



However, this surprised us somewhat as we are now operating on a power of 5000 watts day and night using a directional antenna system at night with most of our power directed to the south and southeast. 



This will confirm your reception of WJTZ, Blountville, Tennessee on October 11, 1988 from 6:52 PM to 6:59 PM.

We have had some difficulties with our mail during the past year after changing call letters and changing our address. This may have been the reason I did not receive your first reception report.

WJTZ began operations on 640 Khz on October 23, 1987. The former call letters were WGOC. WGOC was licensed to Kingsport. Tennessee and operated on 1090 Khz with 10.000 watts daytime only.

WJTZ operates on 640 Khz with 5.000 watts day non-directional and with .81 kilowatts directional nighttime. The main lobe for directional is to the southeast, 120 degrees from true north. The daytime tower 1s a 450 foot in height. A second 190 foot tower is used to provide the correct pattern for nighttime directional.

Blountville is located near the center of the Tri-Cities of Bristol, Kingsport and Johnson City, Tennessee. Operating from this site, WJTZ's 5 Mv/M contour encompasses all three cities, both day and night, and is the only AM station in the Tri-Cities to provide complete fulltime AM coverage.

We at WBRY were most happy to hear that you were able to pick up WBRY-AM, Woodbury, TN. on January 17, 1992 between 4:53 and 5:00 p.m. From your letter I can confirm that you did pick us up. WBRY is a daytime station with a daytime power of 500 watts. I would note here that when you lost us at 5 p.m. cst that that was the end of our full power and we cut our power to 42 watts at 5 p.m. for our post sunset time.

WBRY's transmitter is a RCA BTA-IRI that was used to put WBRY (then known as WBFJ) on the air in 1963. WBRY is a nondirectional station using a 150 foot single tower with 120 radials. The studio-transmitter building is located one mile west of the town limits of Woodbury in a "hollow". Our true location is north latitude 35° 49' 53", west longitude 86° 06' 42".

I have passed a copy of your letter to our contract chief engineer Mr. Homer Wilson who takes care of our electronic equipment.

Thank you very much for your letter of signal report on our equipment tests during the experimental period of the morning of January 13, 1969. Your letter described a very good skip signal into the BX Pennsylvania area.

Your assumption of a 1000 watt transmitter was caused by my assistant engineer iden**tf**fying the station as operating at 1000 watts and possibly you thought we were doing so then but we weren't.

Our reason for being on in the experimental period was to test some new equipment involved in taking our transmitter powerm output at low power position of 250 watts and reducing that to our new Pre-Sunrise Authorization power output rating of 7.85 watts!

To explain a rather complicated situation let me say that on 1090 kilhettz there are two class 1B stations: WBAL in Baltimore, Md. and KAAY in Little Rock, Ark. There are many class 11 A stations like WGOC on 1090 Kilohertz some with powers of 5000 watts or more! Since the class 1B stations are fulltimers they must do something to be able to operate simultaneously; so they operate directional: KAAY a bipolar nightime patter approximately NNW by SSE and WBAL a "halfcircular" pattern arranged to cover the East coast nightime with all stations on 1090 Kilohertz or at least most of them omni-direction daytime since distance is used then to keep interference down. Since we aren't able to sign-on until the sun rises with 1000 watts we will not interfere with them. There is a powere output rating however that will permit us to operate "pre-sunrise" wihtout bothering them yet allowing us to serve our town with a reasonable power with additional time and that is 7.85 watts. The advent of very low power commercial braodcast stations has revolutionalized the business. Extreme care must be taken with the antenna system so the very low powers will also be very efficient howevers. We have accomplished this as you have heard. So lot me add a rare piece of DX to your files.

Kermit, when all of the paperwork is completed on this type of operation i will mail to you a list of **bb**her stations like WGOC who have decided to dive into the field of very low power operation. I'm sure that they, like us, eventually will be on the air during the experimental period testing their low power operation and will QSL you also.

Also when i get some regular BC DX QSL cards i will send you one complete for your files as your letter will go in my personal file and will be marked to mail a QSL card for the low power signal report.

Kermit as you may have guessed I'm also an amateur radio operator (Conditional Class from a few years back) either too lazy pr too busy to move to the higher class amateur tickets. Conditional class gives me all band operation which is all i really want, tho. Also I'm a very poor typist as you can see but i am in a little rush at the momment wanting to get some type of reply out to you.

Kermit, I must get back to the salt=mine now but will be awaiting any questions you may have pertaining to the business or anything else i can help you with.

Again I thankyou very much for hhe signal report.

We sincerely appreciate your report on our signal, and are glad to oblige with this confirmation. Your report was very complete and extensive, and we are very grateful for this information.

We were on the air Tuesday, November 19, from 1:00 a.m. to 4:40 a.m.; Wednesday, November 20, from 1:00 a.m. to 4:01 a.m.; and Thursday, November 21, from 3:01 a.m. to 5:01 a.m. We have no definite schedule for testing but are trying to find a time at which our frequency monitoring service can get us best in Birmingham, Alabama. He is having a hard time picking us out of the interference. We plan to have our opening going on the air at 7:30 p.m., Central Standard Time, November 25.

We are using Raytheon equipment through-out, except the turntables are Prest-o. The transmitter is the RA 250. Its output tubes are 810's push-pull plate modulated by 810's push-pull. We are using 325 feet of RG-8U solid dielectric (polyethylene) cable series feeding a quarter-wave Windcharger tower. We are getting 70 per cent efficiency with this set up. We have no modulation or frequency monitors as yet and are using the scope section of an AN/APA-10 Panoramic Adaptor for checking modulation.






