

### Procedure:


Register your items with Jerry before the membership meeting.

Lucy Wyre says she had an "ice" year" and hopes to be up and around soon. Good Luck Lucy.



## **Meeting Minutes**

Saturday, December 10, 1983, was the date of the regular monthly meeting of NWVRS. President Jerry Talbott presided, calling the meeting to order at 10:10 A.M. The minutes of the meeting of November 12, 1983, as publish-

ed in the Call Letter, were adopted without correction. The Treasurer's Report was read and accepted.

GOOD and WELFARE: There were no guests and no reports of illness.

ELECTION of OFFICERS for 1984: Since no nominations for the office of President had been forthcoming, incumbent President Jerry Talbott and former President Bill De Vey agreed to serve as write-in candidates. Following are the results of the election:

OLD BUSINESS: Discussion was continued on an outside location at which to hold our Swap Meet in April 1984. In further negotiations with Saturday Market Place, Jerry Talbott found that some items as to space and hours had not been clearly defined. The present suggestion is that we take 10 tables at \$5.00 each (each table having an area of 42 sq. ft.) and hold the Swap Meet from 10:30 A.M. to 2:30 P.M. A counter proposal was offered for a location at S.E. llth & Taylor Sts. where rental is \$6.00 per table. If we

cannot negotiate with SMP, Bill De Vey moved that we accept the 11th & Taylor location, advancing \$60.00 from the Treasury for 10 tables. Dick Karman seconded the motion and it carried.


Hats bearing the Club logo were offered at \$3.50 each. It was a sellout.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 11:00 A.M. and was followed by our Christmas party, graciously hosted by the Power Supply.




