM coupling unit I made up of copper 2" tubing two section 3" apart on centers and shorted at one end with the transmitter line to one section and the FM Antenna line to the other. These two sections are about 1/8" apart. Our antenna resistance measured 900 ohms without the FM coupler -- with it 285 ohms.

Before I forget it, I want to confirm the fact that you were listening to our station WSIC When we were on the air for frequency check.

Sorry for the delay in a response to letters we received following the test on January 31, 1983. Seems like letters just kept coming in. Most of the letters came from listeners Northeast of North Carolina. Distant locations included Florida, Texas, Oklahoma, Nebraska and several letters from Canada.

It was interesting to note the difference in reception from listeners located close to each other. Many listeners reported hearing the test clear enough to copy everything word for word while others could only name a song or pick out a word here and there. Most DX'ers noted interference from XEQ in Mexico. All DX'ers who sent us letters did mention something which proves it was WXYK they heard. This letter confirms the reception of WXYK on January 31, 1983. The test was conducted from 1:30am until 2:00am EST and consist of pop music with Id's after each selection and 1,000 hertz tones several times during the test. The test was conducted with a power of 5,000 watts, non-directional using a Continental Electronics type 315R-1 Power Rock transmitter. WXYK operates daytime hours on 940 khz with 5,000 watts, non-directional and 250 watts nighttime with directional antenna. Two of the three towers are self supporting and one is a guyed tower. All three towers are folded unipode fed towers 206 feet tall. WXYK programs Country music through the day and beginning at 6:00pm soft rock music at night and is presently on the air from 6:00am to 11:00pm, Monday thru Saturday and 7:00am to 10:00pm on Sunday and is automated with a Cetec 7,000 broadcast computer.

One of the most interesting letters we received was from William J. Prater, an inmate at a U.S. Penitentiary in Terre Haute, Indiana. He copied a good signal using a G.E. Superradio model 7-2880 with a built in antenna and it was battery operated.

We believe WKYK is a very unique radio station especially for a small market (Town 1500 people, County 16,000) 30 miles from Metro-Asheville. I have enclosed some information about the station that you should find interesting. Many listeners requested bumper stickers and other promotional items. However, we just remently finished a promotion giving away \$9,400 in cash and prizes and do not currently have any bumper stickers or other promotional materials on hand.

Thanks again to everyone who tuned us in. If you are ever through the mountains of North Carolina be sure to stop in to see us.


