Thank you for your letter of October first and I apologize for my delay in answering you...Your.reception report was quite accurate and you were hearing our Spanish language program "Programma Toca Disco" with George Gonzales...Throughout the rest of the week we are programmed 100% religious and deviate only for the Spanish language blocks as there is no local Spanish language station to serve a population of more than 65,000 Latin American citizens and many more migrant workers.

KBBX is a 5KW daytime station with PSA of 500 watts from 6:00am local to local sunrise and operates at full power to local sunset...At.the time of your reception our sign off was 6:45am.. We are licensed to Centerville, Utah, and serve an area from the southern extremity of Idaho through Provo, Utah, to include Salt Lake City, Ogden, and points east and west since we are non directional...I.would suppose your reception was due to "skip" on our skywave as you are approximately the right distance for our primary skywave signal..

Thank you for your report and please excuse the typos as I am having difficulty with the period key on this typewriter and the other is in the shop.....





Dear N.R.C. Member:

This letter is to verify that you heard a broadcast by this station on February 20, 1955 from 2:00 a.m. to 2:30 a.m. Mountain Standard Time.

Station details: 1000 watts, 1390 KC, hours: 6:00 a.m. vear around to local sundown. On the air for the first time October, 1955. Primary coverage area fifty mile radius. Antenna 165 feet high built by owner, Professor Haycock. Manager is Mel Richardson. RCA Transmitter model ML-7100A. Collins console model 12-H. Location: Logan, Utah, population less than 17,000.

I am happy to report that I received over seventy reports from dx listeners which makes it impossible to answer each one individually. Every one had enough information to verify that they heard this station.

I am regretful that there were two interfering stations on the air at the time of my broadcast. One was unknown (Spanish speaking) and the other was WDEB Gulfport, Miss. Incidently, we were heard as far as Southern California, Eastern New York and North to Ontario, Canada.

I wish to thank you for your report. We are very happy to find that our signals can be heard for such great distances.

Your signals were R5, S9. There was no fading or static. There was no interference from any other stations. The veather was fair with the stars bright and the temperature about 30° . My receiver was a Hammarlund HQ-129X using a 200 foot North-South antenna.

P.S. The static which you mentioned in your letter was very bad throughout most of the area east of the Rocky Mountains, especially. We dod get a number of reception reports, but had almost as many negative reports from that area. West, it was a different story. One DX-er just outside of Seattle sent us a tape he made of the broadcast; not a trace of static; it was actually air-worthy; (that is, we could have broadcast it locally again, with little loss of quality). We had very "loud and cleap" reception as far northwest as Powell River, British Columbia, Canada, coming in on many DX-er receivers better than the local stations. We'll probably hold another similar program early in 1958, and hope for better atmospheric conditions over eastern part of the country
