


INFO NEEDED:

OLDEST BROADCAST

MUSIC AND THE SPOKEN WORD IS THE OLDEST ONGOING NATIONWIDE LIVE RADIO PROGRAM ANYWHERE IN THE WORLD. THE FIRST PERFORMANCE OF THIS HISTORIC BROADCAST WAS ON JULY 15, 1929 FROM THE MORMON TABERNACLE IN SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH. THE TABERNACLE WAS BUILT BY THE PIONEERS IN 1867. THE PIPE ORGAN HAS NEARLY 12,000 PIPES, THE LARGEST OF WHICH IS THIRTY-TWO FEET LONG.

IN THE BEGINNING ONE MICROPHONE WAS POSITIONED FOR OPTIMUM PICKUP OF THE CHOIR MAKING IT NECESSARY FOR THE ANNOUNCER TO BE ON A LADDER. TODAY MANY MICROPHONES ARE USED FOR THE BROADCAST IN STEREO. <u>KSL-1160</u> IS THE ORIGINATING STATION FOR THIS LIVE BROADCAST ON THE <u>CBS RADIO NETWORK</u>. IN PAST YEARS THE PROGRAM HAS ALSO BEEN ON OTHER NETWORKS.

DONALD RIPPLINGER & JEROLD OTTLEY CONDUCT THE CHOIR. JOHN LONGHURST, RICHARD CUNDIG & CLAY CHRISTIANSEN ARE ORGANISTS. THE SPOKEN WORD IS GIVEN BY SPENCER KINARD OR ED MAY.

THE 3,022 PERFORMANCE WAS BROADCAST ON JULY 19, 1987 BEGINNING THE 59th YEAR OF THIS TRADITIONAL BROADCAST OF THE MORMON TABERNACLE CHOIR.

AT 6 P.M. ON MAY 1, 1987 <u>KRDR</u> 1230 IN GRESHAM, OREGON SIGNED OFF, WE HAVN'T HEARD THEM SINCE. ORIGINALLY THE STATION WAS <u>KGRO</u> AND PLAYED BIG BAND MUSIC. <u>KGRO</u> BEGAN BROADCASTING IN 1956 SHORTLY AFTER <u>KGON</u> VACATED THE FREQUENCY, BY MOVING TO 1520 WITH A NEW 10,000 WATT TRANSMITTER. <u>KGRO</u> STARTED WITH 250 WATTS. APPROXIMATELY TWO YEARS LATER <u>KGRO</u> INCREASED THEIR POWER TO 1,000 WATTS, SWITCHED TO COUNTRY & WESTERN AND BECAME <u>KRDR</u>. OVER AT <u>KWJJ</u> SAMMY TAYLOR WAS STILL PLAYING; THE OLD, THE NEW, THE BORROWED AND THE BLUE. IT WAS A FEW YEARS LATER WHEN <u>KWJJ</u> DECIDED TO SWITCH TO COUNTRY AND WESTERN.


