



Old Business:

No action was taken toward buying fabric for displays. The President thanked those responsible for setting up and cleaning up, as well as the editor for his dilligent work. Ed Charman has the orders for the value guides and will order them soon. Forrest Grove display will consist of transistor radios and metal cabinet radios. Members interested in helping man the display were asked to contact Jerry Talbot. The collector's interest sheets which were sent out in the CALL LETTER were discussed. New Business:

It was announced that KKEY in Portland will be broadcasting vintage radio shows in the evenings beginning in June.





CHANGES IN MODEL 71-71-B SCHEMATIC DIAGRAM

Effective November 2, 1933

Connections on speaker terminal strip are changed so that the brown wire and lead from type 42 tube plate join at the center terminal. Yellow wire and ground join at the outside terminal.
