Business meeting: 10:00 sharp


All business will be kept to a minimum.




The idea of a Club value guide was dropped.

I would like to thank all the members who sent cards. They were much appreciated. The nurse taped the cards to the wall where I could see them from my bed.


Many thanks too, to the members who looked after my radios at the display in February at Frank Haleys' Flea Market.




