obliged to pay the society's treasury 5% of his total sales.


Jerry Talbott, Andy Bell and Dick Karman





publication. Considering the benefits of this publication to the collector, the additional cost over-shadows this.

With the support of collectors like yourself, this publication will become the standard of this great hobby.
