Received your letter reporting reception of WHWB and am pleased to send you this letter of verification.

The information concerning musical selections and announcements of WHWB from 4:32 A.M. to 5:00 A.M. Eastern Standard Time, are correct in every detail.

WHWB operates, as you know, on 1000 Kilocycles with a power of 1000 Watts. We are a non-directional daytime station, our transmitter is a Raytheon Model RA-1000-A and located about three miles Northwest of the City of Rutland, our tower is a 259 foot self-supporting Lehigh.

You may be interested in knowing that we have received thirty-one (31) letters and cards stating that they received us during the same period of time that you did. Sorry your reception was not clearer.
