



BENEFIT FOR JACK KESSLER

If any additional proof was ever needed that "there's no people like show people" it was dispelled last Sunday (November 12) with a benefit performance in Portland.

More than 200 entertainers, bartenders, waitresses, owners and musicians associated with virtually every night spot and cocktail lounge in the area, volunteered their respective services. Not a cent was paid out for help and the Western Club of Oregon was turned over to the committee without charge. The money raised, approximately \$2,000, will go to Jack Kessler, a 28-year-old member of the bartenders' union, who has been in a T.B. sanitarium since last March. He is expecting discharge in December and the monetary expression of good luck will help him through convalescence.

Although staged on the coldest November day in Oregon's history, entertainers and others furnished their own transportation from Vancouver, Wash., and Oregon coast communities. Acts, bands and celebrities followed each other in rapid sucession from 3 in the afternoon until near midnight—believed to be a record marathon for a benefit in the Northwest. More than 44 bartenders took turns behind the bar and an equal number of waitresses served the audience of some
