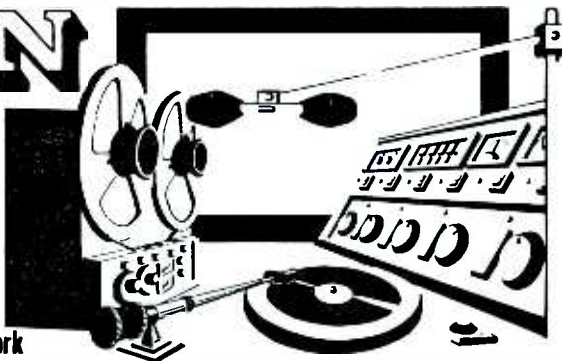



Thank you for your reception report, it is of great assistance to both myself and the Management of 2MG.

Following is some information that may be of interest to you.

2MG operates on a frequency of 1450 KHz on a directional mast system at 2000 watts, the lobes of the directional mast system point in an east and west direction and the wavelength is 207 meters.

2MG operates as a relay station from 2BS Bathurst for about 60% of the time. In this set up there is two P.M.G. lines between the two stations both of top quality. There is a remote control system that operates by tone switching equipment making it possible to turn transmitters on and off, set an emergency programme going plus several other functions from Bathurst.

File broadcast 24 hrs a day.

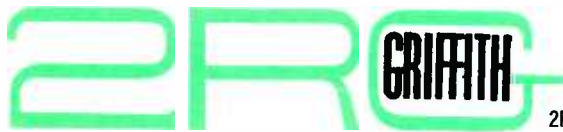

As you may know we are an all volunteer, community radio station relying on peoples' enthusiasm to keep it going. The studios, transmitter and mast were all built by volunteers, many of whom had never been involved in radio before.

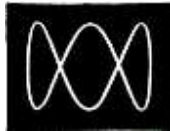

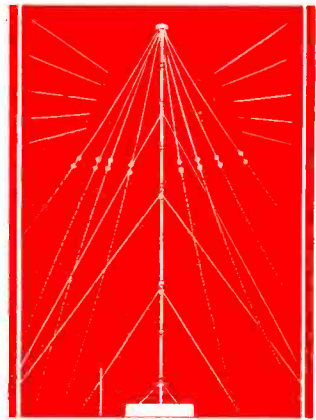


Diagram of the new high efficiency umbrella top loaded aerial system for maximum coverage strength.

We are in receipt of your letter dated September 20th, and wish to thank you very much indeed for your interest in reporting on the reception of 1YZ.

It appears that 1YZ was the Station you heard, although your times are not in every instance correct for the Programme you heard. It appears to me that the times you have given are actually out by one hour. For instance, you mention time signals at 2000 followed by weather forecast. This would be correct for 2100 N.Z.T. Then you mention Live Stock Reports etc. for 2005 when in fact these reports were broadcast on that date at 1905. I would, therefore, be prepared to confirm that it was 1YZ that you heard on the morning of September 20th.

1YZ was opened in April 1949. It is a 10 k.w. Station manufactured by Messrs. Amalgamated Wireless, Sydney, and the Transmitter is situated on the Pacific Coast, 35 miles from Rotorua. The 500 foot lattice steel mast is the aerial system. Since we opened, we have received excellent reports from all the Islands in the Mid-Pacific and as far afield as the Atlantic Coast of America.

The programme you heard between 8.30 and 9.00.p.m. (N.Z. time) was a play entitled "The Wooing of Aunt Jenepher". This was followed by the nightly Dominion Weather Forecast at 9.p.m, thence the reading of "Overseas and N.Z. News". At 9.15.p.m. your programme was a talk - "Rehabilitation in Retrospect". At 9.32 the Announcer gave the sign - "Station IYZ" and thence followed another play "The Devil's Holiday".

We have received a considerable number of reports from all over the United States since we opened in April 1949. It has been our experience that reports, especially from the Atlantic Coast, have been received mainly between November and February each year. The majority are received during January. Apparently reception during our summer months, which we presume will be your winter months, is better than at other times of the year. IYZ is a Station of 10,000 watts, operating on 800 Kcs. I am pleased to be able to verify your reception of 1ZD between 1004 and 1032 GMT on 4th August.

It is a couple of years since we last had a reception report from Hawaii. We do get quite a number from the U.S.A. and Canada however.

1ZD has been operating since 1961 and in its first few years of operation had quite a substantial listening audience throughout the South Pacific. Radio Stations have since been established in Tonga, the Solomon Islands and Fiji, but we do still get a small amount of mail from this area particularly for the request sessions.

Our transmitter is located about 25 miles east of Tauranga near Te Puke. The site is about 3 miles inland from the Pacific Ocean.

There is a National Programme transmitter which is dual coupled into the same antenna system. Since both transmitters run 10Kw it would seem likely that you should be able to receive 1YZ in Honolulu.

The antenna is a 500 ft. high vertical radiator.

I have enclosed a list of broadcasting stations operated by Radio New Zealand.

This is in reply to your letter of November 27th requesting confirmation of reception of an "Armed Forces Radio Station" operating on approximately 800 KC.

In our opinion you were listening to the OWI 50,000 Watt medium-wave transmitter KSAI located on Saipan. While KSAI now operates regularly on 1010 KC, at the time you heard it various frequencies in the broadcast band were being used to lay down a clear signal in Japan. At that time, KSAI was operating 24 hours a day broadcasting AFRS programs and relaying OWI programs in Japanese some of which originated in San Francisco, others in Honolulu via our station KRHO.

Thanks, very much, for your reception report. You heard our frequency-check transmission for this month; during which time we were radiating 250-watts. We've never attempted to transmit for this test on our assigned power of fifty (50)-watts.

Each month, just prior to our test transmission, we soup up the transmitter and touch up the tuning from the antenna on back. When the test begins, we attempt to hold right on the 100% mark on the Modulation indicator. During the test, AHD radiates a little more than 250-watts from a long-wire, top-loaded antenna. The antenna design is the answer for our long skip -- We've had reports from many East-coast states, Ohio, Illinois, Nebraska; and, now, yours.

This station is completely GATES equipped and the present rig was first put on the air last May 26. Our set-up is the same as you'd find in many 250-watt B'cast. stations there in the U.S.A. We have the usual run of auxiliary equipment, which includes Freq. Monitor, Mod. Monitor, Tape Recorders, disc recorder, remote-line amp., Short-wave receivers, Limiter, etc.

You may consider this a confirmation of your recorded reception of AHD on 21 Feb. 1952, between the times 0430 and 0445 - Atlantic Standard Time.

Thank you very much for your letter of January 15, 1946. We are happy to verify your report of reception of our 50,000 watt station operating on 1176 kc, dated January 15, 1946, from 06:03 hours to 06:44 hours GMT.

The Voice of America stations in North Africa are owned and operated by the United States Government-- their main function being to relay news and entertainment programs originating in the Voice of America studios in New York.

The programs are broadcast over a number of high-power shortwave transmitters from the States, received in a small town near Algiers and relayed by 50,000 watt transmitters which use directional rhombic antennae beamed on Europe.

At present we have one station operating on 25.49 meters from 1100 hours to 1700 hours GMT, one station operating on 49.79 meters from 1705 hours to 2300 hours GMT, and one station operating on 49.66 meters from 1730 hours to 2300 hours GMT. We also have one medium wave transmitter operating with a power of 50,000 watts on 255 meters from 1530 hours to 2300 hours GMT.



Thank you very much for taking the time to report reception of RADIO BARBADOS. It is with great pleasure that I am able to verify that your report of reception on 15 + 16 Dec 1964 is absolutely correct.

I would like to tell you a bit about our station. It is a commercial station, owned by the Government of Barbados and governed by a statutory Board. The Board runs the station with a completely free hand and it will not cost the Government one penny. All capital funds expended are borrowed from a commercial bank and are being repaid by advertising revenue. We began broadcasting on December 15, 1963.

We have a Marconi 10KW transmitter with two 300 foot guyed masts creating a northwestern pattern. It is designed to cover the leeward and windward island chains. We broadcast on 795 kc/s. There are two studios completely equipped with RCA gear. We have an outside broadcast van that is completely self-contained. It has its own power generator and a 10-watt FM transmitter for broadcasting back to the station.

We are located on the west coast of Barbados, about 100 yards from the beach, 4 miles north of Bridgetown. On many maps there is a place called Lazaretto. We are on the Lazaretto property. The setting is absolutely beautiful and I hope that one day you will be able to visit Barbados.

Again, many thanks for writing to us and I hope that the RADIO BARBADOS verification report will be a valuable addition to your collection.

Of all the QSL's we have received during the past few years yours is the longest period of time that our station has been received.

You listened to us after midnight here which would be 2:00AM Honolulu time and after 1200 GMT. We are AM-FM and from 1200 GMT we close down the AM live broadcasting and simulcast our FM automated IGM 500 over the AM and FM frequencies. That is why you heard music selections only with no voice introductions. We do air time hacks and station Id's over the air during that time. But, they are the only voice transmissions from midnight to 6:AM our time.



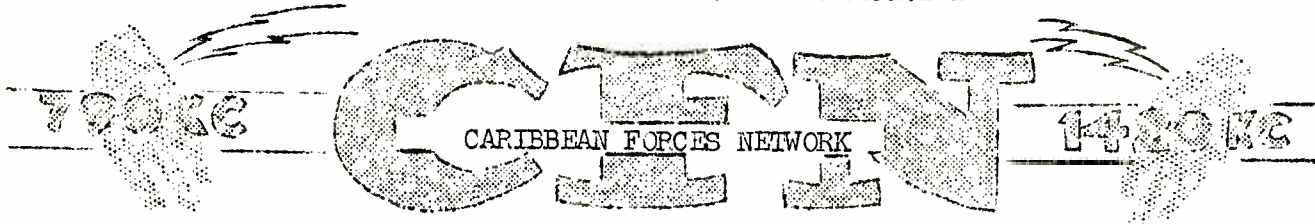

This is to confirm your reception report of Radio Station ACA & ACB20, on 22NOV54 at 0830 hours GMT.


Radio Station ACA, located on the Pacific side of the Canal Zone at the Post of Corozal, operates on 790 KC with a standard commercial 5000 Watt broadcast transmitter; and utilizes a 300 ft. vertical, shunt-fed antenna.


Radio Station ACB-20, located on the Atlantic side of the Canal Zone at Fort Gulick, operates on 1420 KC with a standard commercial 1000 Watt broadcast transmitter; and utilizes an umbrella type antenna.

Both ACA and ACB-20 are fed over land-lines simultaneously from studios located at Fort Clayton, Canal Zone. These studios are comparable to state-side broadcast installations and are equipped with modern commercial type equipment furnished by the Armed Forces Radio and Television Service. Fidelity of studio equipment is flat within plus or minus 1.0 DB from 20 cycles to 20,000 cycles and distortion is less than 0.1 percent.

In behalf of the staff of the Caribbean Forces Network we thank you for your reception report and wish you many pleasant hours of listening through the medium of radio broadcast.

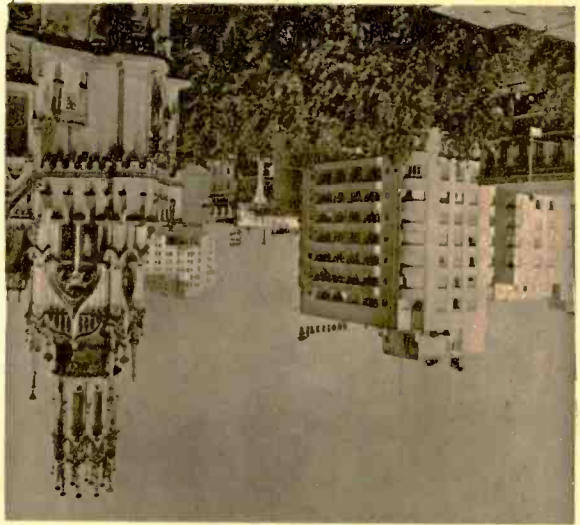

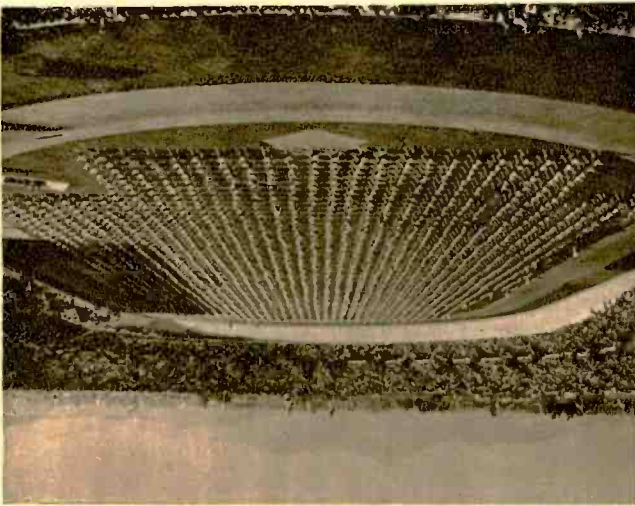

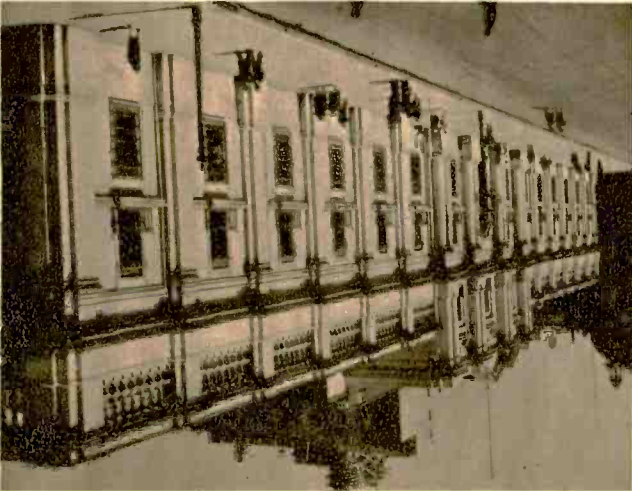
