street, reception-ist: "I don't think it's at all fair, but I don't know what it should cer-ainly be repealed if a man must pay the costs when he's innocent. He should not be made to pay for something he had no hand in."

**LEWIS ZIEGLER, 124 East Fed-eral street, newsdealer:** "I wouldn't call that justice—there's no reason for paying the lawyers if you're innocent. If the State gets the wrong man in a case let them pay the costs. The law should be repealed, the injustice of it should be brought to the attention of the general pub-lic and they should be let to decide it at the polls."

**FRANK EBY, 172 Cherry street, silk worker:** "I don't think it's right. I don't know why the courts do such an unfair thing. There's no reason why a man should be made to pay for something he's not responsible for. But there's not much can be done about it. The county should pay for it's own mis-lakes."



**JULIUS EWARD, 335 North Lumber street, steel worker:** "Not very much. If they're not guilty why make them pay? The prosecu-tion should be made to pay all the costs. Just this week I saw a case like that and I wondered why it was. I can't fathom it out. But I guess not much can be done about it—one man's voice isn't much against the government."

**ANTHONY GULLUCCI, 10 North Sixth street, bar-ber:** "That's not right, it's all wrong. A fellow has enough to pay for in protecting himself from be-ing convicted without paying the costs of the prosecution yet. They should get rid of that law."
