

I had the pleasure of tuning your station, KCIA, this afternoon while you were presenting your regular program schedule on 1110 kilohertz. Your signals encountered heavy interference from KFAB in Omaha and from a Mexican station on the frequency. There was severe fading, so I am not sure of all your programming. I would like to receive a verification of my reception of KCIA if this report agrees with your station log.

- 4:55 "It's called "Season Worries (??)" Find clear shot here on KCIA. 5 minutes uutil 5 o'clock. Tiie to live."

 Selection. (From KCIA?) Heavy fading and interference.
- 4:58 Selection dominated frequency.
- 4:59 Weather report. ".... Winds 5 by 13-14 mph. But it's all to the best." Furnace fan interference at this tiie.

 Man was talking while other station carried selection.
- 5:00 ".... followed by play by play coverage of Whereever you come in your car. Come up with the Big Play. NFL game of the year, Super Sunday." -Fear this was from KFAB.

Sorry for this poor report, but I have been listening for your station for some tile and this is the first that I have heard anything of it through the interference on 1110 khz. Hope that there may be sufficient data here to warrent a verification. Indidentally, I never did identify the Mexican station.

Your signals were: Readability R2-5, Strength S5-7. When your signals were S-7, they dominated the frequency. There was slight static and very heavy fading. These was no trouble identifying the Mexican station's programming, but a toss-up at times between KCIA and KFAB. Therweather was fair and cold with the temperature about 28°. There was between one and two inches of snow on the ground. My receiver was a Collins 51S1 using a 50-foot longwire antenna, North by South.

Again, I apologize for the meagre report, but I have been after KCIA for weeksaand this has been the first reception of your station. Hope that this report may be of interest to you and your staff, and that I may have the pleasure of receiving a confirmation of my reception of KCIA.

Sorry for the delay, but so many things going on; keeping us pretty busy, etc... poor excuse, huh? Bet you've never heard that one before!...

Very happy to verify your report of 12/28/59 - from 1:52 to 2:11, MST (AM). During the time that you heard "Candy," we were airing our Holiday 24-Hour Safety Watch... We had a rather young, inexperienced announcer on duty--and he didn't put the "punch" into the transmitter that was needed to get our signals down your way. On 1/11/60 we aired a DX for the NRC -- and had about 20 reports, including Canada...

The station is 100% Gates; we use a 306' antenna - with the entire ground system set in a marshy swamp! Our FM station has a Federal Xmtr - but the rest is Gates. We program AM & FM independently...using the Auto-Spercer (3) tape decks... It's a very modern, unusual set-up.

You might recall that I dx'd back in the 40's, and early 50's - from Springfield, Missouri... Spent the past 10 years in Texas...and then came up here to put Candy on the air last August. Will be leaving here the last of the month--for Arizona.

it out myself and it all coinsided.


