



George L. Rudolph 1907 - 1988

A long-time friend of the Northwest Vintage Radio Society, "Rudy" Rudolph, passed away October 23rd. George L. Rudolph was born April 23rd, 1907. He worked 32 years for the National Weather Service, and often told stories about how that government agency changed and benefitted through the use of radio. Rudy also had an abundance of government surplus radio gear. As a native of Salem, in his retirement he often traveled to the NWVRS meetings with the man who introduced him to the society, Joey Tompkins.

Before illness and heart troubles slowed him down, Rudy enjoyed Gardening and was active in the Elks. He was always a avid philatelist, and during his retirement an active collector and supporter of vintage radio collecting.

We know that he will be missed by his wife Lois and son, Gilbert of Salem.

Also Passing - -

Vivi Janis passed away in early September. Her radio credits include Escape, Suspense, Johnny Dollar, and many other dramatic shows. She worked side-by-side with William Conrad, John Dehner, Paul Frees, and Frank Lovejoy.

Phil Leslie, the main writer for the Fibber McGee and Molly show in it's later years, died September 23rd at the age of 79 at his home in Tarzana, California. He wrote parts for Frank Breese, Mel Blanc and many others, but his true claim to fame was The McGees, and his later TV work: Dennis the Menace, The Lucy Show and Brady Bunch.



PSARA Meeting Minutes

Seattle, Washington Sunday Oct. 16, 1988

The Business Meeting was attended by twenty members. Former member Mr. Bob Meisenholder of Bellevue was re-instated by written request. Mr. Greg Morse of Portland, Or. was voted in after his second attendance, and new applicant Mr. Glenn Egnew was voted in as an associate member. Seven guests attended the meetng: Mr.John Hirsch of Seattle, Mr. John M. Keene(son of member John H.), Mr. Dan Howard (of NWVRS) Portland, Mrs. Janet Navarre, Mr.Jerry Cunning of Chehalis, Wa., Mr. Marty Spence of Stanwood, Wa., and Mr.D.R.Howland of Spokane, Wa.

<u>OLD</u> <u>BUSINESS</u>: Proposed changes to rules & classifications concerning the contest to be held in November were discussed at length. These suggestions were contained in a letter written after the last contest by John Schneider. Most noteworthy of these changes, which were adopted, are: (1) Positive identification of members for voting purposes.

(2) Judging will commence at 12:00 Noon, with tabulation of votes at 1:00 PM (that means, entries will need to be in place prior to 12:00 Noon). Announcement of winners at 1:30 PM. (3) If an entry fits more than one catagory, the entrant may pick the catagory most suitable. (4) A single catagory, "AC Radios" will take the place of former "Plastic" and "Console" catagories. A seperate catagory for "Military, Communications and Amateur" Receivers will be made, formerly was "misc". The "Miscellaneous" catagory will be reserved for non-receiver items, i.g. signs, xmitters, microphones, and related items.

<u>NEW</u> <u>BUSINESS</u>: After some discussion, it was decided to leave the refreshment responsibility with the President. As there was no other item on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned.




