


# RADIO PILOTRON TUBES "Endorsed by Professionals"



## Radio Waves at the Experimenter

### Transformer on Pulsating Current

Question: Can you use a one-half K.W. transformer-coil and Gernsback electrolytic interrupter to good advantage on a pulsating current, due to the irregular speed of the generator, with a maximum of 110 volts?


Answer: You should have no trouble in operating your onehalf K.W. transformer-coil with this interrupter on the pulsating current. A little patience in adjusting the interrupter will possibly be required before obtaining the maximum results. The current obtained at the secondary terminals will be alternating. If the transformer is built efficiently, it can be operated directly by the pulsating current without the use of the interrupter. In the latter case a suitable resistance or impedance should be inserted in the primary circuit for controlling the amount of current consumed.

This tidbit was extracted from the The Electrical Experimenter of November 1916. The page number was 512, and the question was asked by Roland Stroup of Oklahoma. This is the earliest magazine that this writer owns and it continues to be one of the most enjoyable.

The Electrical Experimenter boasted the largest circulation of any electrical publication of it's time. The subscription rate was changing from \$1 per year to \$1.50 per year and Mr. Gernsback himself was the president of the publishing company.

Some of us may not know what an interrupter is. In researching it, the question is a simple one. I knew them, in the thirties to be called vibrators: or motor driven devices made to change direct current to alternating.

Dear Mr. Kaplan:

I am presently seeking information for a book I am writing on the history of the portable radio. Perhaps it might be possible to place a request for information in your publication, as follows:

#### Information Needed

As you may know, after the Second World War, Sylvania and Raytheon attempted to promote their subminiature tubes for use in tiny pocket portables. I am seeking information about any such sets that were actually made and sold to the public, especially in the late forties. Also, I would like to know of persons who have actual sets that contain subminiature tubes-pocket portable or otherwise (such as the Ekeradio, Privat-Ear, Crosley JM-8, and Hastings FM, Jr.-all from the fifties).

So, far my research indicates that few or none of the major radio makers built tiny personal portables with subminiature tubes. I am eager to hear from people who worked in these companies who might know why they decided against making such radios.
