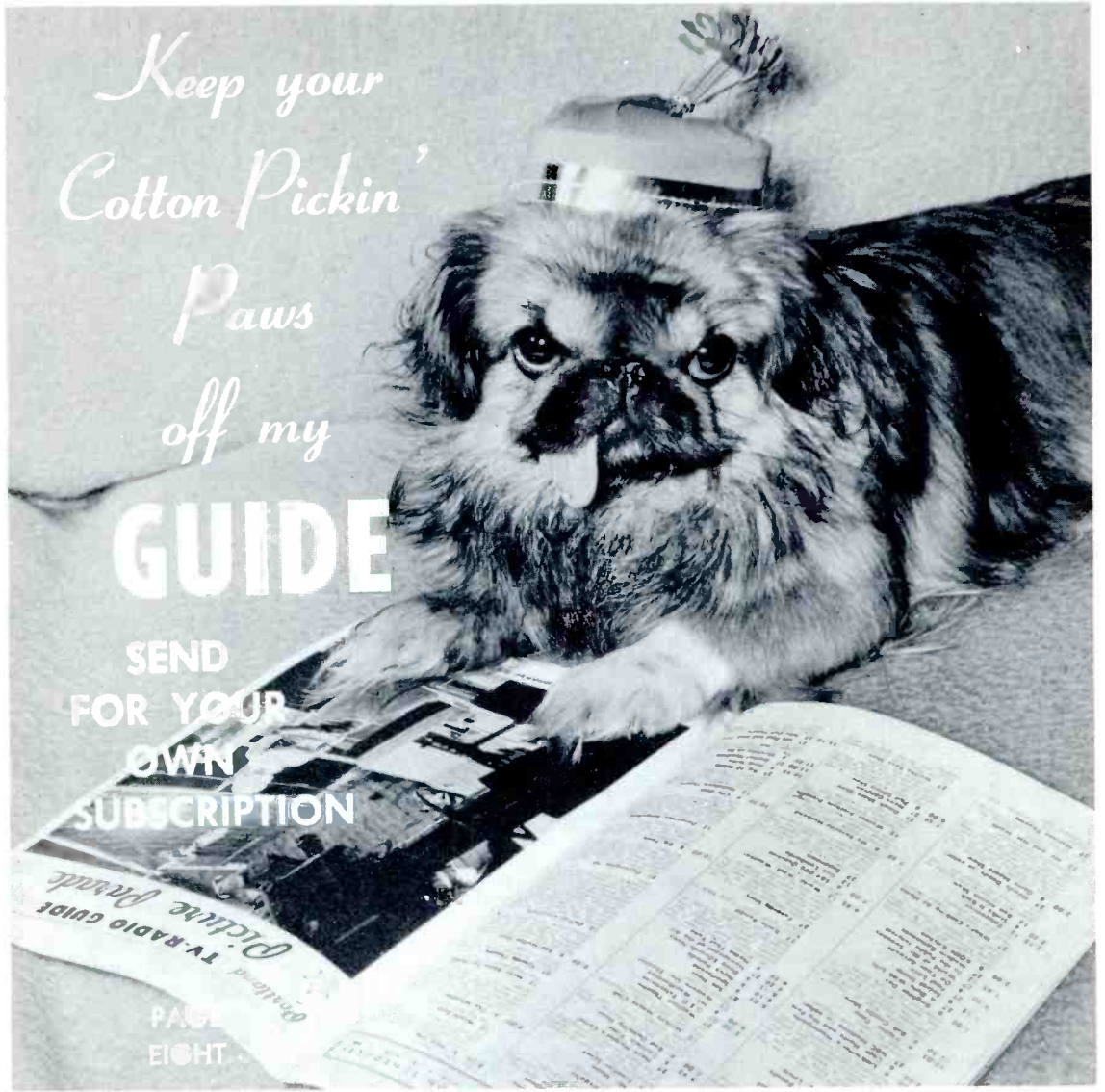

Prediction: Tony De Marco to win by K.O.

This fight is a rematch of one of the greatest championship fights ever viewed on TV. It was held in Bassilio's home town of Syracuse and it was an even fight up to the tenth round, when De Marco was knocked down. It took Bassilio two more rounds to win the championship. This fight is being held in De Marco's home town of Boston, where he knocked out Johnny Saxton to win the title.

Carmen Bassilio's ambition after this fight is to fight for the middleweight crown. Twenty-eight years old, and thinks he has three or four more good fighting years left.

Carmen is an ex-marine, and plenty tough. His record of never having been knocked out is quite remarkable since he has fought against the best in the business.

Tony De Marco's real name is Leonard Liotta; he used the name of Tony De Marco to fight as an amateur, and has kept the name since.

Tony is a converted southpaw, only 5' 5" tall, and 23 years old. He is known as the pocket edition of Rocky Marciano because of his punch and fighting style.

In their first match De Marco won the early rounds at long range, then Bassilio's infighting brought Tony in close where he took a tremendous pounding and eventual loss.

Our prediction of Tony De Marco to knock out Carmen Bassilio will stun many of our readers, but we feel confident. We started predicting the round that Marciano would K.O. Archie Moore and we have picked every winner since, including such upsets as Frankie Ryff

to decision Paddy De Marco, Johnny Saxton to decision Ralph "Tiger" Jones, and picked Chuck Speiser to K.O. Paddy Young.

My reasons for this prediction are that Bassilio is now the champion, not the hungry challenger. He is not fighting in his home town, but in De Marco's. He is looking ahead to winning the middleweight championship, thus showing an elevated attitude which he can't afford against a fighter of De Marco's ability.

Tony De Marco is young, only 23, a hard hitter, determined, fighting in his lucky town where he won the championship originally.

I believe that the Boston Bull Dog will pulverize Bassilio until he is helpless, just as he did Johnny Saxton, who was never knocked out prior to Tony winning the championship from him.

This fight has me on the ropes, fistically speaking, trying to pick a winner. Both boys are looking real good, both good punchers and boxers. Logart is a newcomer to the states, coming from the same part of Cuba as Kid Gavilan, and fighting the same style, even wearing white shoes as the "Keed." Logart's only loss since coming to this country is to this same Virgil Akins.

Akins scored the biggest upset of the current '55 season when he knocked out Ronnie Delaney, who in eight years had never lost a fight. His win total of 50 was rudely broken in the eighth round.

Akins this year has KO'd Johnny Brown, Tommy Maddox, Ronnie Delaney, Joe Miceli, and Johnny Suddeth. He also decisioned Isaac Logart and Harold "Baby Face" Jones. This record gave Akins the number 5 ranking nationally.

My reasons for picking Logart are that he is a better boxer, and will keep on top of Akins. His two fights since his loss has helped his timing. Akins is an in-and-outer. He looks good for a while, then he lapses into depressions which caused him to retire from boxing twice since 1953.

**BENEFIT FOR
JACK KESSLER**

If any additional proof was ever needed that "there's no people like show people" it was dispelled last Sunday (November 12) with a benefit performance in Portland.

More than 200 entertainers, bartenders, waitresses, owners and musicians associated with virtually every night spot and cocktail lounge in the area, volunteered their respective services. Not a cent was paid out for help and the Western Club of Oregon was turned over to the committee without charge. The money raised, approximately \$2,000, will go to Jack Kessler, a 28-year-old member of the bartenders' union, who has been in a T.B. sanitarium since last March. He is expecting discharge in December and the monetary expression of good luck will help him through convalescence.

Although staged on the coldest November day in Oregon's history, entertainers and others furnished their own transportation from Vancouver, Wash., and Oregon coast communities. Acts, bands and celebrities followed each other in rapid succession from 3 in the afternoon until near midnight—believed to be a record marathon for a benefit in the Northwest. More than 44 bartenders took turns behind the bar and an equal number of waitresses served the audience of some 1500.

Mary Duerst was in charge of arrangements along with Dan Thombs, manager of Western Club.
