

## Meeting Minutes

The June 9<sup>th</sup> meeting of the NWVRS was called to order by Vice President George Kirkwood at 10:00 AM. Thirty-one members were in attendance.

In his opening remarks, George reminded those present of the club's funds, functions and costs, and suggested the cost of swap meet advertising be factored into the table sales. A dues increase was again brought forth.

The minutes of the last meeting as presented in the June *Call Letter* were approved as written.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Treasurer Ed Charman gave his report of income and expenses resulting in the present balance of \$430.65. Gordon Phillips asked what monies we could expect from our money market investment of Jim Mason's legacy. Ed said the club would realize 5/12 of 1% of \$29,000 at which Gordon did a quick calculation and estimated would be \$120 a month.

Scott Hoke offered his assistance by quantifying the club's costs/ expenditures to income to produce a profit and loss statement for the club. This would help us get a picture of what we need in the way of income and help us better decide on a dues increase and its amount. The motion carried to have Scott get together with Ed Charman to come up with a P&L. At the end of the meeting George Kirkwood asked for a round of applause for Scott for his volunteering help and Scott stated he would come up with a budget for the period of September through December 2000 as well as one for the year 2001.

Dick Dielschneider suggested we have future swap meets at our club's Abernethy Hall to save rental costs. Discussion ensued with comments made by several on declining public attendance. A suggestion was made to have swaps at armories other than Hillsboro's in more populated areas such as Tigard, Multnomah or near the Portland airport.

Myron White noticed we did not have the reader board outside the Hillsboro armory at our swap meet which is one of our biggest advertising draws. The recent switch from its handling from Washington County Fairgrounds back to the owners, the U. S. Army, appears to have been the possible reason the ball was dropped. Scott Hoke stated approximately 6,000 Intel employees drive by daily during the workweek preceding the

swap and in the past many times fellow employees mentioned the reader board ad knowing of his radio interests.

Sonny Clutter suggested we download the *Call Letter* onto the Internet to save on publishing costs. Shows of hands presented an overwhelming majority of those present have access capability.

#### **New Business**

Arrangements for the Saturday, August 12<sup>th</sup>, club house swap meet organized by Jerry Talbott were finalized. It will be from 8:30 AM through lunch. Bring your own picnic lunch for a morning of fun and club camaraderie.

Sonny Clutter suggested a panel judge the merit of the monthly program offerings as opposed to the people's choice as we presently vote. Mark Richardson offered we should keep the present popular vote and add a judge's choice. George Kirkwood suggested this be tabled for now and begin a possible change with January 2001's meeting.

Rick Walton wants to include a "bragging column" each month in the *Call Letter* telling of what members find that month. Sonny Clutter volunteered to collect the data and feed it to Rick. E-mail the information to Sonny (one item per person per month).
